OAKLAWN HANDICAP WEIGHTS RELEASED

Last year's Breeders' Cup Classic winner Concern (Broad Brush) will shoulder top weight of 122 pounds in the GI Oaklawn H. April 15. The four-year-old breezed Thursday at Oaklawn, going six furlongs in 1:15 3/5. Leading active money-earner Best Pal (*Habitony) was weighted at 121, one pound over Cigar (Palace Music), 120. The Bill Mott trainee also worked Thursday, getting seven furlongs in 1:27 1/5. "It was a good move for (Cigar)," said Mott's assistant, Tim Jones. "What we really liked was how well he got hold of the track." Local favorite Silver Goblin (Silver Ghost) is in at 119, and Santa Anita H. hero Urgent Request (Ire) (Rainbow Quest) will carry 118. The race is also expected to draw Johann Quatz (Sadler's Wells), 114, and Sticks and Bricks (Broad Brush), 108. A seventh starter was added Thursday when Dramatic Gold (Slew o'Gold), 117, joined the list. The California contingent of Best Pal, Dramatic Gold, Urgent Request and Johann Quatz will fly in to Hot Springs April 10.

SALMAN TO SELL AT AUCTION Epsom Derbywinning owner Fahd Salman will sell both mares and yearlings at auction in Britain and the U.S. this year. But rumors that Salman, whose colors were successfully carried at Epsom by Generous in 1991, is planning wholesale cutbacks in his racing operation are apparently unfounded. "There will be no major reduction," said Salman's racing manager, Anthony Penfold. "It will be a trimming operation. We are becoming more commercially oriented." Salman's broodmare band currently numbers 70; he owns studs in Britain and Ireland, which Penfold said are not expect to be affected by the sales.

Timber Country (Woodman) has shown steady improvement in his first two starts this year while giving weight to his rivals both times. The playing field is now level with all starters at equal weights, and last year's champ figures to benefit from his two belt-tighteners as well as an honest early pace; he can stay out of trouble while stalking the pace from the outside and run down the speed in that telling final sixteenth.

Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}) was not at peak fitness when taking the Golden State Derby by three-quarters following more than two months on the sidelines. The GIII El Camino Real Derby winner drilled a sharp five-eighths at Santa Anita Tuesday for his second start off the layoff and his first at this track; last year's El Camino winner Tabasco Cat was second in this race before taking two legs of the Triple Crown.

Afternoon Deelites' (Private Terms) win in the GII San Felipe S. last time was not quite as dominant as his first three stakes wins, and he picks up three pounds off that effort. They still have to prove they can beat him, but he is tough to bet at short odds.

The bet: an exacta box, Timber Country and Jumron (GB). The Santa Anita Derby will be televised on ABC Sports, from 4:30 to 6:00 p.m. EDT; post time for the race is set for 5:20 p.m EDT.
