A 'LEGEND' IN THE MAKING Bringing his career earnings over the half-million dollar mark. \$2,500 bargain Larry The Legend (Local Talent) proved not only talented but dead game taking vesterday's GI Santa Anita Derby by a head over favored Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms). The little bay ranged up to challenge his previously undefeated rival on the far turn, but looked beaten when the favorite pulled away to a clear lead at the top of the stretch. "I couldn't believe this little horse. He is the gamest, and has the most heart of any horse I've ever ridden, said jockey Gary Stevens, who again flew in from Hong Kong to steal the show. "He was not only beaten at the quarter pole, I thought he was hopelessly beaten. I said, 'Well, that's it. We're going to be second best.' But I started asking this colt for more, and he kept giving it to me. The harder I asked him, the harder he ran." Afternoon Deelites, suffering his first career loss, couldn't quite hold on in the final yards. "I should have been a little more patient," said his rider, Kent Desormeaux. "I let him march on instead of electing to cruise. I think he flattened out a little bit--along with getting to look around. I really don't think distance is a problem with him. I moved prematurely to establish position, and it cost me. He'll be tough in the next one."

JAMBALAYA JAZZ JAMS AT KEENELAND Jambalaya Jazz (Dixieland Band), getting ready for next Saturday's Blue Grass S., worked three-quarters in 1:14 over the Keeneland main track Saturday. With jockey Sam Maple in the saddle, the winner of last year's Kentucky Jockey Club S. went the half in :50 and the final quarter in :24, galloping out seven furlongs in 1:27. "He went real nice and even the first half-mile and then picked it up real nice. He needed the work; he got plenty out of it. I think it's just what the doctor ordered," said Maple. News cont. p2

Refusing to give it up when the race seemed lost at the top of the stretch, Larry The Legend, on the pace from the start, ground it out through the long stretch drive and got up in the final jump to hand Afternoon Deelites his first defeat. It was the colt's fourth straight victory and his third stakes win. "This race went just as it was billed. It was supposed to be the Santa Anita Derby of all Santa Anita Derbies and that's just what it turned out to be," said winning iockey Gary Stevens. "I can't think of a more dramatic, touching story in racing than this little horse. I can't remember too many races that I'm going to cherish as much as I'm cherishing this one right Said owner/trainer Craig Lewis, who paid just \$2,500 for the colt as a two-year-old, "I knew going into this race he was good. Today he showed me he was exceptional. This is the race I wanted to win--I didn't want to jinx myself by going ahead and making plans for the Kentucky Derby." Jumron (GB) finished fastest of all to get third, just a neck behind the runner-up. TIMBER COUNTRY (Woodman), the crowd's second choice, made up some ground late to be fourth. "He was just fighting the racetrack," said his rider, Pat Day. "He wasn't getting hold of it. When I asked him, he was trying, but he just wasn't going anywhere." Added trainer D. Wayne Lukas, "I'm not making excuses, but we know he runs well (at Churchill). That's the main thing. We'll put him on a plane or van and get him out there." It is expected that the first four finishers will meet again at Churchill Downs on the first Saturday in May.

ILLINOIS TASK FORCE MAKES

RECOMMENDATIONS Telephone wagering and full-card simulcasting will be coming to Illinois if the state legislature acts on the recommendations of Governor Jim Edgar's Task Force on Racing. Among the other major revisions proposed were changes in the Illinois-bred incentive programs to offer bonuses to owners of horses running first, second and third in open-company races; allowing each track two more off-track betting locations; and giving horsemen an equal split with tracks on wagers at OTB parlors. The current statute favors tracks in the split--for example, it takes a \$4 win, place or show wager for horsemen to get the same purse return they realize when \$2 is bet on track. The 22-member task force, chaired by Chicago attorney James M. Kane, submitted its report following two months of closed-door deliberations. Track owner/operators, thoroughbred and harness owners and breeders, legislators and the Illinois Racing Board were represented on the task force. The report made no mention of Arlington International Racecourse owner Dick Duchossois' proposed "racing industry riverboat casino." In a letter to Kane that accompanies the report, Duchossois said, "We need to go beyond the reported recommendations to be competitive within the current racing and gaming market. Although we support the implementation of the recommendations as an overall improvement for the industry, the provisions result in a net cost to Arlington of almost \$2 million in a typical year of 131 racing days." Prefacing the 18 recommendations was a state of the industry report, which noted total admissions on Illinois riverboats alone in fiscal year 1994 amounted to 17.3 million people with total wagering of \$11.4 billion, compared to total wagering of only \$1.2 billion on horse racing.

RETAMA PARK STRONG ON OPENING DAY

Retama Park, which opened for its inaugural race meet Friday, April 7, hosted an opening-day crowd of 29,631; total handle for the San Antonio track's firstever card was \$1.611.539. "The fans had a great time and our staff performed in an excellent manner," said President Bob Quigley. "I find it hard to believe we reached our attendance numbers. I'm very pleased and excited about the future of Retama Park and Texas racing."

PRADO NOTCHES NUMBER 2,000 Jockey Edgar Prado reached the 2,000-win mark when he booted home Dimetrius in the third race at Pimlico yesterday. Prado, 27, was the leading rider in Maryland in 1992, '92, and '93, and missed taking the '94 title by only 10 winners. His 2,000th winner came in a \$5,000 claiming event. "Every race counts," said Prado. "You don't look at the size of the purse, you just want to do the best job you can for the people who give you a chance to ride."
