TOP MARES RETIRED Strategic Maneuver

(Cryptoclearance), runner-up to Phone Chatter for the Eclipse Award as top two-year-old filly of 1993, has been shipped to Stone Farm in Paris, Kentucky and will be bred to Danzig within the week. The fouryear-old has not raced since finishing off the board in last year's GI Test S. at Saratoga; winner of the GI Spinaway S, and GI Matron at two, the Philip Teinowitz/Scotty Schulhofer-owned filly goes to the breeding shed with a record of five wins from 10 starts and earnings of \$414,340. Also starting her new career as a broodmare is Clement L. Hirsch's Magical Maiden (Lord Avie), who has been bred to A.P. Indy at Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. The six-year-old mare won eight races and \$901,945 in a career that included victories in the GI Hollywood Starlet and the GI Las Virgenes S., as well as a thirdplace finish in the 1992 Breeders' Cup Distaff. Prince Fahd Salman's Newgate Stud Farm reported yesterday that six-time graded stakes-winner Trampoli (Trempolino) will be bred to Lure this spring. The winner of the GII Long Island H., GII La Prevoyante and GII Orchid as well as the G3 Prix Penelope in France, six-year-old Trampoli left trainer Christophe Clement's barn at Payson Park earlier this week and has arrived at Mill Ridge Farm in Lexington, Ky. She earned \$640,575 from nine wins in 23 starts.

HISHI AMAZON'S CONDITION IMPROVES

Four-year-old Kentucky-bred Hishi Amazon (Theatrical {IRE}), the Champion Two and Three-Year-Old Filly in Japan, showed marked improvement Thursday from a strained left front ankle, which prevented her from being entered in Saturday's GI Santa Ana H. at Santa Anita. "It's immensely improved," said trainer Dent Caton. "All tests have been negative. It looks like it's just a wrench or a strain. Yesterday she was sore and lame; today she's basically walking sound." Caton said the world's richest filly or mare, with earnings of \$4,702,968, is scheduled to depart Wednesday morning for Japan. "It's been such a major effort by Mr. Abe (owner Masaichiro Abe) to do all this (bring the filly to the U.S. to race) and orchestrate it. He's gone out of his way to give something back to the United States that he's had."

"He has come back one race at a time, getting better each time. Today he got the kind of course he likes and he really ran his race." 2-1 favorite YOKOHAMA (Theatrical {IRE}) was never in contention, finishing eighth in the nine-horse field.

GOLDEN GATE ANNOUNCES CHANGES IN

SPRING SCHEDULE Golden Gate Fields has announced schedule changes for its 1995 spring meeting. Originally slated to open Friday, April 14, the spring meeting will now begin Saturday, April 15, California Derby Day. The change allows for an off day between closing day at Bay Meadows, which will conduct a 19-day meeting from March 22 to April 13, and opening day at Golden Gate. Three dates have been dropped from the original spring schedule -- Friday, April 14; Wednesday, April 26; and Wednesday, June 14. Added to the calendar are a pair of Monday dates--May 1 and June 12. The California Horse Racing Board's approval of Hollywood Park's spring schedule, which features the Monday dates that Golden Gate has added, prompted Golden Gate officials to make the changes in its own spring schedule. "Because North-South simulcasting is so popular with California racing fans, we've made these changes to align our dates with those at Hollywood Park," said Peter W. Tunney, VP and General Manager of Golden Gate Fields.

CHURCHILL REPORTS RECORD EARNINGS

Churchill Downs Inc. yesterday announced record net earnings of \$6.2 million, or \$1.63 per share, for the 12-month fiscal year which ended December 31, 1994. Churchill revenues were \$65.9 million for 1994 as compared to \$55.3 million the previous year; the 1994 figures reflect the company's first full 12month fiscal year since changing to a December 31 year-end in 1993, which resulted in an 11-month fiscal year for '93.
