ARLINGTON HEIGHTS SAYS 'YES' If it had been a race instead of a referendum, it would have been a photo finish. By an unofficial margin of 43 votes, Arlington Heights voters said "yes" to Arlington International Racecourse owner Dick Duchossois' push for a casino on track property. However, the referendum was non-binding and all 10 of the riverboat casino licenses currently allowed in Illinois already have been issued. Also, the Salt Creek, which flows through track property, would have to be dredged to make it navigable; another option would be an amendment to the law permitting land-based casinos in Illinois. In either case, the controversy will continue and the issue will be decided at the state capitol in Springfield. "The first step is over," said Duchossois. "If the referendum had gone the other way, it would have cut off all of our options. From day one, I have been saying racing can't continue to operate unless we can offer some other kind of wagering. There is no license to apply for now; when there is, we will be standing in line." But some in the town remain undeterred in their opposition. "When confronted with a virtually split referendum, there is no mandate," said Phil Crusius, coordinator of the anticasino Concern Citizens for Self Determination. "We are talking about something that fundamentally changes the community. A casino in Arlington Heights calls for a mandate. Dick Duchossois spent hundreds of thousands of dollars and all he got was a draw." The unofficial tally in the referendum that asked, "Should casino gambling be permitted at Arlington International Racecourse?" was 9,480 yes votes to 9,437 no votes.

Saturday, Santa Anita:

SANTA ANITA DERBY-GI, \$700,000, 3vo, 1 1/8m Trainer Randy Bradshaw confirmed yesterday that undefeated GIII Louisiana Derby winner Petionville (Seeking the Gold) will run in the Santa Anita Derby. "We're going to have to meet those horses sooner or later," Bradshaw said. "We might as well find out what we have now. Anyway, it's one less time we'll have to ship the horse." Bradshaw said the only circumstance that would keep Petionville in the barn is an "off-track." The addition of Petionville swells the confirmed starters to seven, with Louisiana Derby runner-up In Character (GB) (Never So Bold {IRE}) still on the fence. Besides the Santa Anita Derby, trainer Bruce Jackson is considering the Wood Memorial and Blue Grass S., both April 15, for In Character. "The weather will be a big factor," Jackson said. "I have him booked on planes to both Keeneland and New York. I'll have to make a decision this weekend." Larry the Legend (Local Talent) breezed a half-mile in :51 Tuesday at Santa Anita. Others considered definite for the Grade I event are Timber Country (Woodman), Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms), Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}), Lake George (Vice Regent) and Fandarel Dancer (Marshua's Dancer). Entries for the 58th Santa Anita Derby are scheduled to be drawn at a special breakfast this morning.

Saturday, Remington Park:

REMINGTON PARK DERBY, \$300,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m Three Remington Park Derby hopefuls posted half-mile works at the Oklahoma City oval yesterday: Only Cash (Top Cash), third in the March 19 Great West S., went in :49 1/5; Dick Mandella-trainee Capote's Promise (Capote), one of two California shippers pointing to the race, covered the distance in :50 1/5; and Dazzling Falls (Taylor's Falls), second in the Great West, breezed in :50 2/5. Trainer Chuck Turco has added blinkers to Dazzling Falls' equipment. "He looked around in the stretch in the Great West and hopefully the blinkers will help him concentrate," Turco said. Trainer Mike Puhich said Huge Gator (Slewdledo), third in the GIII Baldwin S. at Santa Anita, will breeze today, as will Great West winner and probable Remington Park Derby favorite Our Gatsby (Strike Gold). Fuzzy Me (Fuzziano), winner of the Gentilly H. on the Fair Grounds turf in his last start, has already shipped in from New Orleans for the race.

Saturday, April 15, Aqueduct:

THE WOOD MEMORIAL-GII, \$500,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m Trainer Roger Attfield said vesterday from his barn at Keeneland that Gotham winner Talkin Man (With Approval) is "doing great. We'll be coming back (to New York) Friday, the day before the Wood, and we'll ship by air. He'll work Sunday or Monday (April 9 or 10), depending on the track, and will probably work threequarters." With Moonlight Dancer (Carr de Naskra) finishing third, beaten less than a length, at 43-1 odds in the GIII Louisiana Derby, trainer Mike Daggett is giving the Wood a serious look. "He's a possible, not a probable," said Daggett. "He's either going to get April off and come back to run at Belmont in May, or he's going in the Wood. We'll make the decision no later than Tuesday." Knockadoon (Dixieland Band). fourth after a wide trip in the Louisiana Derby, and Pyramid Peak (Mt. Livermore), winner of Saturday's Flamingo S., will start next in either the Wood or the Blue Grass at Keeneland the same day.

### **Triple Threats Notes:**

Trainer Neil Drysdale reported yesterday that undefeated French Deputy (Deputy Minister), who recently suffered a bruised foot, is walking soundly these days at Hollywood Park. "Hopefully he can resume training next week," Drysdale said, adding that he "would assume" that the Kentucky Derby is out of the picture for the colt.

Japanese-based **Ski Captain** (Storm Bird), winner of the G3 Kisaragi Sho S. at Kyoto Racecourse in his last outing Feb. 5, will start next in the May 6 Kentucky Derby. The Hideyuki Mori-trained colt breezed a half-mile in :52 9/10 on an uphill woodchip course at the Japan Racing Association's Ritto Training Center April 5. The gray colt is scheduled to depart Narita, Japan for Los Angeles Thursday, April 27.

### NYRA TO SIMULCAST KEENELAND MEET

Beginning this Friday, April 7, Aqueduct will simulcast the entire race card from Keeneland daily through the conclusion of the Keeneland meet April 28. The whole-card simulcasts from Kentucky represent the first regularly scheduled simulcast venture outside of south Florida for the New York Racing Association. Saturday and Sunday, April 29 and 30, Churchill Downs will be the simulcast option. Saturday's Churchill card will feature the Derby Trial. "Our object is to bring in the finest races available for our fans who enjoy simulcasting," said NYRA Director of Communications and Development Steven Crist. "Many of the New York horsemen who have left south Florida also race at Keeneland, so we think our fans will be very familiar with a number of the horses, trainers and jockeys racing there." Aqueduct's wagering will be in a separate pool and not co-mingled into the Keeneland pools. During Keeneland's dark days April 10 and 17, the Big A will pick up full cards from Hialeah.

### OAKLAWN HANDICAP NOTES Silver Goblin

(Silver Ghost) breezed five furlongs in an easy 1:03 vesterday at Oaklawn in preparation for the GI \$750,000 Oaklawn H. next Saturday, April 15. "Our plans are to stay here and run, assuming the weights are okay," said trainer Kenny Smith. Silver Goblin, currently riding an eight-race winning streak, carried 124 pounds in his 5 1/2-length victory in the GII Razorback H. last out. Weights for the Oaklawn H. will be released today. Gulfstream Park H. winner Cigar (Palace Music), who has a five-race winning streak of his own, galloped at Oaklawn Wed. morning. Concern (Broad Brush) breezed a mile in 1:39 Sunday at the Hot Springs oval. "He is coming along well," said trainer Richard Small. Expected in from California April 11 are Santa Anita H. first, second and fifth-place finishers Urgent Request (IRE) (Rainbow Quest), Best Pal (\*Habitony) and Johann Quatz (FR) (Sadler's Wells). Urgent Request drilled a mile in a bullet 1:36 4/5 vesterday over Santa Anita's fast main track. Trainer Rodney Rash was "very happy" with the work.

### NIARCHOS HORSES TO HAMMOND, PEASE

Following the death of his principal trainer, Francois Boutin, leading owner-breeder Stavros Niarchos has decided to entrust the training of his French-based horses to two Englishmen--John Hammond and Jonathan Pease. Hammond, who trained French Derby and Arc de Triomphe winner Suave Dancer (Green Dancer), and Pease, the trainer of last year's Breeders' Cup Turf winner, Tikkanen (Cozzene), are both based at Chantilly. Pease has been sent 12 of the Niarchos horses, while Hammond has been given the remainder, expected to be about 40 in number. They include last year's Arc runner-up, Hernando (Niniski).

### SOVIET PROBLEM BACK AT THE TRACK

Soviet Problem (Moscow Ballet), a winner of nine of 13 starts last year and runner-up in the Breeders' Cup Sprint, was vanned from Harris Farms in Coalinga, Ca. to Golden Gate Fields Tuesday. "She got here Tuesday afternoon," said trainer Greg Gilchrist, who added that the five-year-old chestnut mare enjoyed an uneventful trip. Soviet Problem, Northern California's Horse of the Year for 1994, earned \$713,971 last year while winning eight stakes, including the GIII Laurel Dash. She will begin training for her '95 campaign at Golden Gate.

BRACHO LEAVES CANADA Jockey Jesus Bracho has taken his tack to Maryland after being frustrated in his attempts to ride in Canada. Bracho came to Ontario from Florida to ride at Woodbine and had been slated to make his debut there in the season opener March 25. However, Bracho was unable to do so because of immigration problems. He did not have a working permit and was unable to receive a letter of support from the head of the Jockeys Benefit Association of Canada. While in the U.S., Bracho will be applying for permanent residency in Canada. Bracho's wife Sherene has relatives in Ontario. Bracho, the 1992 Eclipse Award winner as top apprentice, was suspended for 60 days the following September when it was discovered he falsified information about his riding experience. The suspension dragged on well into the following year while the Florida racing authorities tried to suspend him for life. Bracho eventually made a deal in which he gave up his award to begin riding again.
