BAY MEADOWS PLANS FOR CARD CLUB

According to Saturday's **San Francisco Chronicle**, Bay Meadows racetrack has announced plans to open a 50-table card club in its grandstand within two years. The card club could reportedly bring in 550 new jobs and \$2 million in taxes, while earning \$4 million for the San Mateo track. "The racetrack needs an added profit center, and that's what this will be," Bay Meadows President Jack Liebau told the **Chronicle**. The city of San Mateo is expected to vote on the proposed card club in May.

CHARLES TOWN SIMULCASTING RESUMES

FRIDAY? Charles Town Races officials have set Friday, February 10 as the tentative date for resumption of simulcast racing, but the opening could be delayed by the local Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association. Under federal law, a thoroughbred track must have approval of the horsemen's group representing the majority of the owners and trainers, but the presence of two competing groups-the newly formed Charles Town Horsemen's Association and the Charles Town HBPA--has created the question of which group has the authority to negotiate. The CTHA has already given its approval, pending a decision by the West Virginia Racing Commission as to which of the two groups is the official representative of the licensed horsemen, but CTHBPA President Randy Funkhouser has not yet responded to the proposal. "So far, we haven't heard from Mr. Funkhouser and that could force us to scrap our February 10 start date," said track president D. Keith Wagner. According to Wagner, if the start of simulcasting is pushed back, the track's scheduled March 3 resumption of live racing would be delayed as well. "We need about a month of simulcasting in order to build up the horsemen's purse fund and to allow time to reestablish our horse population," he said.
