#### NEW TAKEOUT STRUCTURE IN NY?

According to a report in Monday's New York Daily News, the New York Racing Association, the New York division of the HBPA and groups representing local breeders are backing a proposed bill that would effectively raise the takeout in New York. While the takeout on straight bets--win, place and show--would decrease from 17% to 15% under the proposal, the take on multiple wagers--exactas, daily doubles and quinellas--would increase from 17% to 19%. Because over twice as much money is traditionally bet on multiples than straight bets. the move would result in a higher tax on gamblers. Based on 1993 figures, the *Daily News* estimated the change would mean an additional \$17 million to be applied toward purses, track improvements, breeding funds and other areas. Because most key facets of the industry are behind the bill, it is expected to pass. "This industry needs help," said NYRA GM/President Kenny Noe. "There were only 900-some foals in this state last year and states with strong breeding programs are the ones that survive. We all know that we need to get new owners into the game and we hope that can happen with better purses. Our facilities haven't been improved in three-and-a-half years and we need money for that."

#### FARMA WAY'S FIRST STARTER A WINNER

Grant Road (Farma Way), the first starter from the first crop by Farma Way, won his debut March 9, taking a division of the Jean Lafitte Futurity Trial at Delta Downs. The two-year-old, owned and bred by Dreabon Copeland, finished the four-furlong event a length ahead of the field, paying \$13.60. An ACRS champ and winner of more than \$2 million, Farma Way stands at Vinery, near Midway, Kentucky.

#### LAST WEEK ON THE TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL

Thunder Gulch (Gulch) placed himself firmly if narrowly on top of the list of eastern contenders with his nose victory over arch-rival Suave Prospect (Fortunate Prospect). Said trainer D. Wayne Lukas of his colt's second consecutive photo-finish win, "He is never going to win off by himself. That is a habit I have seen in him in the mornings. As long as he keeps getting there by a head or a half, it is okay. This horse is an overachiever. He seems better all the time. He is going to get a mile and a guarter because he doesn't have any quit in him." Caught up in the rivalry, trainer Nick Zito is looking forward to sending out the runner-up for another confrontation in the Blue Grass S. April 15. "(Suave Prospect) hasn't run a bad race. When he gets to Kentucky, I look for him to improve. We're heading in the right direction." Zito has won two of the last four Kentucky Derbies, with Strike the Gold in 1991 and Go For Gin in 1994.

While Lukas has two of the top male contenders for the Triple Crown in Thunder Gulch and Timber Country, he may also send the filly **Serena's Song** (Rahy) into the fray, at least for one race. The game miss picked up another Grade I victory over the weekend, taking the Santa Anita Oaks by a head over the promising **Urbane** (Citidancer). Lukas has mentioned the Jim Beam S. at Turfway as a possible next start for the gutsy bay; she has taken on the colts before, finishing second by a half-length to Mr Purple in the Gll Hollywood Juvenile Championship last year.

## THIS WEEKS TRIPLE CROWN PREPS Sunday, Santa Anita

SAN FELIPE S.-GII, \$200,000a, 3yo, 8.5f

The best in the west will meet in what could end up a match race between the defending Eclipse champ Timber Country (Woodman) and the early Kentucky Derby favorite Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms). Timber Country looks to bounce back from a third-place finish in the San Rafael S., his three-year-old debut. The undefeated Afternoon Deelites, winner of the San Vicente Breeders' Cup S. last time out, is scheduled to breeze Wednesday. Undefeated Petionville (Seeking the Gold), who had been considered definite, is now on the fence. "We're going to enter, take a look and go from there," said his trainer, Randy Bradshaw. "We've got a lot of options."

Trainer Neil Drysdale may ship French Deputy (Deputy Minister) east for the race. The colt, unbeaten in three starts, trounced a field of allowance runners by 11 lengths at Santa Anita in his most recent start; he would be making his stakes debut. Expected from the West Coats are GSW On Target (Forty Niner), fourth in the San Vicente in his first start of '95, and In Character (GB) (Never So Bold {Ire}); the European import was second to Larry The Legend in the Santa Catalina S. in his only U.S. outing. Said his trainer Bruce Jackson, "I think the further he goes, the better." The winners of both divisions of the Risen Star S. at the Fair Grounds will be back Sunday: Knockadoon (Dixieland Band) is unbeaten in three career starts; Beaver's Nose (Demons Begone), with two Louisiana stakes wins to his credit, has been on the board in 10 of 11 lifetime. Out of the race is Tejano Run (Tejano), who will head for Turfway Park and the Jim Beam S, April 1.

Devil's Brew (Devil's Bag), winner of the Whirlaway S. at Aqueduct, heads the prospective field of nine. Also expected are Car Dealer (Carborundum), winner of the Crescent Springs S. in his lone '95 start; Silver Leader (Mr. Leader), winner of the John Battaglia prep; and In Full Control (Lost Opportunity), third in the Crescent City after a 10-length allowance win.
