PURSE INCREASE FOR SANTA ANITA

DERBY? The Santa Anita Derby could be worth considerably more than the guaranteed purse of \$500,000 when run Saturday, April 8. Santa Anita Park and the Thoroughbred Owners of California, who jointly determine purse allocations, have agreed to boost the Derby purse to \$600,000 if the field includes three winners of graded stakes at a mile or over, and to \$700,000 if it includes four or more graded stakes winners at a mile or over. This would make the Santa Anita Derby the most lucrative Kentucky Derby steppingstone. "We have an exceptionally strong crop of three-year-olds on the West Coast," said Thomas S. Robbins, vice president of racing. "We'd like to keep them at home and give fans an opportunity to see them compete against one another before the Kentucky Derby. This is a step to make a very attractive event even more appealing to owners and fans alike."

WEKIVA SPRINGS TO RUN AT KEENELAND

Donald Dizney and Jim English's Wekiva Springs (Runaway Groom) will ship to Keeneland for the \$100,000 Commonwealth Breeders' Cup S. Friday, April 14, trainer Bob Hess Jr. said. The Commonwealth is a Grade II event at seven furlongs for three-year-olds and up. Regular jockey Kent Desormeaux will ride. A winner of six of eight starts and \$382,808, Wekiva Springs hasn't raced since finishing third in the GI Strub S. Feb. 5. The four-year-old emerged from that event with a quarter crack in his right front foot.

AVERAGE UP AT OCALA There were 231 horses sold for a total of \$8,551,500 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales' Annual Open Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, held Tuesday and Wednesday in Ocala, Florida. The average price of \$37,019 for the sale's two sessions represented an 18 percent increase from last year's average of \$31,331. The sales topper was a Canadian-bred chestnut colt by Bold Ruckus-Lucy's Vixen (Lucy's Axe). Purchased for \$22,000 by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds, agent, at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale, the colt was resold Wednesday for \$150,000 to Mike Mollica, agent for Robert and Beverly Lewis.

ROYAL PALM H.-GIII, \$50,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/16mT Fox Ridge Farm's Islefaxyou (Storm Bird), winner of the GII Hall of Fame S. at Saratoga last August, will be making his first start since October, when he ran eighth in the \$150,000 Governor's Cup at Laurel. "He bled in that race," said Pat Minogue, assistant to trainer Pat Kelly. "He'll be on Lasix for the first time this Sunday." The four-year-old drilled five furlongs in :59 at Hialeah Tuesday. Dinner in Rio (State Dinner), winner of three stakes last year including the GIII Seneca H. at Saratoga, is also pointing for the Royal Palm, as is Burk Kessinger-trainee Secret Fan (Lear Fan). "We're trying to see whether he's a stakes horse or not," Kessinger said of the five-year-old. "I just got the horse two starts back so we're trying to see what we have."

GOTHAM S.-GII, \$250,000, 3vo, 1m Undefeated in three starts at Turf Paradise, Da Hoss (Gone West) came to Aqueduct and made it look easy in the March 4 Best Turn S. (GIII), drawing away to win the six-furlong contest by three. "Our big concern was with how he would handle the track, so we were very gratified by how well he did," said trainer Michael Dickinson. "We're very confident about the mile for him. He's bred for stamina." Da Hoss will arrive from Fair Hill, Maryland Saturday morning. Devious Course (Crafty Prospector) breezed a halfmile at Aqueduct Tuesday in :48 4/5. The Jimmy Bond-trainee, who took the GIII Nashua S. at Aqueduct last November, finished second to Mr. Greeley in the GIII Swale S. at Gulfstream in his three-year-old debut March 11. Roger Attfield-trainee Talkin Man (With Approval), last year's Champion Two-Year-Old Colt in Canada, arrived at Belmont Park Tuesday. Mike Smith has the mount. Multiple stakes-winner Ave's Flag (Personal Flag), victorious in an Aqueduct allowance in his last, went a half-mile in :48 1/5 at Belmont Tuesday. "He'll just gallop now into the race," said trainer Leo O'Brien. Allen Jerkens will give Kings Fiction (Believe the Queen) a five-furlong breeze Thursday. If he likes what he sees, he'll run the Mac Diarmida S. winner in the Gotham. Trainer Murray Garren plans to run Larchmont (Horatius), a New York-bred gelding he claimed for \$50,000 Feb. 10. The Alfredo Calleias stable will send out El Alpino (Cognizant). A Canadian-bred, El Alpino will be making his North American debut after beginning his racing career in Panama. "He breezed three-eigths this morning and he went an easy :38 flat," said assistant trainer Bernardo Calleias yesterday. Mountain of Laws (Mt. Livermore) is considered possible for the race.

Saturday, Bay Meadows: GOLDEN STATE DERBY, \$150,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m Rain or shine, GIII El Camino Real Derby winner Jumron (GB) (Sharpo (GB)) is set to head the field in the inaugural running of the Golden State Derby. "People think he needs an off track, but he's been training extremely well on fast tracks here at Santa Anita," said trainer Gary Lewis. "He went a mile in 1:38 (March 14) and came back and worked six furlongs in 1:12 real easy Tuesday. He's doing terrific." Jumron is scheduled to ship to Bay Meadows Thursday. As of yesterday, only locals Acquitted (Defense Verdict), Funny Tale (*Habitony) and Slewker (Slewdledo) were confirmed to join Jumron in the race. Listed as a possible starter is Ed Moger-trainee Saratoga West (Saratoga Six). "If it's a real short

field, there's an outside chance we'll go in there," said Moger. Trainer Ron McAnally said **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister) will skip the race due to inclement weather and the prospect of an off track.

Saturday, April 8, Santa Anita: SANTA ANITA DERBY-GI, \$500,000, 3vo, 1 1/8m Some 72 hours after Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms) and Timber Country (Woodman) finished onetwo in Sunday's GII San Felipe S., both colts were back on track for Round Two: the Santa Anita Derby. Pedro R. Perez, owner of GII San Rafael runner-up Fandarel Dancer (Marshua's Dancer), has already committed his colt to join the top two contenders. At this early date, only two others seem likely for the GI race, the Craig Lewis owned-and-trained colts Larry the Legend (Local Talent) and Bee El Tee (Known Fact). Larry the Legend has won all three of his '95 starts including the GII San Rafael and the Santa Catalina S., while Bee El Tee took the Pirate Cove S. at Santa Anita in his turf debut March 15. "In my estimation, Bee El Tee is a dramatically improved animal," said Lewis. "Why he's gotten so good, nobody knows. But I like him a lot." Bee El Tee would have to be supplemented to the Santa Anita Derby at a cost of \$20,000. If he doesn't run there, he will be shipped to Golden Gate for the GIII California Derby on the grass April 15. As for Larry the Legend, Lewis said a possible conflict with jockev Kent Desormeaux--who is also the regular rider on Afternoon Deelites--won't weigh into his decision on where to run the colt. "Believe me, we won't have any trouble getting a rider," Lewis said. "Anyway, I'd rather have the best horse than the best rider." A longshot to run in the Santa Anita Derby is trainer Randy Bradshaw's undefeated Petionville (Seeking the Gold), who took Sunday's GIII Louisiana Derby by a neck. "I like to give him at least four weeks between races, and the Santa Anita Derby would give him only three," Bradshaw said. "On the other hand, that would set him up well for the Kentucky Derby (May 6)." The other options would be the April 15 Blue Grass S. at Keeneland or the Wood Memorial at Aqueduct the same day.

"This is great news and it represents a giant step for us," said Walden. "We are very hopeful that this pregnancy is the first of many for Furiously. It's extremely relevant that Bionic Soul became pregnant on her second cover to Furiously as opposed to her first. It might signal a shift in things." Vinery will continue with its policy of serving all mares to Furiously for 1995 on a complimentary basis.

STAR OF MANILA SIDELINED Trainer Burk Kessinger said his four-year-old turf runner Star of Manila (Manila) will be sidelined for a month or so. A hairline fracture of his right front cannon bone was found following a fifth-place finish in the GII Pan American H. at Gulfstream March 16. Star of Manila has won four stakes, including the GII W.L. McKnight H. at Calder in December, for earnings to date of \$315,322.

MARI'S SHEBA RECOVERING Jack Kent Cooke's Mari's Sheba (Mari's Book) continues to recuperate at Alamo Pintado Equine Clinic after undergoing surgery to repair a fractured right front cannon bone, trainer Eva Smithwick said. Mari's Sheba suffered the injury while finishing third to Serena's Song and Urbane in the GI Santa Anita Oaks March 12. "I've loved that filly since Day One," Smithwick said. "It breaks my heart what happened to her." Smithwick said Mari's Sheba had five titanium screws inserted into the fractured leg, and will be shipped to Elmendorf Farm in Lexington in mid-April. Smithwick added that no decision has been made whether to attempt a comeback or retire the filly.
