GEORGE BLACKWELL PASSES AWAY George Blackwell, the man who gave the racing world Nearctic and therefore his great son Northern Dancer, died in Costa Rica Tuesday. He was 73. Blackwell, a bloodstock agent and racing journalist, made his greatest contribution to breeding in 1952, when he was commissioned to buy a broodmare to send to Nearco for Canadian horseman E.P. Taylor. Blackwell chose Lady Angela, a winner by Hyperion, who on her second visit to Nearco produced Nearctic, sire of Northern Dancer. More recently, Blackwell had been working exclusively for Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms. Said Juddmonte manager Grant Pritchard-Gordon, "He was a great character, and made a strong impact on our racing and breeding operations."

HEAVENLY PRIZE ON TRACK FOR RETURN

Last year's champion three-year-old filly **Heavenly Prize** (Seeking the Gold) has arrived at Oaklawn Park and is on schedule to make her '95 debut in the \$150,000 Oaklawn Budweiser Breeders' Cup H. Sunday. The filly, who will blow out for the race Saturday, is expected to remain in Arkansas for the GI Apple Blossom H., but future plans could include a try on the turf. "Shug (McGaughey) has worked her on the turf and the filly really seems to like it," said her exercise rider Jan Rushton. "I have a feeling we'll see her on the grass soon."

COOLMORE TRIO TO NEW ZEALAND

Coolmore Stud's trio of **Bigstone (Ire)** (Last Tycoon {Ire}), **College Chapel (GB)** (Sharpo {GB}), and Last **Tycoon (Ire)** (Try My Best) have been added to the ever-growing list of "shuttle stallions." All three will serve in both Ireland and New Zealand from this year on. Bigstone, the '93 Sussex S. hero, and College Chapel are to be based at Ra Ora Stud in New Zealand. Their fees will be \$14,742 and \$6,634 respectively. Last Tycoon, champion sire in Australia last year, will stand at Hannui Farm for a fee of \$25,061.

GO FOR GIN, SUAVE PROSPECT ARRIVE AT KEENELAND Sixteen horses trained by Nick Zito, including 1994 Kentucky Derby winner Go For Gin (Cormorant) and 1995 Derby contender Suave Prospect (Fortunate Prospect), arrived at Keeneland Race Course yesterday morning by van from Florida. Zito plans to run Go For Gin at the Keeneland spring meeting, which runs April 7-28. Following the Keeneland meeting, the four-year-old is scheduled to race in the GIII Churchill Downs H. on Derby Day May 6, with the GI Metropolitan H. May 29 at Belmont Park his main goal. Suave Prospect will make his next start in the \$500,000 Blue Grass S. April 15. The Florida Derby runner-up is scheduled to work at Keeneland Tuesday.

EARLE MACK ACQUIRES HALF-INTEREST

IN HYROGLYPHIC According to the terms of an agreement reached Wednesday, Earle I. Mack has purchased a 50 percent interest in Triple Crown hopeful Hyroglyphic (High Brite), winner of last year's GIII Bashford Manor S. at Churchill Downs and of the Mountain Valley and Dixieland S. at the current Oaklawn Park meeting. Kentucky-bred Hyroglyphic will remain in training with James Keefer and will race next in Saturday's Rebel S. in Mack's colors under joint ownership with Jack Hammer and Bill Heiligbrodt, who each retained a 25 percent interest. Mack, a NYRA trustee who has bred and raced horses for over 30 years, owned recent champions Peteski and Bruce's Mill, Free Handicap highweight November Snow and graded stakes winner Excellent Tipper.

MR. BAILEYS STILL AILING Last year's 2000 Guineas winner **Mr. Baileys** (Robellino) is making only slow progress following his life-threatening attack of grass sickness. The four-year-old relies on a tubefeeding system for at least half his daily nutrient intake and is reported to be completely dependent on human assistance for his survival. "He still gets tired very quickly and there's no way you can say he is a well horse," said part-owner Paul Venner. "But I'm cautiously optimistic. I don't think we've got a mortality case."
