NATIONAL HBPA MEETING CONCLUDES IN HOUSTON

The National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association's annual winter meeting, which ended Wednesday, saw the organization vote for changes which will "provide more services and assistance to all horsemen." The HBPA will relocate its national office from New Orleans to a new location; although the new site has not yet been chosen, the relocation is expected to be completed by September 1, 1995. The HBPA board will also hire a spokesperson. Membership will be opened to individuals not currently affiliated with the HBPA and associate memberships will also be available. A new tiered voting system was put into place, giving more votes to those affiliated states paying the most in dues; the executive committee will now include the top five dues-paying affiliates as well as two at-large states. Said President Melvin Bowman, "The HBPA board of directors has begun a concerted effort to rebuild the National HBPA and send a clear and concise message to the racing industry that we are here and we are strong."

EARLY DECLARATIONS FOR EPSOM DERBY

This year's Epsom Derby, to be run Saturday, June 10, will be the first to have a 48-hour declaration deadline. The British Horseracing Board has made the change, which means runners for the Classic will be known on the previous Thursday, to maximize the event's worldwide profile and to increase betting turnover, especially in the Far East. Edward Gillespie, managing director of Epsom's owners Untied Racecourses, said, "We earn a percentage of the money bet on the Derby in Hong Kong, so we are trying to get information into the papers as early as possible."

GENERAL GEORGE H.-GII, \$200,000, 3yo/up, 7f

Powis Castle (Rare Brick), winner of the GII Malibu S. at Santa Anita in his last start Dec. 26, worked a half-mile over Santa Anita's fast main track yesterday in :48 4/5, breezing. Powis Castle will tote 118 pounds in the General George, including jockey Patrick Valenzuela. Maryland-based **Who Wouldn't** (Baederwood), third in last year's General George and coming into the event off a four-race winning streak, is expected to be the starting highweight at 119 pounds. Carrying 117 will be six-year-old Virginia-bred **Marry Me Do** (Blushing Groom {FR}), winner of three stakes in 1994 as well as the six-furlong Hoover S. at Laurel in his last start Feb. 5. Other probable starters include **Storm Tower** (Irish Tower), 116; **Key Contender** (Fit to Fight), 115; **Night Spirit** (Seattle Slew), 114; **Danzig's Dance** (Hold Your Peace), 114; **Golden Pro** (Distinctive Pro), 114; **Don's Sho** (Don's Choice), 112; and **Alleged Impression** (Sitzmark), 110.

TURFWAY CANCELS THURSDAY CARD For the second consecutive day Thursday, Turfway Park officials cancelled the evening race card due to the thawing condition of the racing surface. This is the ninth day lost to weather conditions since January 1. Thursday's card was cancelled at approximately 2 p.m. when it became obvious that the water from melting snow and ice together with the rain received in the last two days made the track unsafe for racing. "The weather forecast for this weekend is favorable, and we want to present a good track for the four-day Presidents' Day weekend coming up," said Turfway President Mark Simendinger. The Race Book at Turfway Park remained open Thursday.

SPORTSMAN'S PARK OPENS TODAY The 1995 Chicago Thoroughbred racing season opens today at Sportsman's Park, with the first race post time set for 1:00 p.m. A total of 20 stakes worth more than \$2 million will be offered at the meet, highlighted by the GII \$500,000 Illinois Derby Saturday, May 13. Two additional graded stakes scheduled are the GIII \$250,000 National Jockey Club H., April 29, and the GIII \$300,000 Sixty Sails H., May 7. Saturday, April 22 is Illinois Red Letter Day at Sportsman's, featuring six stakes races for Illinois-breds. The revised racing schedule in Illinois gives Sportsman's an expanded 90-day meeting that runs Thursdays through Mondays to June 22; Tuesdays and Wednesdays will be dark.

AUTOTOTE IN JOINT VENTURE WITH IWN INC. Autotote Corporation yesterday announced it has signed a letter of intent with IWN Inc., a wholly-owned subsidiary of interactive television programmer NTN Communications Inc., to develop and market pari-mutuel wagering applications for interactive technologies. Under the terms of agreement, Autotote and IWN will work together to develop an interactive wagering system. Autotote will combine its existing computerized wagering system capabilities with IWN's HomeStretch, a PC-based wagering software and back-end host system that enables racing fans to open accounts, access information and transmit wagers electronically. HomeStretch is scheduled for pre-release testing during the first quarter of 1995. As part of the agreement, Autotote and IWN expect to develop additional interactive wagering applications for other types of interactive platforms. Kenneth Shea, director of corporate development of Autotote, said, "This alliance firmly positions Autotote and IWN at the forefront of the emerging market for interactive wagering services. Together, Autotote and IWN will work to further develop the market for pari-mutuel wagering by introducing sports such as Thoroughbred racing into non-traditional, off-track market segments."
