NEW YORK ENTRY RULE CHANGED

Due to the continued shortage of horses in New York, the State Racing and Wagering and Board vesterday approved a request by the New York Racing Association and the New York Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association to waive the rule requiring the coupling of entries from one trainer but different owners. Effective immediately, the approval covers stakes, maiden special weight, allowance and handicap races, but excludes claiming events. The rule has been changed on an experimental basis until April 30, 1995; if it is found to be unsatisfactory, it can be rescinded before that date. The stewards have been directed that, if they find that one of the uncoupled horses has interfered with the running of the race to the benefit of its stablemate, both will be disqualified. Horses owned by a trainer will, in all cases, run as an entry. In addition, if a trainer has three or more starters in a race other than a stakes, all starters will run coupled.

KEENELAND TWO-YEAR-OLD SALE SET FOR APRIL 18 Keeneland's third annual April Two-Year-Olds In Training Sale will be consolidated into one day, set for Tuesday, April 18, 1995. Explained Rogers Beasley, Keeneland's director of sales, "This will allow trainers to return to their out-of-state locations for live racing Wednesday." Officials expect to catalog approximately 210 horses; the sales session will begin at 1:30 p.m. Sales horses will be shown under tack, galloping or breezing over the Keeneland strip April 10 and 17.

THE WICKED NORTH SUFFERS SETBACK

Last year's champion Older Horse **The Wicked North** (Far North) has come down with a minor skin infection on his legs and body and could miss the Santa Anita H. as a result. "He should be fine in a couple of days," said his trainer, David Bernstein, "but we can't afford to miss any more time if we hope to make the Big 'Cap." The six-year-old has not raced since finishing fourth in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup last July 2.
