ARTS AND LETTERS PENSIONED Gainesway Farm announced yesterday the retirement from stud duty of 1969 Horse of the Year Arts and Letters (*Ribot), at the age of 29. Arts and Letters, who raced for Paul Mellon's Rokeby Stables, won the 1969 Belmont S., Travers S., Woodward S., Metropolitan H., Jockey Club Gold Cup, Blue Grass S., Everglades S. and Jim Dandy S. In addition to being named Horse of the Year, he was crowned Champion Three-Year-Old Colt and Champion Handicap Horse. During his career, the Virginia-bred chestnut won 11 of 23 starts for earnings of \$632,404. Arts and Letters has sired 57 stakes performers and the earners of over \$13,000,000 including Grade I winners Winter's Tale, Codex, Lord Darnley and Tonzarun.

SANTA ANITA HANDICAP NOTES Rodney Rash-trainee Urgent Request (IRE) (Rainbow Quest) will run in the \$1-million Santa Anita H. Saturday, March 11. "He will be on the lead (in the Big 'Cap)," said Rash, "and anyone that goes with him will burn themselves out." Five-year-old Urgent Request, a Group 3 winner in England last year, worked a mile in 1:40 2/5 at Santa Anita Thursday. In his only North American start, the gray horse finished fifth in the GI Rothmans International over the Woodbine turf last October 16. In another Big 'Cap development Thursday, Dramatic Gold (Slew o' Gold) drilled six panels in 1:12 2/5, galloping out the seven furlongs in 1:25 4/5. "A couple of more works and hopefully we'll be ready," said trainer David Hofmans. Del Mar Dennis (Dixieland Band) breezed an easy five furlongs in 1:01 2/5. Trainer Paco Gonzalez said next week's work might decide if the Dixieland Band gelding runs. "We'll ask him for more speed in his next work, and then we'll scope him to check for bleeding." Del Mar Dennis bled slightly while finishing fourth in the San Antonio H. Feb. 12. Blumin Affair (Dynaformer) is out of the Big 'Cap picture, according to Tom Van Berg, son and assistant to trainer Jack Van Berg.

The Tim Kelly-trainee will run in the Correction on only seven days rest; she finished fifth, beaten 3 3/4-lengths, in the GII Barbara Fritchie at Laurel last Saturday. Regular rider Diane Nelson has the mount. Trying stakes company for the first time will be Cynthia Phipps' For Sport (Forty Niner). The four-year-old broke through the gate before taking a six-furlong allowance at Aqueduct in her last start Feb. 9. "It's a big step up, no doubt about that," said Buzzy Tenney, assistant to trainer Shug McGaughey. "But all of her races here this winter have been good. There'll be some heavy heads coming back here soon, so this is a good time to try and get her a stakes win or a stakes placing." TURFWAY BACK ON TRACK Racing resumed at Turfway Park Wednesday night with a racing surface that had been reconditioned by the track's maintenance staff in less than three days. In a race against time, the Turfway crew of Track Superintendent Daniel Chapman laid down the last of the track's top surface only minutes before Wednesday's first race at 7 p.m. The revamped surface immediately drew high praise from the track's trainers and jockeys, who had missed a holiday weekend of racing because the winter's unusual cycle of freezes and thaws had weakened the track's foundation. "This is a remarkable accomplishment," said Turfway Park Chairman Jerry L. Carroll. "I have always said that, with this region's work ethic, we have the best staff of any racetrack in the country, and this monumental effort certainly proves that."

Rvan has sold partial ownership of the colt and used the money to fund facial surgery for deformed children in the Gaza Strip by American surgeons affiliated with the Norfolk, Va.-based organization Operation Smile.
