TOBA "OWNER OF THE MONTH" TO ALEX

CAMPBELL Alex G. Campbell, who saw his homebred mare **Queens Court Queen** (Lyphard) win a pair of Grade I races at Santa Anita last month, has been named the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association "Owner of the Month" for February. The native Kentuckian's recently retired racemare captured the GI Santa Maria H. February 5 and the GI Santa Margarita Invitational three weeks later, defeating champion Paseana in both races; her half-brother **Mr Purple** (Deputy Minister) was second to early Derby favorite Afternoon Deelites in the GIII San Vicente Breeders' Cup S. February 12. Campbell, a lifelong racing fan who attended the opening of Keeneland in 1936, currently has over 30 horses in training and a 15-member broodmare band.

FASIG-TIPTON TO HOST HOUSTON SALE

Fasig-Tipton will conduct its inaugural Preferred Yearling Sale at the Houston Polo Club on Tuesday, September 26, 1995. Yearlings will be screened for pedigree and conformation with the total number offered to be limited to the available stall space at the Polo Club. "The facilities and grounds at the Houston Polo Club, coupled with a selection process, will allow us to hold an up-market yearling sale, something that many Texas breeders and consignors have told us they are anxious to support," said T. Mason Grasty, Fasig-Tipton vice president. The deadline for nominations is May 26. Selections will take place in June and July, with the catalogue scheduled for availability in late August.

LAST WEEK ON THE TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL

Talkin Man (With Approval) gave notice that he could be a Triple Crown factor with his impressive seven-length triumph in Aqueduct's Gotham S. Saturday. It was only the second start outside of Woodbine for last year's top Canadian two-year-old, who first shipped to the U.S. for the Breeders' Cup last November, finishing 10th in the Juvenile. The Roger Attfield trainee was found to have an excuse for that performance, however, coming out of the race with a lung infection. Jockey Mike Smith, who has been aboard the colt for both U.S. starts, said of last year's disappointment, "He was running great, well in hand, and then he just completely shut down. It was a pretty serious infection...he was still having trouble breathing when they got him back to the barn." Attfield gave his champ the winter off to recover; the Gotham was his first start off the four-and-a-half month layoff. He will be back at Aqueduct for the Wood Memorial April 15.

In Northern California Saturday, Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}), the overwhelming 1-5 favorite in the inaugural Golden State Derby at Bay Meadows, made it a lot closer than his backers would have liked, besting pacesetter Slewker (Slewdledo) by threequarters of a length. "The rider (Goncalino Almeida) didn't want to say anything right after the race, but he told me later that the horse couldn't handle the track at all," said trainer Gary Lewis. "It was too dry and loose for him." The English-bred colt, who would attempt to follow Omar Khayyam (1917) and Tomy Lee (1959) as the third British-bred to win the Kentucky Derby, is most likely to make his next start in the Blue Grass S. April 15, but both the Santa Anita Derby, April 8, and the grassy California Derby, April 15 are also possible.

Plans have been set for a Japanese invasion on the Derby. **Ski Captain** (Storm Bird) is scheduled to arrive in Los Angeles April 27; he will spend two days in quarantine at Hollywood before shipping to Churchill.

Trainer Craig Lewis has decided on the Santa Anita Derby for Larry The Legend (Local Talent). Also looking to challenge Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms) and Timber Country (Woodman) are Lake George (Vice Regent) and Fandarel Dancer (Marshua's Dancer); Petionville (Seeking the Gold) is 50-50, with trainer Randy Bradshaw also considering the Blue Grass. Serena's Song (Rahy), the likely favorite for the race, worked five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 at Santa Anita yesterday. The filly, who has won her last four starts, is scheduled to fly to Kentucky Wednesday; she will stable at Churchill Downs. John Battaglia Memorial S. winner Car Dealer (Carborundum) went a sharp seven furlongs at Turfway Sunday, getting the distance in 1:24 2/5; the colt carried a total of 138 pounds for the work including jockey Dean Kutz and a saddlepad full of lead. Mecke (Maudlin), third in the Florida Derby, arrived for the race Saturday and is set to breeze Thursday. Tejano Run (Tejano), who was suffering from a lung infection when he finished fifth in the Risen Star S. to start his '95 campaign, had his final tune-up Saturday, going seven furlongs in 1:25 2/5. "He's been scoped after his last two breezes and he's scoped clean," said his trainer, Kenneth McPeek. Also expected are Battaglia runner-up Sikkim (Nepal), Devil's Brew (Devil's Bag), Mighty Magee (Cormorant) and Celestial Star (Risen Star).

Saturday, Hialeah

FLAMINGO S.-GIII, \$200,000, 9f

Probable favorite Flitch (Demons Begone) had his final prep for the race Monday, going five furlongs in :59 4/5 at Hialeah. "He took to the track well," said trainer Billy Badgett of his charge, who finished fourth in the Florida Derby last out. Also pointing for the race is Pyramid Peak (Mt. Livermore), who was third in the Swale S. in his latest. "He was a little lackadaisical at the start and that cost him," said trainer John Ward of the effort. "He likes to run freely on the front end; he got in a little trouble last time." The colt tries two turns for the first time Saturday. There are two possible supplemental entries for the race; the connections of Casperoo (Silver Buck) and Sea Emperor (Naked Sky), one-two respectively in the OBS Championship S. March 20, would have to put up \$10,000 apiece to run. Run Daddy Run (Silver Buck) is now doubtful for the race; a winner of his last three starts, he was claimed for \$25,000 earlier this year. "It is just too much of a step up in class," said Jeff Siegel of Team Valor, who races the colt.

REBEL S.-GIII, \$125,000, 8.5f

With the probable defection of French Deputy (Deputy Minister), locally based Mystery Storm (Storm Bird) heads the field. The frontrunner has won all three starts this year, most recently taking the GIII Southwest S. at a mile in his stakes debut March 11. Rich Man's Gold (Forty Niner), owned by country singer Reba McEntyre, makes his first foray into stakes company. The Kentucky-bred has won two of his three starts and finished second by just a nose in an Oaklawn allowance race at this distance March 3.
