GO FOR GIN BREEZES; TO CLAIBORNE IN

'96 Last year's Kentucky Derby winner Go for Gin (Cormorant) breezed five furlongs in a bullet 1:00 yesterday morning at Gulfstream, but not before an unscheduled change of riders. The four-year-old, who is expected to make his '95 bow in early March, was originally sent to the track under jockey Jerry Bailey, but he refused to train and Bailey had to bring him back to the barn. Regular exercise rider Findley Bishop was then put aboard and the colt went about his business. "He is back to his old tricks of eight months ago," said his trainer, Nick Zito. Go for Gin will retire at the end of 1995; he will stand the 1996 breeding season at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky for a fee of \$20,000, live foal.

TURFWAY CANCELS AGAIN In an eleventh-hour decision shortly before the first race Saturday, the racing surface at Turfway Park was deemed unsafe and racing was cancelled. It was the third time in the last four days that the Kentucky track had been forced to call off its live card; despite a 21-minute delay Friday, the evening's races were completed without incident. Friday night's eighth race was held up when the jockeys brought their mounts back to the paddock after warming up to request that the track be floated. The track superintendent declined to float the surface because it was drying and the sand-loam mixture was balling up under the float skids. The track was in good shape during morning training hours vesterday, but quickly thawed as temperatures rose into the mid-50s by post time. The horses reported to the paddock for the first race, but after a discussion between track management and the riders, the cancellation was announced. Turfway's track maintenance crew will work through the night and racing is expected to resume this afternoon.

WESTERN ECHO TRAINING IN FLORIDA

Western Echo (Eastern Echo), still fighting bronchitis, is in training at Gulfstream and did not go to the farm as originally planned. The colt breezed five furlongs in 1:01 2/5 Saturday. "We scoped him and he has still got (bronchitis)," said trainer Bud Delp. "He can't run until it clears up. I'll nominate him to the Florida Derby, but it is not likely that we'll make it."

CHARLES TOWN GRANTS PURCHASE **OPTION TO SHOWBOAT** Charles Town Racing Limited Partenership, owner of Charles Town Races, Inc., has granted an option to Showboat Operating Company of New Jersey to purchase the track for \$18 million. The option grants the company, which operates Atlantic City's Showboat casino, exclusive rights to buy the 250-acre facility through April 30, 1995. Under terms of the agreement, Showboat made what track owners described as a "substantial" non-refundable deposit and agreed to the continuation of live racing. Dr. George Yeatras, chairman of the Charles Town partnership who made the announcement, also revealed that the track had been offered to Virginia businessman Jim Young for \$12.5 million, but Wilson declined. Charles Town Races President D. Keith Wagner said that Showboat's deposit would be used for the reopening, renovation and operation of the track, which is scheduled to open for simulcasting February 24, with live racing to resume March 10.
