#### OWNER THOMAS VALANDO DEAD

Thomas Valando, who was to celebrate his 73rd birthday March 1, died at St. Mary's Hospital in West Palm Beach, Florida at 5 p.m. Tuesday, Mr. Valando had made only one appearance at Gulfstream Park this season and had been troubled all winter by a bad cold. He then developed pneumonia, which resulted in his hospitalization. He was admitted only Tuesday morning. His wife Elizabeth was at his bedside when he died. Mr. Valando is best recalled as the owner of 1990 Champion Two-Year-Old Colt Fly So Free. He was also noted for being one of the most successful "angels" associated with the Broadway stage, backing such hits as "Fiddler on the Roof," "Lost in Yonkers" and "Kiss of the Spider Woman." He was born in Brooklyn, New York and secured a job as a young man at a sheet music company. He made contacts in the entertainment business and became one of the leading figures on Broadway. He was a member of the Turf and Field Club in New York as well as the Turf Club at Gulfstream Park. Funeral arrangements have not yet been made.

#### AQUEDUCT, TURFWAY CANCEL RACING

Aqueduct called off its nine-race card Wednesday due to winter storm conditions. Also cancelling yesterday was Turfway Park, which reported that rapidly rising temperatures were adversely affecting the track. Racing is scheduled to resume at both tracks today.

CHARLES TOWN HBPA APPROVES **RESUMPTION OF SIMULCASTING The Charles** Town Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association joined the Charles Town Horsemen's Association in approving the resumption of interstate simulcasting at the Charles Town Races, paving the way for the return of live racing in early March. Track officials have targeted February 24 for the commencement of simulcasts with live racing set to return March 10. "We're pleased that the HBPA has agreed to allow simulcasting to go forward," said track President D. Keith Wagner. "The resumption of simulcasting will enable the horsemen to begin generating needed purse money and will allow us to hasten preparations for live racing." Among the tracks Charles Town plans to simulcast from are Gulfstream, Santa Anita, Laurel, Penn National, Philadelphia Park and Fair Grounds. Track officials plan to add greyhound racing from Florida's Hollywood Greyhound Park to their simulcast menu once live Thoroughbred

SAN ANTONIO RUNNERS TO SANTA ANITA HANDICAP The top three finishers from Sunday's San Antonio H. at Santa Anita--Best Pal (\*Habitony), Slew of Damascus (Slewacide) and Tossofthecoin (Magesterial) -- are all expected to run in the \$1 million Santa Anita H. March 11, their connections said yesterday. Vladimir Cerin, trainer of fifth-place finisher Nancys French Fry (French Legionaire), said the gray would also return in the Big 'Cap and hope for a better trip. "I would have liked to have seen him go five-wide instead of eight-wide," Cerin said. "We basically started our move the same time Best Pal started his, but he got through on the rail and we were hung out to dry. I don't think it's unrealistic to think we might have gotten second." Meanwhile, Trudy McCaffery and John Toffan's Del Mar Dennis (Dixieland Band), fourth as the 3-1 second choice in the San Antonio, bled during the race, trainer Paco Gonzalez said. The five-year-old is a possible starter in the Santa Anita H. "We'll scope him after his next couple of breezes, see if he bleeds, and make a decision," Gonzalez said.

#### BANK ROBBER CAUGHT AT GULFSTREAM

Alleged bank robber Miguel Aleman, 40, of Hollywood, Florida, was apprehended at Gulfstream Park yesterday. Aleman is accused of robbing a Nation's Bank Tuesday, February 14 at 3:05 p.m. According to FBI agent George B. Close III, Aleman tried to pass a large sum of money to a teller Wednesday at Gulfstream. The teller alerted Gulfstream security because of the dye stains on the cash placed there by the bank in the event of a robbery. When Aleman returned to the betting window a second time, he was arrested by the FBI.

#### RIVER DOWNS ANNOUNCES '95 RACING

DATES The 1995 racing season at River Downs in Cincinnati, Ohio will open April 14 and run through Labor Day, September 4. The fall season will commence October 14 and conclude November 5. River Downs will once again offer the Twin Seven SuperCard. The daily program will alternate between live racing and simulcasts from Thistledown to provide a 14-race card in a four-hour period. In addition, the track will present seven live twilight racing programs, to be held Friday evenings from June 16 to July 28. The 120-day spring/summer meeting will feature 31 stakes for purse money totaling \$1,495,000. The highlight will be the \$200,000 Miller Genuine Draft Cradle S. for two-year-olds, to be run Labor Day.
