NYRA TO PROVIDE COMMINGLED SIMULCASTING TO NEVADA The New York

Racing Association and Nevada racebooks have signed a simulcast agreement to commingle the Nevada betting pools into the NYRA on-track pool. Starting with the opening of the Belmont Park spring meeting May 3, customers at 37 racebooks in Nevada will wager directly into those pools. "As far as we're concerned, it is a win-win situation for NYRA, the racebooks and racing fans in Nevada," said Steven Crist, NYRA's Director of Communications and Development. "Wagering in Nevada on NYRA races, which is already strong, figures to increase substantially, thereby having a positive financial impact on the racebooks, NYRA and its horsemen. This is part of our goal to expand the reach of the NYRA signal. We are aggressively pursuing further expansion of our reach. We will be adding other outlets in the near future." Racebook patrons will be offered all the same wagering options as those on track, including the Pick Six. The agreement is subject to approval of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board.

RETAMA PARK OPENS TODAY Retama Park, the new \$79 million racetrack near San Antonio, Texas, opens tonight for its inaugural season. The meeting, which runs through September 17, will be highlighted by 36 stakes worth over \$1.7 million. Opening night post time is 7 p.m.; the nine-race card features the \$25,000-added Tejas S. for accredited Texas-breds. The Honorable George W. Bush, governor of Texas, will speak during Retama Park's ribboncutting ceremonies, which begin at 6 p.m. "We are very anxious to begin our first season of racing and are quite proud to showcase our new facility to the public," said Retama Park President Bob Quigley. Opening weekend will feature two additional stakes: the \$25,000 Texas Wild Flower Saturday and the \$50,000 J.R. Straus Memorial Sunday.

That makes us look better if we win it. I've seen plenty of 3-5 shots

get beat." Bruce Jackson, trainer of In Character (GB) (Never So Bold {IRE}), indicated before the draw, while not stating officially, that he would run in the Wood Memorial at Agueduct April 15.

Saturday, Remington Park:

REMINGTON PARK DERBY, \$300,000, 3yo, 1 1/16m Huge Gator (Slewdledo) worked a bullet three furlongs at Remington yesterday in :35 3/5, galloping out a half-mile in :48 2/5. "It looked like he handled the track really well," said trainer Mike Puhich. Early race favorite Our Gatsby (Strike Gold), scheduled to breeze Thursday morning, skipped the work and will gallop up to the race instead.

Triple Threats Continued.

Saturday, April 15, Aqueduct:

WOOD MEMORIAL-GII, \$500,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m GIII Nashua winner Devious Course (Crafty Prospector), third in the GII Gotham March 25, is a possible starter for trainer Jimmy Bond in the Wood. "He's doing good," said Bond. "He'll probably work seven furlongs in a few days. I have to say I was very disappointed after the Gotham. I thought he'd run better. He really wasn't taking hold of the track. He prefers some moisture in the track. So, he has to train very well to make the Wood." Leo O' Brien trainee Ave's Flag (Personal Flag), fourth in the Gotham, is also "being pointed towards the Wood. He came out of the race grand. He'll more than likely work either five-eighths or three-quarters Saturday.' Another New York-bred, Talc's Gift (Talc), may go next in the Wood. The Pat Reynolds-trainee is coming off two straight Aqueduct allowance victories. "I haven't definitely made up my mind yet, but the Wood is a strong consideration for us," said Reynolds. Da Hoss (Gone West), second as the favorite in the Gotham, will not be making his next start in the Wood. "It's very unlikely that we would go in that race," said trainer Michael Dickinson.

Triple Threats Notes:

The foreign contingent for the Kentucky Derby, which includes Eltish (Cox's Ridge) from England and Ski Captain (Storm Bird) from Japan, has gained one more member in Godolphin Stable's Treasurer (Darshaan), who may ship over from Dubai for the event. "We haven't heard officially that he'll be coming, because of the quarantine regulations," said Simon Crisford, Godolphin racing manager. "But we're very hopeful that he will come." Running on the turf in Ireland last fall, Treasurer broke his maiden in his third attempt. This year he has won three of four starts while racing on the sand at Nad Al Sheba racetrack in Dubai.

MR. ANGEL IS NEW YORK-BRED HORSE OF THE YEAR Mr. Angel (Cormorant) has been named 1994 New York-Bred Horse of the Year and Champion New York-Bred Three-Year-Old Male, it was announced yesterday by the New York Thoroughbred Breeders. The winner of the Arlington Classic and the Jersey Derby at Garden State Park, Mr. Angel earned \$342,202 last year. Other divisional champions were: Roques Walk (Ends Well), two-year-old filly; Cyrano (Seattle Slew), two-yearold colt; Casa Eire (Compliance) and She Rides Tonite (Stalwart), 3-year-old filly (tie); Irish Linnet (Seattle Song), older female and turf female; Thunder Rumble (Thunder Puddles), older male; A In Sociology (Ends Well), turf male; Corma Ray (Cormorant), sprinter.

FASIG-TIPTON CHANGES SARATOGA

FORMAT Fasig-Tipton's 75th annual Saratoga Yearling Sales, August 8, 9 and 10, will see one important change in its format in 1995. Yearlings accepted for Saratoga will from now on be catalogued alphabetically straight through the three evening sessions. The order in which horses are offered is determined by the beginning letter of their dams' names, which in 1995 begins with the letter "M." In commenting on this change, company President Walt Robertson referred to the origins of "nights and hip numbering" at Saratoga. "In its earliest days, the Saratoga sales stretched over a whole month, with a different breeder selling yearlings each night," Robertson said. "As the format condensed in the 1950's and 60's, breeders from certain parts of the country sold together on specific nights. This pretty much perpetuated itself through 1994 and has created logistical problems and imbalances. With the entire catalogue being presented in three evening sessions, a straight alphabetical format provides better balance in the quality of offerings without imposing burdens on any one consignor."

SECOND PURSE INCREASE OF THE SEASON AT BLUE RIBBON For the second time this season, Blue Ribbon Downs in Sallisaw, Oklahoma has announced a purse increase. All overnight races will be raised ten percent across the board, with the exception of maiden special weight events, which will be increased by 30 percent. The increases go into effect April 13. The simulcast agreement between Remington Park and Blue Ribbon Downs, which has resulted in a higher average daily handle at Blue Ribbon, has made the increases possible. Blue Ribbon Downs also announced this week that beginning May 6, Eureka Downs in Eureka, Kansas will take full-card simulcasts from Blue Ribbon Saturdays, Sundays and holidays through July 4.
