HOLY BULL TOPS DRF FREE HANDICAP

Becoming the first three-year-old since Spectacular Bid in 1979 to be so highly weighted, Horse of the Year **Holy Bull** (Great Above) has been assigned 130 pounds to top the three-year-old division of the 1994 Daily Racing Form Free Handicap. The Free Handicap, drafted by Howard Battle, Keeneland's racing secretary; Terry Meyocks, director of racing for the New York Racing Association; and Eual Wyatt, Hollywood's racing secretary; weights horses in each division based on theoretical races at a mile and an eighth with the exception of the sprinters, who are rated at six furlongs. Topping the other divisions were: Three-Year-Old Fillies **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold), 126, and **Lakeway** (Seattle Slew), 126; Older Male **Colonial Affair** (Pleasant Colony), 123; Older Female **Sky Beauty** (Blushing Groom {Fr}), 127; Turf Male **Paradise Creek** (Irish River {Fr}), 127; Turf Females **Flawlessly** (Affirmed), 124, and **Hatoof** (Irish River {Fr}), 124; Male Sprinter **Cherokee Run** (Runaway Groom), 122; and Female Sprinter **Soviet Problem** (Moscow Ballet), 121.

AFTERNOON DEELITES PREPS FOR SAN VICENTE

Burt Bacharach's undefeated **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms) breezed a half-mile in :47 3/5 Thursday morning at Santa Anita in a final tuneup for Sunday's \$100,000-added San Vicente S. "It was a nice, even work," said trainer Richard Mandella. The seven-furlong San Vicente will begin a campaign that is programmed to culminate with the Triple Crown classics this spring. "The most important thing (Sunday) is to get a good race in Afternoon Deelites," Mandella continued. "I wouldn't want to see him get beat, but if he does get beat, it would be my fault because I haven't pressed him to get him ready." Also working for the race yesterday were Ron McAnally trainees **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister) and **On Target** (Forty Niner). Both colts drilled five furlongs, with Mr Purple logging a bullet :58 4/5 and On Target breezing in 1:01 3/5.

Virginia Rapids (Riverman) breezed a half-mile in :49 Thursday at Gulfstream. "He didn't go that fast," said trainer Allen Jerkens. "I thought he would go a little quicker." Jerkens decided at the last moment to run the five-year-old Grade I winner in the Donn. "It is not just running against Holy Bull," Jerkens said. "The Donn is a big race and if my colt runs a credible race, I'll be happy. He looks better than he ever has. He has been galloping very strong. We've changed his training and haven't worked him as often. We've been galloping him farther. He has always run well early in the year. I thought that with his long gallops, he could put in one of his big races." Virginia Rapids, who will be returning from a four-month layoff, ran against Holy Bull in last year's GI Metropolitan H. and finished fourth, beaten 7 1/2-lengths by the champ.

Sunday, Santa Anita:

SAN ANTONIO H.-GII, \$250,000a, 4yo/up, 1 1/8m

Trainer Derek Meredith will do something Sunday with **Cardmania** (Cox's Ridge) that the grand old gelding hasn't done in six years--race beyond a sprint distance. Meredith announced Thursday morning that the 1993 Eclipse Award-winning sprinter will run in the 1 1/8-mile San Antonio. "The last time he ran beyond seven furlongs was probably as a three-year-old in France," said Meredith. "He looks the picture and he's been training very well. He should like the distance, but you never know until you run him. It's up to Eddie (jockey Delahoussaye). He knows the horse. I won't have to tell him what to do." Cardmania, a nine-year-old Kentucky-bred, would be only the fifth horse of that venerable age to win a stakes race in Santa Anita Park's 60-year history.

**News Continued.****SANTA ANITA ACQUIRES OPTION IN CARD CLUB CASINO**

The Santa Anita Companies and James R. Knapp yesterday announced Santa Anita's purchase of an option to acquire a 50 percent interest in the Bell Jackpot Casino, a fully-licensed card club in the City of Bell, California, centrally located in Los Angeles County. A 42,000 square foot facility, the Bell Jackpot Casino opened Friday, Feb. 3 with a full complement of games at 45 tables, with capacity to expand to 60 tables as demand grows. The Casino, which will operate 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, is expected to generate in excess of \$1 million in annual municipal tax revenue. Under the terms of the agreement, Santa Anita will receive a five-year option to acquire a 50 percent equity interest in the Casino at such time that legislation is enacted in California to allow public companies to own and operate card club facilities and subject to state licensing and other regulatory approvals. Financial terms of the agreement were not disclosed. Stephen F. Keller, chairman of the boards of The Santa Anita Companies, said, "This is a very exciting opportunity for Santa Anita. At such time as we are able to exercise our option, the Bell Jackpot Casino will generate a substantial, non-cyclical revenue stream for the Companies and provide Santa Anita with a solid base for further expanding its entertainment franchise in Southern California."

CHARLES TOWN WITHDRAWS REQUEST FOR HBPA APPROVAL OF SIMULCASTS

Charles Town Races officials withdrew their request for Charles Town Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association approval of their planned simulcasting and called upon the West Virginia Racing Commission to recognize the Charles Town Horsemen's Association as the official representative of the majority of licensed owners and trainers at the track. Through noon yesterday, the Commission had licensed 207 owners and trainers at its Charles Town office, 204 of which have designated the CTHA as their representative through signed affidavits. The Charles Town Races had requested approval from both the CTHA and the Charles Town HBPA so that simulcasts could resume as soon as possible. The CTHA agreed to the proposed simulcasts last Saturday, but the HBPA rejected the proposed greyhound simulcasts and set conditions on the proposed Thoroughbred simulcasts which track officials view as unacceptable. "It is apparent based on the number of 1995 licensees and the signed affidavits which the Charles Town Horsemen's Association has on file that they are in fact the representative of the majority of licensed horsemen at the Charles Town Races," said track President D. Keith Wagner. "We recognize them as such and call upon the West Virginia Racing Commission to do so as well so that simulcasting and live racing can resume at the earliest possible date while we continue our efforts to sell the track."

CONCERN STILL POSSIBLE FOR BIG 'CAP

Robert Meyerhoff's Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Concern** (Broad Brush) still has an outside chance of participating in the \$1 million Santa Anita H. March 11. "I spoke with (trainer) Dick Small and he said the horse obviously needs a race before the Big 'Cap," said Tom Robbins, Santa Anita's vice president of racing. "They're thinking about it. It's still a possibility." **Concern**, a four-year-old Maryland-bred, has not raced since winning the Classic at Churchill Downs Nov. 6. The bay colt is currently stabled at Fair Grounds in New Orleans, Louisiana.

STORMY BLUES PREPARES FOR RETURN

Stormy Blues (Cure The Blues) worked five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 at Gulfstream yesterday under regular jockey Jose Santos as she continues to prep for her three-year-old debut in the GII Bonnie Miss S. March 4. "She is coming along real well," said Randy Schulhofer, son and assistant to trainer Scotty Schulhofer. "She is still a ways away, but hopefully she will be at the top of her game by March 4." **Stormy Blues** won the GIII Sorority at Monmouth and the GIII Selima at Laurel last year before finishing third in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in her last start Nov. 5.
