KEENELAND TO SIMULCAST KENTUCKY

DERBY It's official: for the first time in history, Keeneland Race Course will simulcast the Kentucky Derby. All 10 races on the May 6 card at Churchill Downs will be simulcast by the Lexington track. Keeneland will open its gates at 10:30 a.m., with the first race to be run at 11:30 a.m. Post time for the Run For The Roses is scheduled for 5:31 p.m. In addition to the Derby, Keeneland will also simulcast the Kentucky Oaks card May 5 from Churchill Downs. This will mark the second year Keeneland has simulcast the Oaks.

CURTIS MANAGEMENT GROUP TO HANDLE

SECRETARIAT RIGHTS Curtis Management Group of Indianapolis has been assigned to market the image, likeness and name of Secretariat (Bold Ruler). The Indiana company, which selectively markets and protects more than 200 of the best-known licensed names, including those of Babe Ruth, James Dean and Greta Garbo, will represent Secretariat's owners in licensing the name on behalf of the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation, which benefits from the sale of licensed Secretariat merchandise. Rights to Secretariat's image were assigned by his owners to benefit the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation, the nation's largest source of private funding for research on issues relating to the health and safety of horses, in December 1989. "We are delighted to have the services of Curtis Management Group promoting Secretariat," said Edward L. Bowen, president of the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation. "While our past efforts to utilize the resource given to us by Secretariat's owners have been successful, having Curtis manage the property creates a vastly increased potential for revenue on behalf of equine research." Secretariat, Horse of the Year in 1972 and 1973, won the 1973 Triple Crown. He died October 4, 1989 at the age of 19.

Saturday, April 8, Santa Anita:

SANTA ANITA DERBY-GI, \$700,000, 3vo, 1 1/8m Saturday's \$150,000 Golden State Derby winner Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}) is definite to run in the Santa Anita Derby, trainer Gary Lewis said yesterday. The addition of Jumron means the event will now be worth \$700,000. That's based on a guaranteed purse of \$500,000, plus an additional \$200,000 if the field has four graded stakes winners at a mile or over. Currently, there are four confirmed for the race who meet this criteria: Jumron, Larry the Legend, Timber Country and Afternoon Deelites. Lewis said the decision to run Jumron at Santa Anita was based on track surface. "The timing is good, but the main thing is the track surface," said Lewis. "He had trouble with the dry and loose track at Bay Meadows, and Keeneland's track is even cuppier."

Craig Lewis, owner/trainer of GII San Rafael winner Larry the Legend (Local Talent), explained why he decided to run his colt in the Santa Anita Derby instead of the Jim Beam. "Horse racing's been very good to me and I'm trying to give something back to the game by letting a real nice horse run against two great horses (Afternoon Deelites and Timber Country). People are interested in seeing the horse run, and I'm trying to do something that's a sporting gesture."

Trainer Richard Mandella was pleased with a threefurlong breeze by undefeated **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms) Tuesday at Santa Anita. The GII San Felipe winner went in :36 2/5. "Everything's on course," said Mandella. "Couldn't be better."

Timber Country (Woodman), second to Afternoon Deelites in the San Felipe, drilled five furlongs in :58 3/5 at Santa Anita Monday. "It was an excellent work, fast but very sharp," said Jeff Lukas, son and assistant to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "We're trying to change his activity a little bit. He's been finishing strong, but he's capable of showing more quickness. We'd like him to be up a little bit closer."

Lake George (Vice Regent), third in the San Felipe, went five furlongs in :59 1/5 handily at Santa Anita Wednesday. Also working was San Rafael runner-up Fandarel Dancer (Marshua's Dancer), who covered a mile in 1:40 1/5 under jockey Fernando Valenzuela.

Still on the fence for the Santa Anita Derby are Louisiana Derby one-two finishers Petionville (Seeking the Gold) and In Character (GB) (Never So Bold {IRE}), as well as Bee El Tee (Known Fact).

Saturday, Hialeah:

FLAMINGO S.-GIII, \$200,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m Freddy's Stable Inc.'s Bet Your Bucks (Buckaroo) will be supplemented to the Flamingo at a cost of \$10,000, making the Florida-bred the third confirmed supplement for the race. Bet Your Bucks, who ran third in Sunday's \$150,000 Tampa Bay Derby, joins Casperoo (Silver Buck) and Sea Emperor (Naked Sky) as expected supplemental entries. Trainer Angel Colando is leaning towards running Outta My Way Man (Hatchet Man), third in the March 20 OBS Championship S. "You have to take a chance," Colando said. "The horse has never been better. He's improving every time he goes out." Since Outta My Way Man has to be supplemented into the Flamingo, Colando will have to make his decision by entry time todav.

Triple Threats Notes:

Serena's Song (Rahy), the probable favorite for Saturday's \$600,000 Jim Beam S. at Turfway Park, arrived at Louisville's Standiford Field at 11 a.m. Wednesday after a flight from California and was vanned the short distance to Churchill Downs. Accompanying her was trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who will oversee the filly's preparations at Churchill. Serena's Song is to be shipped to Turfway Saturday morning.

Trainer Roger Attfield confirmed yesterday that Gotham S. winner Talkin Man (With Approval) would return to New York for the April 15 Wood Memorial with a new jockey--Shane Sellers. Sellers replaces Mike Smith, who is committed to ride Concern (Broad Brush) in the Oaklawn Park H. the same day. Attfield says he has no commitment from Sellers beyond the Wood. The Canadian-based trainer continues to be impressed by his colt's progress. "I would have to think there will definitely be some improvement off that race," said Attfield. There's no reason why he can't run that well again and be a fresh horse coming into the Derby."

Paying Dues (Cure the Blues), a seven-length maiden winner at Santa Anita March 19, worked five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 Monday and is being pointed to the GII Wood Memorial at Aqueduct April 15. Trainer Clifford Sise Jr. said the Kentucky-bred will work a mile at Santa Anita Sunday and is scheduled to ship to New York April 12.
