

HOLY BULL WORKS FOR DONN Holy Bull

(Great Above) breezed five furlongs in 1:01 2/5 at Gulfstream Monday morning, galloping out the threequarters in 1:15 3/5. "The work was just what we wanted," said owner/trainer Jimmy Croll. The 1994 Horse of the Year will make his next start in the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream February 11.

COOLMORE BUYS DANEHILL Robert

Sangster's Coolmore Stud has bought full control of leading dual-hemisphere stallion **Danehill** (Danzig) in a deal worth more than \$18 million. Coolmore has purchased 23.5 shares and six breeding rights in the stallion from Australia's Arrowfield Stud; the two establishments had formerly worked in tandem operating a shuttle-stallion set-up between the Northern and Southern Hemispheres. Arrowfield's lease on property owned by Coolmore expires in May, 1996. The Arrowfield Group will then move; on-going agreements between the studs will cease at that time.

FIRST FOAL FOR SULTRY SONG The first foal by millionaire Sultry Song (Cox's Ridge) arrived January 18 at Live Oak Stud in Ocala, Florida. The bay colt is out of the stakes-placed mare Lalula (Northern Baby). Winner of six stakes races including the GI Whitney H., GI Woodward S. and GI Hollywood Gold Cup, Sultry Song stands at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky for a fee of \$7,500, live foal.

GARDEN STATE MOVES TO FOUR-DAY

WEEK The schedule at Garden State Park in Cherry Hill, New Jersey, has been expanded. The track, which had been racing three nights a week, will now feature live Thoroughbred racing from Wednesday through Saturday nights, with post time at 7:30 p.m. The new schedule will remain in effect until the end of the meet, May 27.

GII \$200,000 La Canada S., 4yo, f, 9f

Twice The Vice (Vice Regent), third in the first division of the La Canada Series, the GII La Brea S., and second in the second leg, the GII El Encino, worked five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 Sunday. The four-year-old filly has won five of her 11 career starts, including the GI Del Mar Oaks. She will face La Brea winner **Top Rung** (Seattle Slew), who will try a mile and an eighth for the first time; and El Encino heroine **Klassy Kim** (Silent Screen).

GI \$150,000a Santa Maria H., 4yo/up, f/m, 8.5f The probable field for the Santa Maria is: Corrazona (El Gran Senor); Key Phrase (Flying Paster); Paseana (Arg) (Ahmad {Arg}); Queens Court Queen (Lyphard); Thirst For Peace (Time for a Change); and Exchange (Explodent). Trainer Ron McAnally said of his champion Paseana, "There's a 98 percent chance she'll run. We'll probably blow her out some time this week." Queens Court Queen, impressive winner of the GII San Gorgonio H. at a mile and an eighth last time out, worked for the race Saturday, going five furlongs in 1:02 4/5 at Santa Anita. Undefeated Cal-bred Kev Phrase stretches out after a six-length victory in the GI Santa Monica H. at seven furlongs January 16. Corrazona tried dirt for the first time in the one-mile Run for the Roses H. January 2 and came away with a one-length win over Thirst For Peace, who had ended her '94 campaign with two stakes wins at the Santa Maria distance. Exchange, who along with Paseana is owned by Sidney Craig, makes her seasonal bow after taking the GI Matriarch November 27.

LAUREL ANNOUNCES PURSE INCREASE Laurel Park officials announced a 10 percent purse increase and a new racing schedule Monday. The Maryland racetrack will move to a Wednesday through Sunday live racing schedule effective Monday, February 6. Full-card, commingled simulcast wagering will be offered Mondays; Tuesdays will be dark for both live and simulcast racing. The exception will be President's Day, Monday, February 20, when Laurel will present a live card including the Gll \$200,000 General George S. Vice President Lenny Hale also unveiled a purse schedule enhancement yesterday which approximates to a 10 percent increase; the increase takes effect Thursday.
