COLONEL COLLINS TO WALMAC Colonel

Collins (El Gran Senor), injured in an allowance race on the dirt at Santa Anita last Wednesday, has been retired and will stand the 1995 breeding season at Walmac Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. The four-yearold, who finished third in last year's Epsom Derby, Irish Derby and 2000 Guineas, was scheduled to arrive at Walmac last night; he will stand for a fee of \$7,500, live foal.

WALLENDA ON LASIX LIST Dogwood Stable's Wallenda (Gulch), eighth in Saturday's GI Donn H., suffered breathing problems in the race and will run with Lasix in his next start, scheduled for the GI Gulfstream Park H. March 5. "Wallenda displaced his soft palate during the race," said Dogwood President Cot Campbell. "(Jockey) Herb McCauley said his breathing was quite labored as he went into the first turn and he was unable to get the needed air supply during the entire race. Herb very wisely protected the horse and let him finish on his own. It was a very uncharacteristic race, of course. An endoscopic examination revealed that he bled from the lungs to some extent."

BEST SEVEN ON ESPN The National Best Seven will be televised live on ESPN for the first time this Saturday as part of a 90-minute broadcast beginning at 3:30 p.m. EST. The featured event of the telecast will be the \$200,000 Fountain of Youth S. from Gulfstream Park. ESPN will be offering the Best Seven as part of several live programs this year, including April 8, when the Remington Park Derby will be broadcast, and June 17, when the line-up will be headed by Thistledown's Ohio Derby.

GII \$200,000 Fountain of Youth S., 3vo, 8.5f Jockey Eddie Delahoussaye will fly in from California to ride Jambalaya Jazz (Dixieland Band) for the first time Saturday. "Eddie and I are life-long friends. I told him, 'It looks like I've got the real thing here; come on over and let's see.' His style is so perfect for this horse," said trainer John T. Ward. "They ought to fit one another like a hand to a glove. Jamabalya Jazz is very methodical in his races. He does whatever a rider wants. With Eddie's great sense of timing, it should be a perfect match." The colt finished first, but was disgualified and placed second in a Gulfstream allowance February 3. "It is unfortunate that he was allowed to change lanes too quickly, but we were very pleased," said Ward. "He has matured so much as a racehorse. He is so much more powerful and so much more fluid. He is like an old horse to train instead of a three-year-old. He doesn't shy away from work. When he runs, he knows what he is there for. We'll keep adding a little more to his plate; we'll see if he can digest it." Jambalaya Jazz is scheduled to blow out for the race Thursday. Also expected for the nationally televised event are Thunder Gulch (Gulch), Valid Wager (Valid Appeal), Suave Prospect (Fortunate Prospect), GSP You're The One (Cure the Blues), Bay Meadows SW Raii (Rajab), GSP Cinch (Temperence Hill), two-time Maryland SW Oliver's Twist (Horatius), GSP Mighty Magee (Cormorant), Prairie Bayou's half-brother Flitch (Demons Begone), GSP Don Juan A (Manila), and '95 SW King's Fiction (Believe The Queen).

SAM HOUSTON UNDER SCRUTINY According to reports in Sunday's Houston Chronicle and Monday's Dallas Morning News, more than \$36 million borrowed to build Sam Houston Race Park was paid out to insiders in the financially troubled racetrack without first opening contracts to outside bidding. The articles reported, in part, that construction firms owned by Sam Houston partners were awarded a \$16.9 million contract to build the grandstand; members of the partnership were also paid \$6.6 million for the property on which the track was built-property which had cost the group just \$3.6 million a year earlier. The track's major investor, Maxxam Inc., earned more than \$800,000 last year in consulting fees, and a subsidiary of the company was hired to manage the track. Bryon Wade, a Maxxam attorney, told the Dallas Morning News that the majority of the contracts were signed before the partners became investors, rather than the other way around. Ken Pearson, the former track vice president, was reported as saying time constraints prevented competitive bidding. Documents have been filed with both the Securities and Exchange Commission and the Texas Racing Commission.

WOODBINE TO OPEN MARCH 25 Pending approval of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, the opening date for the 1995 Thoroughbred meet at Woodbine is now set for Saturday, March 25. The Ontario racetrack was originally scheduled to open March 19; a bid to move the start date to April 1 was turned down. The HBPA is expected to gives its consent for the change next week.
