

NYRA ANNOUNCES 1995 STAKES SCHEDULE

The Board of Trustees of the New York Racing Association yesterday approved the 1995 stakes schedule for the Belmont Park Spring, Saratoga and Belmont Park Fall meets. Spread over the three meets will be 124 stakes, including 83 graded events and 33 Grade I stakes. The NYRA schedule is valued at more than \$17.75 million. In addition, racing's \$10 million day, the Breeders' Cup, will be held at Belmont Park Saturday, Oct. 28, bringing total stakes money for the three meets to \$27.75 million. "It's going to be a great year of racing in New York," said Terry Meyocks, director of racing for the NYRA. "When you add on the Breeders' Cup to all of our other top class events, it will make for a great year for racing fans in general and New York in particular." The centerpiece of the Belmont Spring Meet remains the Belmont Stakes, which will be run for the 127th time Saturday, June 10. Some of the Triple Crown contestants are likely to surface again in Saratoga's signature fixture, the 126th running of the Travers S. Saturday, August 19. The Belmont Fall meet will feature six Grade I stakes Super Saturday, September 16, as well as six more graded stakes Breeders' Cup Preview Day, Saturday, October 7.

BARRETTS FIRST SESSION STRONG Japanese owner Hiroshi Fujita came away from Tuesday's opening session of the Barretts March Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale with the top priced filly and colt, setting American records for the highestpriced sophomores ever purchased at a two-yearolds in training sale. Fujita paid \$900,000 for a bay colt by Danzig out of G1 Prix de Diane winner Lady In Silver (Silver Hawk). The colt, sold by Jerry Bailey, agent, had been through the ring before; at the 1994 Keeneland July Yearling Sale, he brought \$300,000. Fujita also paid \$750,000 for a filly by Seeking the Gold--Canoodling, by Cyane, consigned by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds, who had purchased the filly for \$65,000 at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale. A total of 106 head passed through the ring Tuesday, bringing a gross of \$15,337,000. The average price of \$144,689 was up 25.8% from last year's \$114,979. The median of \$95,000 was up 22.5% from last year.

Saturday, Santa Anita:

SANTA ANITA H.-GI, \$1,000,000, 4yo/up, 1 1/4m Two new prospects have joined the Big 'Cap picture--Puzar (Herat) and Numerous (Mr. Prospector)--while one old prospect has reemerged: Gll San Pasqual winner Del Mar Dennis (Dixieland Band). Trainer Paco Gonzalez, who said Tuesday that Del Mar Dennis would miss the race because he was unable to get a work in over a fast track, breezed the gelding a halfmile in :47 2/5 yesterday over Santa Anita's "good" main surface. "He went really good," said Gonzalez. "I was looking for :48, but Sal (exercise rider Sal Gonzalez Sr.) said he felt strong, so it was just right. As of now, we plan to run." Chris Antley has the mount. Gary Jones, who trains four-year-old Puzar for owner Allen Paulson and the Prestonwood Farm Inc., said he would consult with the owners late Wednesday morning before deciding whether to enter. Puzar took his last start, a 1 1/16-mile Santa Anita allowance, by five lengths Jan. 1. Charlie Whittingham, who has won more Santa Anita Handicaps--nine--than any other trainer, said he plans to enter GSW Numerous, then hope for an off-track. Agent Vince DeGregory said Goncalino Almeida has been engaged to ride Numerous, who was assigned 113 pounds. Best Pal (*Habitony) went a half-mile in a bullet :46 4/5 yesterday, while Strub S. winner Dare and Go (Alydar) was caught in :49 2/5 breezing. Also working a half-mile was Urgent Request (IRE) (Rainbow Quest), who was clocked in :49 4/5.

ORCHID H.-GII, \$200,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/2mT Six-year-old Market Booster (Green Dancer), a graded stakes-winner in the U.S., Ireland and Germany, breezed a half-mile over a sloppy Gulfstream track yesterday in :49 4/5. "She is doing well," said Todd Pletcher, assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "Her last race should set her up well for the Orchid." Market Booster returned from a two-month layoff to finish fourth in Feb. 19 The Very One H. in her last outing. Pat Day has the call. Two Allen Jerkenstrainees prepped for the Orchid H. at Gulfstream vesterday: multiple stakes-placed Petiteness (Chief's Crown) breezed three furlongs in :38, while My Charmer H. winner Caress (Storm Cat) went five furlongs in 1:04. Exchange (Explodent), who returned from a three-month hiatus to finish third in the GII Buena Vista H. at Santa Anita Feb. 25, arrived at Gulfstream from her Santa Anita base yesterday. "She's just enjoying herself on the beach," said trainer Bill Spawr. Laffit Pincay Jr. will travel to Florida for the mount.

QUEENS COURT QUEEN INJURED Alex G. Campbell Jr.'s Queens Court Queen (Lyphard) suffered an injury to her left front ankle following her two-length victory in the GI Santa Margarita H. Feb. 26, trainer Ron McAnally reported Wednesday morning. "It's just a little filling in her ankle," McAnally said. "I just spoke with Mr. Campbell

and he is sending one of his vets from Kentucky to scan her and see if there is any problem." The sixyear-old mare, winner of her last three starts, all graded stakes at Santa Anita, was being pointed to the April 21 Apple Blossom H. at Oaklawn when the injury was discovered. WALLENDA TO DIXIANA Dogwood Stables Grade I stakes-winning millionaire Wallenda (Gulch) will stand the 1995 stud season at Dixiana Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, it was announced yesterday by Dogwood President Cot Campbell. "Wallenda is expected to enter stud service in early April," said Campbell. "Because of his late start into the breeding season, he will stand this year for an introductory stud fee of \$5,000." A five-year-old out of the Argentine champion mare So Glad (Liloy), Wallenda earned \$1,205,929 in a career which included stakes wins at two, three and four. He was recently retired with a tendon injury.

BOUTIN STRING TO SPLIT Francois Boutin's stable looks set to split into small groups following the world-renowned French trainer's death. Pascal Bary and Nicolas Clement, both of whom served as assistants to Boutin, will receive horses from Boutin's yard. Bary is to take those owned by Khalid Abdullah, while the Skymarc Farm contingent will be split between Bary and Clement, who is also believed to be taking 10 of Pierre Rossier's team. Criquette Head has already taken charge of eight Boutin horses owned by Gerry Oldham, so the only significant group still to be dispersed belongs to Stavros Niarchos. Boutin died last month at the age of 58 after a long battle with cancer.

WAGON MASTER TO STUD IN CHILE Wagon Master (FR) (Rainbow Quest), winner of the G2 Princess of Wales S., G3 Bonusprint September S. and G3 Cumberland Lodge S. in England last year, has been sold to stand as a stallion in Chile. The fiveyear-old, who posted five wins from 11 career starts for earnings of \$243,033, was forced into retirement following a tendon injury last fall. Angus Gold, racing manager for Wagon Master's former owner Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum, said, "He goes to Chile subject to passing the usual vets tests. He was a nice horse and it's bad luck he broke down because we had hoped he'd be an Arc contender this year."

"BABE RUTH" HITS THE TRACK The name "Babe Ruth" has been granted a strapping, two-yearold colt by Unbridled, announced Dogwood Stable, owner of the colt. This year is the 100th birthday of Babe Ruth, "We had to get special permission from Curtis Management, which controls rights to the name of the legendary New York Yankee slugger," said W. Cothran (Cot) Campbell, Dogwood president. "We think the name is perfect. Our colt is big (16.2 hands), rough, and certainly everything about Babe Ruth was 'unbridled'". The chestnut colt, out of the stakes-winning mare Chateau Dancer, was purchased for \$100,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida Selected Two-Year-Old Sale at Calder Feb. 28. He will be trained in New York by Frank Alexander and is expected to make his debut this summer at Saratoga.

Local News, Santa Anita:

Trainer Dick Mandella sent undefeated MGSW Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms) a mile in a bullet 1:38 1/5 breezing over Santa Anita's "good" main track yesterday. "He made the track look fast," Mandella commented. Owner/trainer Craig Lewis said GII San Rafael winner Larry the Legend (Local Talent) will have the Kentucky Derby as his next major goal. "We're pointing for one more race before the Big Show," said Lewis yesterday. "He'll either run next in the Santa Anita Derby (April 8) or the Jim Beam (April 1 at Turfway Park). If he runs the way we hope he will, he'll end up running in Kentucky."

Trainer Bruce Headley said nine-year-old **Softshoe Sure Shot** (Bolger), winner of the GII San Carlos H. in his last start Jan. 14, has been sidelined with a slight ankle strain. "It's cooled out now, but that was a tough race on him, beating all those big boys," said Headley. "I'm giving him a little rest off that."

Trainer Ron Ellis said GI Santa Monica H. winner Key Phrase (Flying Paster) has "a little swelling in her (left front) ankle, so I'm not going to push her and we're going to give her a little time off. We've Xrayed it and it's fairly clean, but she's got a small frame and I don't want it to become anything major." Ellis expects the four-year-old filly to be sidelined for six weeks, and hopes to have her back at Del Mar.

David Hofmans said he'll run MSW **Cat's Cradle** (Flying Paster) in the Santa Anita Oaks Sunday and not in a classified turf allowance Friday. In her last start Feb. 19, Cat's Cradle finished second to **Serena's Song** (Rahy) in the GI Las Virgenes S.

Hishi Amazon (Theatrical {IRE}), the world's richest filly or mare with earnings of about \$4.8 million, arrived safely at trainer Dick Mandella's barn Saturday. "She shipped excellent, no problem," said Dent Caton, who will train Hishi Amazon up to the GI Santa Ana H. March 18. "She was in the quarantine station (at Hollywood Park) and was very lonely. She likes other horses. She was very happy when she got here. She settled right in and ate up all her grain." Caton said Japanese jockey Eiji Nakadate, who has already ridden at Santa Anita this meet, will return to ride Hishi Amazon in the Santa Ana.
