SPORTSMAN'S SIMULCASTS STOPPED Re-

sponding to Balmoral Park's protest, the Illinois Racing Board has withdrawn permission for Sportsman's Park to simulcast its programs to the Churchill Downs Sports Spectrum in Merrillville, Indiana. Balmoral, which is 20 miles from Merrillville, based its protest on the Federal Interstate Horseracing Act, which requires any facility taking bets on simulcasts to receive permission from tracks conducting live racing within a 60-mile radius. Permission was not given by Balmoral, which conducts year-round harness racing on a limited basis. Currently, the track offers Sunday evening, Tuesday afternoon and Friday and Saturday night programs. The Merrillville facility opened Jan. 25, offering full-card simulcasts from four Thoroughbred and three harness tracks. When Sportsman's opened the Chicago Thoroughbred season Feb. 17, it became part of the betting smorgasbord. While Balmoral's intertrack wagering has since declined 47% compared to the same days last year, racing board chairman Gary Starkman suggested the reason for the decline wasn't the Sportsman's simulcast at Merrillville, but rather the availability of full-card simulcasting at the Indiana parlor. Full-card simulcasting is illegal in Illinois, and Starkman urged the state legislature to amend the racing statute to permit it.

OUEENS COURT OUEEN RETIRED Alex G.

Campbell's Queens Court Queen (Lyphard), winner of all three of her 1995 starts, the GII San Gorgonio H., GI Santa Maria H. and the GI Santa Margarita Invitational H., has been retired due to a leg injury suffered in the Feb. 26 Santa Margarita. "She left (California) Tuesday and will be bred to either Seeking the Gold or Irish River," trainer Ron McAnally said yesterday. Queens Court Queen will take up residence at Forest Retreat in Lexington, Ky. The six-year-old mare retires with 10 victories in 30 career starts for earnings of \$808,050.

Sunday, Santa Anita Park:

SAN FELIPE S.-GII, \$200,000a, 3yo, 1 1/16m Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms) and Timber Country (Woodman) continue toward their Sunday showdown, both colts working smartly the past few days. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas sent Breeders' Cup Juvenile champion Timber Country five furlongs over Santa Anita's fast main track Monday in :59 1/5, while trainer Richard Mandella watched his undefeated Afternoon Deelites breeze five furlongs in :59 4/5 under jockey Kent Desormeaux Tuesday. Lukas has stated the speedy Afternoon Deelites would have a decided advantage with a short field projected for the San Felipe. "In a virtual match race, speed and turn of foot are everything," he said. "It puts us at a tremendous disadvantage. With no pressure, (Afternoon Deelites) is virtually home free." Mandella, who was at Hollywood Park Wednesday morning, said Afternoon Deelites came out of his workout in great shape. The only other possible San Felipe starters as of yesterday morning were Lake George (Vice Regent), Score Quick (Northern Score) and Zg Media (Carnivalay). Trainer Gary Lewis said he will enter GIII El Camino Real Derby winner Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}), but plans to run him in the March 25 Golden State Derby at Bay Meadows instead. Jumron worked a mile in 1:38 Tuesday at Santa Anita. "It was a real good work," Lewis said. "He went the final quarter in :24 and change."

Saturday, Turfway Park: JOHN BATTAGLIA MEMORIAL S., \$100,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m

Heading the field for Turfway's Jim Beam prep will be Devil's Brew (Devil's Bag), winner of his last two starts including the Whirlaway Breeders' Cup S. at Aqueduct Feb. 11. The Cynthia Reese-trainee arrived at Turfway Wednesday morning accompanied by stablemate Get My Glitter (Glitterman), a frontrunner expected to assure a fast pace in the John Battaglia for the late-running Devil's Brew. The likely second choice in the betting, Car Dealer (Carborundum), drilled five furlongs in :59 3/5 at Turfway Tuesday under regular rider Dean Kutz. The Marcia Lee Butlertrainee has won his last two starts, both at Turfway Park. Also expected to start are Silver Leader (Mr. Leader), Surpass (Tsunami Slew) and Sikkim (Nepal).

LOUISIANA DERBY-GIII, \$300,000, 3vo, 1 1/16m Harsh weather forecasts this week for the New Orleans area have caused trainer Neil Drysdale to cancel his plans to run undefeated French Deputy (Deputy Minister) in the Louisiana Derby. "I'm not running in the San Felipe either," said Drysdale yesterday. "I'm not certain where we'll run. Let's just say we're considering other options." In his most recent start Feb. 23 at Santa Anita, French Deputy romped by 11 lengths in a one-mile allowance.

Saturday, March 25, Aqueduct: THE GOTHAM S.-GII, \$250,000, 3yo, 1m

Trainer Leo O'Brien is planning to run an entry of GI Hopeful S. winner Wild Escapade (Wild Again) and two-time stakes-winner Ave's Flag (Personal Flag) in the Gotham. Wild Escapade arrived at Belmont Park from Aiken, South Carolina Monday. "He worked about five times down there," said O'Brien. "His last couple of works were quite good. He acts like he's matured, but you don't know how good they're doing until they run so I've entered him on Friday (in a sixfurlong \$32,000 allowance)." Trainer Michael Dickinson's undefeated Da Hoss (Gone West) will make his fifth career start in the Gotham. In his last effort at Aqueduct March 4, the Kentucky-bred romped to a three-length victory in the GIII Best Turn S. "He came out of his race well," said Dickinson. "He's stabled at Fair Hill right now. He worked seven furlongs vesterday at Laurel and went in 1:25. His next work will be Sunday (March 19) on Fair Hill's woodchip track and he'll again work seven furlongs. He'll be shipped up the morning of the Gotham."

Saturday, April 1, Turfway Park: THE JIM BEAM S.-GII, \$600,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m Trainer D. Wayne Lukas confirmed yesterday that Santa Anita Oaks winner Serena's Song (Rahy) is scheduled to take on the boys in the Jim Beam. Corey Nakatani retains the mount. San Rafael winner Larry the Legend (Local Talent) breezed a half-mile over Santa Anita's fast main track Wednesday morning in :50 1/5. Trainer Craig Lewis said the Illinoisbred will make his next start in either the Jim Beam or the Santa Anita Derby April 8.

AOUEDUCT TO TAKE FULL-CARD SIMULCASTS FROM HIALEAH Beginning this Friday with the close of the Gulfstream Park meet, simulcast action at Aqueduct will shift to Hialeah Park through March 31. Wagering at the New York track will not be merged with the Hialeah pools. There will be a live call of the first two Hialeah races daily; races three through seven and race nine will be simulcast. The eighth race at Hialeah will be a simulcast of the Aqueduct feature. Betting on the final races of the Hialeah card will be through advance wagering only.

DEL MAR RAISES 1995 STAKES PURSES With its smallest stakes purse set at \$100,000, Del Mar will present its richest schedule in 1995, offering \$4,950,000 for 24 stakes during its 43-day summer session. Topping the roster will be the \$1,000,000 Grade I Pacific Classic, scheduled for Sunday, August 13. Overall, 14 major stakes have been boosted a total of \$500,000, highlighted by a trio of races with sizeable individual increases. They are: the GII Chula Vista H. Sept. 3, raised from \$200,000 to \$300,000; the GI Del Mar Oaks August 20, raised from \$175,000 to \$250,000; and the GIII Bing Crosby H. July 30, raised from \$100,000 to \$150,000. Eleven other stakes have been increased by \$25,000 each. "I have stated before that Del Mar is a good place to be if you have a good horse," said Del Mar Thoroughbred Club President and General Manager Joseph W. Harper. "I think this new stakes schedule says that again--with an exclamation point."

HISHI AMAZON INJURED Hishi Amazon (Theatrical {IRE}), the world's richest filly or mare with earnings of over \$4.8 million, suffered a minor injury to her left front ankle Wed. morning and will miss Saturday's GI Santa Ana H. at Santa Anita. "She galloped on the main track Tuesday and was fine when she came back," said Dent Caton, who is supervising training for the Japanese-based filly during her stay in the U.S. "But she had some filling and was lame this morning in her left front. We X-rayed it and they're negative. So it looks like it's a wrench or a sprain to her ankle. Everybody's distraught at the moment, and we'll see how she is in the morning. Right now, she's scheduled to go back to Japan Tuesday."

CHAMPION USER FRIENDLY RETIRED Gary

Tanaka's 1992 Cartier European Horse of the Year User Friendly (GB) (Slip Anchor {GB}) has arrived at Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky following her retirement from racing. A champion in both England and France at three, User Friendly won eight of 15 career starts for earnings of \$1,761,393. Her five Group 1 tallies included the Gold Seal English Oaks and the Aston Upthorpe Yorkshire Oaks in England, as well as the Kildangan Stud Irish Oaks in Ireland, making her only the third filly ever to land all three Oaks. Bred in England by Stretchworth Park Stud, prospective plans are to breed the six-year-old mare to Danzig or Mr. Prospector and possibly enter her in the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale.

DEVIL NEARING DEBUT Trainer Allen Jerkens reported from his stable at Gulfstream Park yesterday that **Devil His Due** (Devil's Bag), winner of both the Gll Brooklyn and Gl Suburban Handicaps at Belmont Park in 1994, will make his 1995 debut shortly. The Hall of Fame trainer said his plan is to work the Devil a quick seven furlongs Saturday, hoping to be ready for the April 1 Westchester H. at Aqueduct. The Glll, \$100,000 Westchester will be run for three-year-olds and up at a distance of one-mile. Six-year-old Devil His Due has not raced since finishing second to Cigar in the Gl NYRA Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 26.

TOTAL '94 WAGERING UP IN MARYLAND

Total wagering in Maryland on Thoroughbred racing was an all-time record \$461 million in 1994, according to a statement released by the Maryland Jockey Club yesterday. The release cited the number of distribution points as key to the increase, with eight sites available for wagering on races from Maryland and up to five other signals, and formerly dark Wednesdays being used for simulcasting. Total income available for purses rose from \$33.3 million in 1993 to \$36.8 million in '94, but is off from the five-year high of \$39 million in 1990.

BAY MEADOWS TO HOST SPRING MEETING

For the first time in more than 30 years, Bay Meadows will host a spring meeting when it opens for 19 days of Thoroughbred racing Wednesday, March 22. The abbreviated season, packed with eight stakes, will run through Thursday, April 13. Post time is 1:15 p.m. daily except Fridays, when night racing begins at 6 p.m. The highlight of the meeting will be the inaugural running of the \$150,000 Golden State Derby for three-year-olds Saturday, March 25.
