NY GOVERNOR OPPOSES CASINO Aides to New York Governor George Pataki reiterated the governor's opposition to the proposed Monticello casino in a report in yesterday's *New York Times*. According to the Times, Republican legislators close to the Governor also said they would try to block the Oneida Indian Nation from building the casino in the Catskill region, arguing that it would enrich the Indians, but not the state. "I don't think it's in the public's best interest to have the Indians all becoming multimillionaires within the state's borders when the state receives practically no revenue," Senate majority leader Joseph L. Bruno told the Times.

AMERICAN DAY SIDELINED Golden Eagle Farm's **American Day** (Nureyev), who had been expected to run in Saturday's San Rafael S. at Santa Anita, will be sidelined for several months, trainer Richard Mandella said Thursday. "He's got some minor problems," Mandella said. "We'll pass for now and wait for Del Mar." A half-brother to MGI winner Best Pal, American Day broke his maiden over the Hollywood turf by 13 lengths last December, then finished third in the GIII El Camino Real in his stakes debut Jan. 14. In his last start over Santa Anita's main track Feb. 1, the colt took a one-mile allowance by seven-and-a-half lengths.

GOLDEN EAGLE RUNNERS GEAR UP FOR BIG 'CAP **Dramatic Gold** (Slew o' Gold) and **Best Pal** (*Habitony), who will run coupled as a Golden Eagle Farm-owned entry in the \$1 million Santa Anita H. March 11, both worked over Santa Anita's fast main track yesterday. Best Pal went six furlongs in 1:12 for trainer Richard Mandella, while Dramatic Gold travelled a mile in 1:38 2/5 under the supervision of trainer David Hofmans. "He finished up strong," said Hofmans of Dramatic Gold. "I'm very, very happy with where we are at this point in time. We'll come back and blow him out next week, probably Wednesday, and that'll be it." Trainer Paco Gonzalez said **Del Mar Dennis** (Dixieland Band) did not bleed in Wednesday's :59 4/5 work, adding the decision on whether to run in the Big 'Cap is now in the hands of owners John Toffan and Trudy McCaffery.

FLORIDA DERBY NOTES **Oliver's Twist**

(Horatius) breezed seven furlongs in 1:43 yesterday at Gulfstream and is on target for the GI \$500,000 Florida Derby March 11. A winner of three of five career starts, including the Maryland Juvenile Champion S. and the Rollicking S. at Laurel, Oliver's Twist bled in his last start, the Feb. 18 Fountain of Youth, in which he finished fifth. The Maryland-bred was treated with Lasix for the first time yesterday morning. "The purpose of the work was to make sure he realized he could go through the wall and run in the stretch without bleeding," said trainer Bill Boniface. "He was full of run at the finish. The time wasn't fast, but it wasn't supposed to be. He'll breeze one more time before the Florida Derby." Trainer Allen Jerkens will saddle **King's Fiction** (Believe The Queen) in the Florida Derby. "If he fires his big race, he'll get a part of it and that would mean so much," said Jerkens. The gray colt won the Mac Diarmida S. at Gulfstream two starts back, but was off the board in the Lord Avie S. in his last. "I hope it was the off track that caused him to run that way," noted Jerkens. Agent Fred Aime confirmed Thursday that Pat Day will travel to Florida to ride **Flicht** (Demons Begone). The Loblolly Stable runner, second in the GII Saratoga Special last August, took a Gulfstream allowance by 4 3/4-lengths in his last start Feb. 15.

HORSE OWNER'S DISAPPEARANCE

SOLVED? Richard Bailey, a 65-year-old Chicagoan, has been accused of soliciting the murder of candy heiress and Thoroughbred owner Helen Vorhees Brach, who disappeared in 1977 and was declared dead seven years later. Her body was never found. Bailey has confessed to U.S. District Judge Milton Shadur that he wined and dined lonely women to gain her confidence, then sold her worthless show horses at exorbitant prices, but he denies the charge that he defrauded Mrs. Brach and solicited her murder after she threatened to tell the D.A. Bailey's case is part of the federal probe into the killing of show horses for insurance money; last summer, 19 show horse trainers, owners and veterinarians were indicted in horse killing schemes, while Bailey and three others were charged in horse selling scams. Assistant U.S. district attorney Steve Miller and co-prosecutor Ronald Safer will make their case regarding the Brach disappearance before Judge Shadur beginning May 22. Federal prosecutors say they have an undisclosed witness who purports to have been offered \$5,000 to kill Brach. Bailey, who frequently visited the old Arlington Park with Mrs. Brach, admits to romancing 11 other women over a 20-year period beginning in the 1970's, routinely cheating them out of hundreds of thousands of dollars through the sale of worthless horses, overpriced boarding fees and bogus loans.

BANDERA DOWNS OPENS SATURDAY Opening day for Bandera Downs' sixth season is scheduled for Saturday, March 4. Quarter Horse, Thoroughbred and Arabian racing runs every Saturday, Sunday and holiday Monday at the Texas track from March 4 through August 20, along with simulcasting on a Wednesday through Sunday basis. Gates will open at 11:30 a.m., with post time at 1:15 p.m.

BEN NEVIS PUT DOWN According to a report in Thursday's *Baltimore Sun*, ***Ben Nevis 2nd** (Casmiri {GB}) was humanely destroyed Sunday after a severe bout of colic. The 27-year-old was one of only two American-owned and ridden horses to win England's Grand National steeplechase, accomplishing the feat in 1980. He had lived since retirement at the Maryland farm of trainer Charlie Fenwick Jr., who rode the gelding to his 20-length triumph 15 years ago.

RIVER DOWNS GETS NEW RACE CALLER

Sean Beirne has been selected as the new race caller for River Downs in Cincinnati, it was announced Tuesday. Beirne replaces veteran announcer Kevin Goemmer, who has relocated his talents to Chicago's Thoroughbred tracks. "There was no need for an audition tape in Sean's case," said River Downs' General Manager Jack Hanessian. "We've been listening to him for two years now as Kevin's backup. They have different styles, but Sean is clear and concise and his selection is a smooth transition."
