UNBRIDLED COLT BRINGS \$1.4 MILLION AT BARRETT'S

A gray or roan colt by Unbridled--Trolley Song (Caro {IRE}) brought a world-record \$1,400,000 for a juvenile purchased at a two-year-olds in training sale during Wednesday night's second and final session of Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training. The colt, consigned to the Pomona, California sale by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent, was purchased by Hiroshi Fujita, who was also the top bidder on Tuesday's two highest-priced individuals. The Unbridled colt had been previously sold at last August's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sale, where he brought \$200,000. Fujita was the sale's top buyer, investing in seven head for a total of \$3,765,000. Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent, ranked as top consignor, selling six two-year-olds for \$3,140,000. Overall, 161 juveniles were sold during the two-day event for a gross of \$22,548,000 and an average of \$140,050, up 21.8 percent from last year's average of \$114,979. The median price of \$90,000 represented a 16.1 percent increase from the 1994 median of \$77,500. There were 113 individuals reported as unsold.

ELTISH TO MISS EPSOM FOR KENTUCKY

Eltish (Cox's Ridge) rated Europe's fifth-best two-year-old following his second-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile last November, will definitely miss the Epsom Derby and be trained instead for a shot at the May 6 Kentucky Derby, according to Khalid Abdullah's racing manager Grant Pritchard-Gordon. Eltish was not among Epsom's final entries yesterday morning. "His mother is by a sprinter (Danzig) and it's been decided he will be better suited by the shorter trip in Kentucky," said Pritchard-Gordon. Seven names were added to the list yesterday at a cost of 6,000 pounds at yesterday's final deadline. Most significant among the group were current favorite **Celtic Swing** (Damister), three-for-three in 1994, including the G1 Racing Post Trophy, and Sheikh Mohammed's filly **Moonshell** (Sadler's Wells), who dominates the betting for this season's distaff Classics, but could tackle the colts.

"We worked in the slop because we were just looking for a very easy half," said trainer Billy Badgett. "It was more or less a maintenance work. I was very pleased. NEW ORLEANS H.-GIII, \$200,000, 4yo/up, 1 1/8m
Trainer Richard Small said yesterday he plans to start two horses in the New Orleans H.--Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Concern** (Broad Brush) and three-time stakes-winner **Sticks and Bricks** (Broad Brush). The presence of Sticks and Bricks, according to Small, is to ensure a fast pace. Four-year-old Concern breezed a half-mile in 1:02 3/5 at Fair Grounds Tuesday. Small said he'll likely give the Maryland-bred a three-furlong blowout either Saturday or Sunday morning before the race. Other definites for the Grade III event are MSW **Fly Cry** (On to Glory), GIII winner **Adhocracy** (Spend a Buck) and GSP **All Gone** (Fappiano). Considered possible for the race are **Finder's Wish** (Derby Wish), **Tossofthecoin** (Magisterial), **Cool Quaker** (It's Freezing), **Hill Pass** (Temperence Hill) and **Ask Amulio** (Ask Muhammad).

TANK'S PROSPECT DEAD AT 13 According to a report in the *Daily Racing Form*, 1985 Preakness winner **Tank's Prospect** (Mr. Prospector) died of an aneurysm at Venture Farms in Aubrey, Texas March 2. The 13-year-old stallion had covered 18 mares this season; his first six crops have produced 11 stakes winners and earned over \$4.8 million through 1994.

GODOLPHIN EYES AMERICA Sheikh Mohammed's Dubai-based Godolphin operation is set to target America's top races following a declaration by the U.S. Department of Agriculture that the United Arab Emirates are free of African horse sickness. The USDA's decision takes effect next year and will allow horses trained in Dubai to compete in the U.S. without having to undergo the present 90-day quarantine period. "There are some very valuable races in the States during the early part of the year," said Simon Crisford, manager of the Godolphin operation, "and we would be very keen to look at programs for those horses which come to Dubai for the English winter."

DIAZO'S STUD FEE ANNOUNCED Mr. and Mrs. Ben P. Walden Jr.'s Vinery announced yesterday that its newly-acquired stallion **Diazo** (Jade Hunter) will stand for a 1995 fee of \$4,000 Live Foal. "We've resisted temptation and held Diazo's fee at \$4,000," said Ben Walden Jr. "**Stuka** (Jade Hunter) is virtually sold out at this level and the support for Diazo has been equally strong, even though he just arrived and won't start breeding until March 20. What we're seeing is a very positive response to two dynamic athletes from Allen Paulson's breeding and racing program." Five-year-old Diazo won six of 13 career starts, including the GI Strub S. and GI Pegasus H., for earnings of \$581,399.

MAUD FRANK KILLED New York-based owner/trainer Maud Frank, 39, and her three-year-old daughter, Maud Ellen, were killed at 8:15 p.m. Wednesday; the pair were walking across Harriett's Bluff Road in Woodbine, Georgia when they were struck by a car. Frank was returning to New York from Ocala, Florida, when she pulled off an exit on Interstate 95, apparently to make a stop at a convenience store. No charges have been brought against the driver of the car, who said he was blinded by the oncoming traffic. An investigation is ongoing. Frank's farm, The Manor, in Suffolk County, New York, was ravaged by a massive fire Dec. 27, 1993.

CHARLES TOWN'S LIVE RACING SEASON BEGINS TONIGHT

The Charles Town Races in West Virginia will commence its 1995 live racing season tonight. Post time for the nine-race card is 7:15 p.m. "The response to our expanded simulcasting, which we began Feb. 24, has exceeded our expectations and we're hoping the return of live racing will meet with similar enthusiasm," said track President D. Keith Wagner. Mutuel Manager Steve Yeatras added, "We've been averaging over \$100,000 a day in simulcast handle. Once we get some of our logistical problems sorted out, I think that figure could go higher." Charles Town will begin its 1995 season with racing on Friday and Saturday nights, and plans to add Wednesday night and Sunday afternoon cards beginning March 22.
