NYRA TO PRODUCE LIVE RACING TELEVISION PROGRAM The New York

Racing Association will produce a daily television program of live racing from Aqueduct and offer it at no charge to cable television viewers throughout the state beginning Wednesday, February 15 and running through May 15 on an experimental basis. At this point, Nassau and Suffolk County OTB and Cablevision have agreed with NYRA to bring the programming into the homes of 600,000 Cablevision subscribers in Nassau and Suffolk counties on Long Island. The plan is subject to approval by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board. "We're pleased to be able to take advantage of the legislation allowing us to experiment with in-home live racing in this way," said Steven Crist, Director of Communications and Development for NYRA. "It gives us all a chance to serve racing fans and to gauge the effect of in-home wagering on on-track and off-track business without having made a long-term commitment." "Race Day Aqueduct" will run from 11 a.m. until about 4:15 p.m. on racing days. Hosting the show will be Harvey Pack, host of Sportschannel's Thoroughbred Action, with John Veitch as analyst, a role Veitch fills for NBC coverage of the Breeders' Cup. Race Day Aqueduct, which will feature only New York races, will also serve as the in-house feed at the Big A. "The new show will give us the opportunity to enhance our in-house presentation at Aqueduct as well," Crist added.

Four-year-old Holv Bull, who took the \$100,000 Olympic H. at Gulfstream in his last outing, will carry topweight of 127 pounds, the highest of his career. He concedes from 15 to 17 pounds to his nine rivals. "I can't believe I've only got five pounds (from starting highweight Best Pal, who carries 121)," said Meredith. "I thought I'd get a better break in the weights. I'll have to think it over." If the nine-year-old gelding starts, Eddie Delahoussaye will ride. Trainer Paco Gonzalez said of Del Mar Dennis (Dixieland Band), "He breezed Tuesday and went really well." The San Pasqual winner was clocked in 1:00 for five-eighths. The probable field also includes Slew of Damascus (Slewacide), Nonproductiveasset (Stalwart), Kingdom Found (The Bart), Marvin's Faith (IRE) (Sharp Victor), Nancy's French Fry (French Legionaire) and Screaming Don (Lyphard's Ridge). Trainer Ron McAnally said Tossofthecoin (Magesterial) is "on the fence" right now, and his participation depends on the weather and the track condition. Strodes Creek (Halo), who finished an unthreatening fourth in Sunday's Strub Stakes at Santa Anita, pulled a back muscle during the race and will be out of training for at least 30 days. X-rays were negative, but the four-year-old colt is out of the Santa Anita Handicap picture. Trainer Charlie Whittingham said the injury might have occurred when Strodes Creek, a chronically slow breaker from the starting gate, again struggled at the start of the Strub. "I knew we were dead by the first turn," Whittingham said. "I could see he was struggling and wouldn't change leads. He was dead lame when we got him back to the barn.' By Wednesday morning, Strodes Creek was able to walk without pain and his career should be able to resume without complications. Whittingham, however, said he took little solace. "The horse is young, but I'm not," said the trainer.

ILLINOIS GOVERNOR APPOINTS RACING TASK FORCE Illinois governor Jim Edgar has appointed a 22-member task force to study the problems of the state's Thoroughbred and Standardbred industries and recommend racing reform legislation. James Kane, a Chicago attorney, is the chairman of the task force whose panel includes the following track owners and operators: Dick Duchoissois of Arlington International Racecourse; Stormy Bidwill of Sportsman's Park; Tom Carey of Hawthorne Race Course: Brian Zander, Vice President and General Manager of Fairmont Park: and Bill Johnston, who controls harness racing at Sportsman's, Balmoral and Maywood. Among the other noteworthy appointees: Leonard Lavin, the Chicago owner/breeder whose horse One Dreamer won the 1994 Breeders' Cup Distaff; Steve Holland of the Chicago HBPA; Alan Crocker, of the Illinois HBPA; and Pat Whitworth, Executive Secretary of the Illinois Thoroughbred Breeders and Owners Foundation. Among the topics expected to be considered: revision of the parimutuel takeout at offtrack betting parlors owned and operated by the tracks; legalization of full-card simulcasting; home betting and its accompanying telecasts. The group will begin meetings next week with recommendations expected to be submitted to the legislature before it adjourns in July.

DRAMATIC GOLD, WEKIVA SPRINGS TO BIG 'CAP Dramatic Gold (Slew o' Gold) and Wekiva Springs (Runaway Groom), second and third-place finishers in Sunday's Strub S., are tentatively scheduled to make their next starts in the \$1-million Santa Anita H. March 11, their connections said Wednesday. Golden Eagle Farm's Dramatic Gold, who moved to over \$1.4 million in earnings with his runner-up effort, emerged from the race "great," according to trainer David Hofmans, who added that the gelding will "probably" be pointed to the Santa Anita H. Donald Dizney and Jim English's Wekiva Springs tackwalked Wed. and was "kicking and bucking," according to Jack Haymes, assistant to trainer Bob Hess Jr. "I think it's on to the Big 'Cap," Haymes said.

CALL NOW RECOVERING FROM SURGERY

Verne Winchell's **Call Now** (Wild Again) was back at trainer Ron McAnally's barn Wednesday after Dr. Kurt Hoffman performed knee surgery on the three-year-old filly at the Southern California Equine Foundation Hospital Tuesday. "As far as I know, everything went well," said McAnally. GII Del Mar Debutante winner Call Now, who finished third as the 11-10 favorite in the GII Santa Ynez Breeders' Cup S. Jan. 29 at Santa Anita, suffered an injury to her right front knee during the race. McAnally said the bay filly is expected to be sidelined some six months.

OUTLOOK BRIGHT FOR CRYPTIC BID Cryptic

Bid (Cryptoclearance), an impressive Aqueduct performer as a two-year-old last year, had bone chips removed from his right front ankle last month and underwent surgery on his cecum Feb. 1. "It's been seven days now since his second surgery," said trainer John Kimmel. "I just talked to the doctor and the outlook is bright. We were concerned yesterday because the horse had a little bit of colic, an impaction, but that passed. If there are no other complications, he'll be released Monday. He'll stay on a local farm where he'll get about three months of downtime. We'll be watching to see if he gains weight, holds his weight and we want to see how the incision heals before we do anything with him."

COOL AIR RETIRED? Frank Stronach's six-time stakes-winner Cool Air (Air Forbes Won), assigned highweight of 124 pounds for Saturday's GIII Monrovia H. at Santa Anita, will skip the 6 1/2-furlong turf race and might not race again, trainer Gary Jones said. The five-year-old bay mare, a winner of 13 races and \$535,853, will be shipped to Stronach's Margaux Stud farm in Lexington, Kentucky. "She's got chronically bad ankles, and they'll evaluate her back there and make a decision," Jones said. "If she doesn't race again, she'll obviously be a good broodmare."

AMERICAN HORSES NOMINATED TO HONG KONG RACE A total of 45 overseas and 38 Hong Kong-based entries have been received for the Queen Elizabeth II Cup race, to be run over 11 furlongs at Hong Kong's Sha Tin racecourse Saturday, April 1. The 11 North American-based horses nominated are Abigailthewife (Affirmed), Caesour (Nureyev), Complot (FR) (Highest Honor {FR}), Exalto (White Mischief), lanomami (IRE) (Green Desert), Newton's Law (IRE) (Law Society), River Majesty (Majestic Light), Savinio (The Minstrel), Sergeant Hawk (Silver Hawk), Shandon Lake (IRE) (Darshaan (GB)) and Shortfall (GB) (Last Tycoon {IRE}). A Selection Committee will decide which horses, both from overseas and Hong Kong, will be invited to compete. The race is limited to 14 starters with a maximum of seven from overseas. Selected horses and reserves from overseas will be announced Tuesday, February 21; those from Hong Kong will be announced Tuesday, March 21.
