Wekiva Springs (Runaway Groom), whose six-race win streak ended with a third-place finish in the GI Strub S. last time out, has suffered a quarter crack in his right front hoof which could cause him to miss the GI Santa Anita H. March 11. "I hate making a bunch of excuses, but I have a suspicion that this may have been there even for the Strub," said his trainer, Bob Hess Jr. "My suspicion is that he had a blind quarter crack going into the Strub and it didn't show itself in any way." Hess went on to say that, while his charge is "60-40" to make the Big 'Cap, he will still be pointed to the race. "We're going to work on (the quarter crack)...we're going to miss a few days, nothing serious. We'll patch it and then we'll go on with him. He might only have two weeks prior to the Big 'Cap, but right now our intention is to run in there."

NEW SUPPLEMENTARY STAGE FOR EPSOM OAKS Epsom will introduce a supplementary entry stage seven days before the Vodafone Oaks, which is due to be run this year on Friday, June 9. Edward Gillespie, chief executive of United Racecourses, which owns Epsom Downs, explained, "It is to allow a filly who has come on late to run. It would be silly to keep one out at that stage." There are, however, no current plans for a similar arrangement for the Epsom Derby.

HOLLYWOOD APPLIES FOR REVISED FATHER'S DAY SCHEDULE After discussions with the Thoroughbred Owners of California and the industry's fan committee, Hollywood Park has applied for back-to-back 14-race cards during a shortened race week leading up to Father's Day. The applications for Hollywood's '95 spring/summer meeting seeks the extended cards for Father's Day weekend, with post time set for 4:00 p.m. Saturday and 1:00 p.m. Sunday. The customary five-day week would be reduced to four days to accommodate the additional weekend action; there would be no racing Wednesday, June 14.

CORRAZONA RETIRED La Presle Farm's Corrazona (El Gran Senor), GISW of \$513,964, has been retired following arthroscopic surgery on her right front ankle. "While we were in there, we looked at the joint surface of her ankle and it looked like she had enough wear and tear to decide to just retire her and breed her," said her trainer, Richard Mandella. "We didn't want her to come back at half her ability." The five-year-old will be sent to Hagyard Farm in Kentucky.

"RACE DAY AQUEDUCT" SUCCESSFUL IN DEBUT "Race Day Aqueduct", the New York Racing Association-produced cable television show which features the live races daily from the Big A, made it's debut Thursday and boosted NYRA telephone account wagering 62 percent, from \$22,112 for the card a year ago to \$35,830 in '95. "We expect this product will grow," said Steven Crist, director of Communications and Development. "At this time, only Nassau and Suffolk OTB are participating. We would be happy to provide this programming to cable viewers in any OTB region at no cost to the OTB region and no additional cost to the viewers. Capital OTB is expected to join in soon, and officials at New York City OTB have shown interest. We would like the OTB regions not now participating to take advantage of the free offer. It would give all concerned parties a better idea of what it could mean to the future of racing in New York, the New York Racing Association, and the OTB regions as well." The in-home simulcasting experiment, approved by the New York State Legislature last summer, will air on a trial basis through May 15.

PURSES UP AT FAIR GROUNDS Bryan Krantz, president of Fair Grounds, has announced purse increases of \$500 to \$1,000 each for all overnight races, effective Thursday, February 23. To date, the New Orleans' daily purse distribution has averaged \$140,684, up slightly from last year's record-setting season.
