CHURCHILL DOWNS TO OFFER DERBY

SIMULCAST IN KENTUCKY Officials at Churchill Downs announced yesterday that the 1995 Kentucky Derby will be made available to the intertrack wagering network and off-track betting sites in Kentucky. The simulcast, which will include all ten races on Derby Day, will be conducted as a one-year test. "In the interest of promoting pari-mutuel horse racing throughout Kentucky, Churchill Downs will make the Derby simulcast available in-state this year on an experimental basis," said Thomas H. Meeker, president and CEO of Churchill Downs. "We have chosen not to offer the Derby simulcast in Kentucky in previous years because we have significant operational and public relations concerns. We have always believed that simulcasting the Derby to ITW and OTB outlets in the state could adversely affect on-track attendance at Churchill Downs. However, in the spirit of cooperation, we have decided to set our fears aside and test the waters." Churchill Downs officials estimate that the track will have to recruit and train as many as 500 new mutuel clerks to replace those clerks who choose to remain at each ITW and OTB location on Derby and Oaks days. The cost of recruiting and training these clerks may run as high as \$75,000. Additionally, it will have to be determined with United Tote whether there will be a sufficient number of mutuel machines available to accommodate the entire state. In an effort to resolve these state-wide operational concerns and minimize the financial risks involved. Churchill Downs is seeking the agreement of each receiving track in regard to several specific conditions. Churchill Downs would receive an additional percentage of the commission on the Derby simulcast from each receiving track to cover operational expenses. Also, the receiving tracks and Churchill Downs would agree to work together to actively support horse racing's key legislative initiatives during the 1996 season of the Kentucky General Assembly. SAN RAFAEL S.-GII, \$150,000a, 3yo, 1m Champion Two-Year-Old Colt Timber Country (Woodman) drilled a half-mile in :47 1/5 Monday at Santa Anita and remains firm for the San Rafael, his threevear-old debut. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas termed the work as "fine" and said the colt's regular rider Pat Day is due to arrive in California Friday night. California Breeders' Champion S. winner Snow Kidd'n (Snow Chief) worked six furlongs in 1:13 Monday. As of early Wed., trainer Dan Brown still hadn't decided whether the California-bred will go postward. Owner/trainer Craig Lewis plans to enter Santa Catalina S. winner Larry the Legend (Local Talent) in the San Rafael, but that doesn't necessarily mean the colt will run. Lewis said he's also considering the GIII \$300,000 Louisiana Derby March 19. "If we run here, we'll be running against better horses for less money," said Lewis. "I know (Larry the Legend) can fight, but he hasn't been in with Mike Tyson. On the other hand, let's say you go to Louisiana. You've got to ship the horse and you might run into an ambush. There are so many things that can go wrong." Threetime stakes-winner Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}) will bypass the San Rafael and ship to Remington Park for the \$100,000 Great West S. March 19, trainer Gary Lewis said. Others pointing to the San Rafael are Mr Purple (Deputy Minister), Delahoussaye; Fandarel Dancer (Marshua's Dancer), F. Valenzuela; and American Day (Nureyev), McCarron.

Sunday, Santa Anita:

ARCADIA H.-GII, \$100,000a, 4yo/up, 1mT Gll San Gabriel H. winner Romarin (BRAZ) (Itaiara {BRAZ}) worked five furlongs in 1:01 4/5 Wed. at Santa Anita. Golden Eagle Farm's River Flyer (Riverman), who took the GII San Marcos H. Jan. 21 at Santa Anita, will be shooting for his second straight graded stakes victory as the 121-pound highweight. Gary Jones-trainee Inner City (IRE) (Bob Back) was scratched from a \$60,000 turf allowance vesterday at Santa Anita. "As tough as that race came up," said Jones, "I may as well run him Sunday for \$100,000." That's precisely what Jones intends to do. Also scheduled to go postward in the Arcadia are Alex The Great (GB) (Bairn), College Town (Snow Chief), Marvin's Faith (IRE) (Sharp Victor) and Mighty Forum (GB) (Presidium {GB}).

GULFSTREAM PARK H.-GI, \$500,000, 3yo/up, 10f Probable favorite Cigar (Palace Music) breezed five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 vesterday at Gulfstream. "That's all he'll do," said trainer Bill Mott. "I'm pleased with his work and the way he has been going." Cigar won the GI Donn H. on the front end last time out, but could face a hotter pace this time around. "He'll be wherever he is comfortable in the early going," Mott said. "I don't want to go head and head with a pace that is too fast. He is versatile, so I don't think we have to have a strict game plan." Also breezing at Gulfstream vesterday was MGIII winner Serious Spender (Seattle Slew), who went five furlongs in 1:03. The four-year-old, sixth in the GIII Stymie H. at Aqueduct Feb. 20, arrived from New York Sunday. "I came eight days before the race to give him time to adjust to the heat," said trainer Dominick Schettino. "He has adjusted well." Regarding race strategy, Schettino has it all mapped out. "We are going to the front Sunday," said the trainer. "When he gets to the top, he is tough to get to. He is five for five on the lead." Serious Spender arrived with his companion, a large goat named Goat. "He stall walks without him,' Schettino explained. Mahogany Hall (Woodman), winner of the Diplomat Way H. at the Fair Grounds Jan. 28, arrived at Gulfstream from the New Orleans track yesterday morning. Trainer John Forbes noted that Proud Shot (Proud Birdie), fifth in the Donn at 21-1 odds, will start in the GI event under Craig Perret.

RACEDAY AQUEDUCT DEBUTS IN NYC "RaceDay Aqueduct", the New York Racing

Association's home-betting telecast experiment, made its debut in New York City's five boroughs yesterday, swelling the number of homes receiving the program to 1.9 million. The program, which allows cable subscribers to watch live racing from Aqueduct and has boosted wagering through NYRA One and OTB phone accounts, debuted last month in homes in Long Island's Nassau and Suffolk Counties. Advertising for "RaceDay Aqueduct" begins Friday, but even without it yesterday's OTB phone betting was up approximately \$50,000 over the prior Wednesday figure. "We're very happy to have New York City participate in this exciting project," said Steven Crist, NYRA's director of communications and development. "We hope to add the regions encompassed by Western Region and Catskill OTB in the near future." The inhome simulcasting of races was okayed on an experimental basis by the New York State Legislature last summer. That experimental period expires May 15. As part of the agreement between NYRA and New York City OTB, the latter has agreed to actively support legislation to eliminate the minimum balance requirements on all telephone wagering accounts in New York State. NYRA One patrons must currently maintain a \$450 balance.

GARY STEVENS TO RIDE IN BIG 'CAP Jockey Gary Stevens, who left his Southern California base for Hong Kong Feb. 1 to fulfill a four-and-a-half month contractual riding arrangement with Hong Kong-based trainer Steve Leung, will return to Santa Anita to ride Urgent Request (IRE) (Rainbow Quest) in the \$1 million Santa Anita H. March 11. "He'll be back on Sunday (March 5) and will ride Thursday, Friday and Saturday (before the Big 'Cap)," agent Ron Anderson reported Wednesday. Five-year-old Urgent Request, a Group 3 winner in England last year, has never raced in the United States and was second in his most recent start, the Hong Kong Invitational Vase at Sha Tin Racecourse Dec. 11. "Gary rode him in the Rothmans International," trainer Rodney Rash pointed out. "I just picked up the phone and called him (Stevens)." Urgent Request finished fifth in the Rothmans, beaten only two lengths, after setting the early pace. The gray worked nine furlongs yesterday in 1:50, handily, over Santa Anita's fast main track.

MONTICELLO CASINO PLANS UNVEILED

Watermark Investments Ltd., a privately held group which recently signed a contract to purchase and manage Monticello Raceway, a standardbred track 90 miles from New York City, yesterday announced its intention to work with the Oneida Indian Nation to develop a casino adjacent to Monticello's clubhouse on the raceway grounds. The Oneida Nation currently operates New York State's lone casino, the Turning Stone Casino near Syracuse. Pending prompt federal and state approvals of the development proposal, the Oneida Nation estimates that construction of the casino would begin as early as this fall, with a proposed opening date of June 15, 1996. The casino would employ more than 2,500 people, according to the Oneida Nation. Construction of a casino by the Oneidas in the Catskills on what is currently nonreservation land is made possible under the Federal Indian Gaming Regulatory Act of 1988, which provides that a federally recognized Indian nation may acquire off-reservation land within the state in which it is located and convert that land for the purpose of operating a casino. The nation must first request, however, that the U.S. Secretary of the Interior accept such land into trust for the benefit of the nation. The concurrence of New York Governor George Pataki would then be required on such trust status land. Several local groups yesterday pledged their support in petitioning the trust land request.

GO FOR GIN RETURNS SATURDAY Last year's Kentucky Derby winner Go For Gin (Cormorant) has been entered in Saturday's tenth race at Gulfstream Park, a six-and-a-half furlong allowance for fourvear-olds and up with a purse value of \$44,000. Jockey Jerry Bailey, who last rode the four-year-old to a second-place finish in the GI Wood Memorial in April, has been named to ride. Among the bay colt's six challengers are Grade I winner Virginia Rapids (Riverman) and stakes-winners Ponche (Two Punch), Premier Angel (Premiership) and Crafty Chris (Crafty Prospector). Go For Gin has not visited the winners' circle in six tries since his triumph in the Run For The Roses. In his most recent race, the Nov. 5 Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs, he finished eighth.

KISSIN KRIS TREATED FOR ULCERS Kissin

Kris (Kris S.) has left the Gulfstream Park grounds to be treated for ulcers. The five-year-old horse suffered from ulcers in the middle of his three-yearold year, but responded to treatment and went on to finish third in the 1993 Breeders' Cup Classic. However, the GI Haskell victor went winless as a four-year-old and trainer David Bell had become frustrated with the Florida-bred's dismal performances. "It is a kind of relief to find a good excuse for him," said Bell. "We scoped his stomach and they were pretty bad. They have a new medication to use on him." Kissin Kris is in Kentucky at Dr. Bob Copelan's farm. "They will scope him again in 30 days," Bell added. "If he doesn't respond to the new treatment, he will probably be retired." Kissin Kris has notched four victories from 29 career starts for earnings of \$1,497,436.

FRENCH JOCKEYS IN COURT Several of France's top jockeys went on trial yesterday, accused of dealing in and using narcotics. According to Associated Press reports, jockey Domingue Boeuf, arrested last summer on the charges, told the court that the stress of keeping his weight down led him to use drugs. "We had problems of weight, stress and diet," said Boeuf. "It was an efficient way to cut hunger." The drugs in question: heroin and cocaine. Boeuf, winner of the Golden Whip as France's top apprentice in 1993, said he had become addicted. Boeuf and rider William Mongil were suspended by the French Jockey Club last summer as a result of the charges. Boeuf has had his license reinstated, but is undergoing drug testing. Mandatory random drug testing was instituted by French racing officials eight months ago. According to the AP, Eric Saint-Martin, the son of top rider Yves Saint-Martin, had denied the charges against him.
