### DONN INJURY ENDS HOLY BULL'S

CAREER A day which should have ended with accolades and airplane tickets to the West Coast for Horse of the Year Holy Bull (Great Above) instead came to a screeching halt on the Gulfstream Park backstretch. The champ was pulled up suddenly while vying for the lead with eventual winner Cigar in the GI Donn H. vesterday afternoon, having suffered career-ending soft tissue damage to his left front leg. "It feels like the super flexor tendon in the back of the ankle," said Holy Bull's regular veterinarian, Dr. Peter Hall. "There is a lot of hemorrhaging. To the best of my ability, I feel there is a tear there. We will verify it tomorrow with much more sensitive instruments." Jockey Mike Smith, who came off the track in tears as the great grey was vanned back to the barn by horse ambulance, took 30 minutes to compose himself before speaking with the press. "It's devastating...I can't put it into words," he said. "I feel like the life has come out of me. He warmed up great, playing and having a good time. He was well in hand through the lane the first time and felt fine. Then he pinned his ears and about two strides later he went. I tried to pull him up as quickly as I could, but I also wanted to keep him as straight as I could. When they go to the side, it can (make the injury) worse." X-rays showed no fractures and the injury is not considered life-threatening, but it does break the hearts of racing fans across the country and those much closer to home. "It's over; it's over," said a saddened Jimmy Croll. "It's a great loss to everybody...a great loss to all of us. He has been great to racing. His next career will be at stud."

MELBOURNE CUP WINNER RETURNS Jeune

(Kalaglow), winner of last year's two-mile Melbourne Cup, was impressive taking yesterday's GI sevenfurlong C.F. Orr S. at Sandown in Australia. The sixyear-old burst to the lead at the eighth-pole to score by 2 3/4 lengths in a course record 1:21.10. Jeune's next outing is likely to be the GII St. George S. at a mile and a quarter March 4; he then tackles the Gl \$500,000 Australian Cup the following weekend. News cont. p2

The two were head-and-head coming onto the backstretch when Holy Bull broke down and was pulled up; Cigar continued on the front end, shaking off the challenge of Primitive Hall and drawing clear through the stretch for his second Grade I triumph. "First of all, let me say how terribly disappointed I am for Mr. Croll and his horse. It is a terrible blow...no one wants to win like this," said winning trainer Bill Mott. Added jockey Jerry Bailey, "As we came into the backstretch I heard a pop and then I heard Mike (Smith, aboard Holy Bull) yell, 'Oh, no'; then I lost them. It is a terrible thing to happen, with a big crowd like this and everyone looking forward to a super race."

Evil's Pic faces four rivals looking for her sixth straight in Sunday's \$50,000a Dearly Precious S., a sixfurlong event for three-year-old fillies. The daughter of Piccolino came from the back of the pack last time out to take the Ruthless S. "She's not going to be just a 'winter' horse," says her trainer, Howie Tesher. "She has two gears. She makes a run, and then she'll make a run again--that says she'll stretch out. All she wants to do is win." The filly will be rested after the Dearly Precious and pointed for the Cicada S. March 26.

### SOPHOMORES PREP FOR FOUNTAIN OF

YOUTH Hutcheson S. winner Valid Wager (Valid Appeal) breezed five furlongs in :59 3/5 Saturday morning at Gulfstream Park and is on target for his next engagement, the GII Fountain of Youth S. February 18. "He really went fast and it is humid out," said his trainer, Mike Mollica. "He is one tired dude. I always like to knock the air out of my horses a week out. He'll bounce back in three or four days and come race day, he'll be on the muscle. Everything is coming up just perfect." Also prepping for the Fountain of Youth, Thunder Gulch (Gulch) breezed threequarters in 1:13 2/5 at Santa Anita Saturday; runnerup to undefeated Afternoon Deelites in the GI Hollywood Futurity in his last start, the Team Lukas colt is scheduled to ship to Gulfstream Thursday. "He hasn't run since December, but it's time to get started," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "The time off seems to have helped him. He is a late May foal, so he is not even three yet. Every day, he develops a little more." Another three-year-old prospect, Preview S. winner Suave Prospect (Fortunate Prospect) worked fiveeighths in 1:00 at Gulfstream yesterday.

### FUTURE UNCERTAIN FOR COLONEL

COLLINS Colonel Collins (El Gran Senor), third in three of Europe's Gl events for three-year-olds last year including the Epsom Derby, suffered a strained tendon in his U.S. debut Wednesday and may be retired. The colt finished last in the race, an allowance which marked his first dirt start. "(The injury) had to have happened during the race," said his trainer, Rodney Rash. "He didn't have a pimple on him and he had trained beautifully." Rash added that majority owners Gary Tanaka and Robert Sangster will meet to decide the four-year-old's future plans.

### TURFWAY ANNOUNCES PURSE INCREASE

Effective with last Friday night's card, purses at Turfway Park have been raised five percent. This is the second purse increase at the track this season; daily average purse distribution is now above \$200,000. "We are very pleased that, in the midst of some awful winter weather, we are able to announce an increase in purses for our horsemen," said Mark Simendinger, Turfway president, who cited the popularity of the track's new Race Book, full-card simulcasting from out of state, and the strong off-track wagering support of Turfway racing as the factors leading to the raise.

TENNIS LADY RETIRED Tennis Lady (Broad Brush), a graded stakes winner and full sister to GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Concern, has been retired. Owned and bred by Robert Meyerhoff, the five-year-old won seven races and \$283,047; she is currently at Lantern Hill Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, and will be bred to Gone West.
