CELTIC' SWINGS INTO ACTION Celtic Swing (Damister), hot favourite for both the 2000 Guineas and the Epsom Derby, is expected to make his threeyear-old debut in the GIII Singer & Friedlander Greenham S. at Newbury April 22. The runaway winner of last season's GI Racing Post Trophy has been the subject of good gallop reports this spring and is being held as low as 6-4 for the Guineas and 3-1 for Epsom. France's main hope for the British classics, Dewhurst hero **Pennekamp** (Bering {GB}) will return to action in this weekend's Prix Djebel at Evry.

ROYAL ATHLETE TAKES GRAND NATIONAL

Royal Athlete (Ire) (Roselier {Fr}), a 12-year-old gelding who was one of a six-horse Jenny Pitman-trained entry, was a seven-length winner of Saturday's Grand National Steeplechase at Aintree Racecourse in England, giving rider Jason Titley his first win in his first ride in the event. Of the 35 starters, just 15 made the course. Stablemate **Do Be Brief (Ire)** (Le Moss {Ire}) set the early pace as the favorite, **Master Oats (GB)** (Oats {Ire}), ran to his outside. The latter took command midway through the race, but began to tire in the final straight, allowing Royal Athlete to take a two-length lead heading for home. The winner continued to extend his advantage despite a late run by **Party Politics (GB)** (Politico), who finished second.

UNFINISHED SYMPH READY FOR RETURN

Unfinished Symph (Aloha Prospector), third in last year's Breeders' Cup Mile, could make his return to the races in Saturday's San Simeon H. at Santa Anita. "He's ready to run right now, I just want to make sure I get him into the right spot," said his trainer, Wesley Ward, "If he doesn't run Saturday, he'll probably run in the Inglewood H. at Hollywood Park." Ward added that the four-year-old has improved over the winter. "He was a little over-the-top last fall and we turned him out...he had 10 acres to just roam around and enjoy himself. The time off did him a world of good. He's a bigger, stronger horse. Every once in a while I'll get on him in the morning. He feels like a completely different horse; he's as smooth as ice." LAST WEEK ON THE TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL

Larry The Legend (Local Talent), third choice in Saturday's Santa Anita Derby, moved to the head of the class in the west with his gutsy victory over the race favorite Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms). Jockey Gary Stevens, who flew in from Hong Kong to ride the colt for the first time, was impressed with his popularity with the crowd. "The biggest following I'd ever seen in racing before was the one that John Henry had," Stevens said yesterday. "But the reception this horse got even when they announced him before the race Saturday was just unbelievable. It shocked me. I had read the press clippings about how this horse had such a big following. I thought they had to be exaggerated; in reality, they were understated." Owner/trainer Craig Lewis has not yet decided when his stable star will ship to Churchill. Runner-up Afternoon Deelites and Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}), third, will head to Kentucky this weekend; fourth-place finisher Timber Country (Woodman) is scheduled to travel east today. Said trainer D. Wayne Lukas of his champ, "We still think he has the goods...but we're going to have to get it tuned up a little better."

In Oklahoma, the Remington Park Derby saw **Dazzling Falls** (Taylor's Falls), with blinkers on, rally from last to first for a decisive 3 1/2-length score. "I don't know how much the blinkers helped," said his trainer, Chuck Turco. "I know that when I put them on him in the paddock, he took a deep breath and settled right down." The Nebraska-bred will start next in either the Kentucky Derby or the Arkansas Derby April 22. "It's tough for a horse to win three races with just two weeks in between," said Turco. **Only Cash** (Top Cash), who held the lead for a quarter before stopping to finish a badly beaten sixth, bled and will race with Lasix next time out.

Triple Threats cont. THIS WEEK'S TRIPLE CROWN PREPS Saturday, Aqueduct WOOD MEMORIAL-GII, \$500,000, 9f

Gotham winner Talkin Man (With Approval) will ship up for the race from Keeneland Friday. "Everything is going well--the way you want it to be," said his trainer, Roger Attfield. He will be joined on the plane by Knockadoon (Dixieland Band), who will work at Keeneland Thursday. Also getting ready for the race in Kentucky, Kresa (Blushing John) will head to New York Wednesday. "He will have one change in the Wood, " said trainer Nick Zito. "He'll be wearing blinkers for the first time." The colt is scheduled to blow out for the race later in the week. Devious Course (Crafty Prospector), third in the Gotham, will be back for the Wood. Trainer Mike Daggett will saddle Moonlight Dancer (Carr de Naskra), a close third in the Louisiana Derby in his most recent effort. The New York-bred worked six furlongs in a sharp 1:13 2/5 at Aqueduct Friday; Daggett's schedule for the colt the remainder of the week is: "He'll gallop Tuesday, stand in the gate Wednesday, breeze a half on Thursday, school in the paddock at Aqueduct Friday--and win the Wood on Saturday." Jockey Larry Melancon, who rode the colt at the Fair Grounds, will be aboard again Saturday. Also expected for the race are Candy Cone (Chas Conerly), who took an allowance at the Wood distance at Aqueduct last out; and El Alpino (Cognizant), who shipped in from Panama to finish eighth in the Gotham. Trainer Leo O'Brien said yesterday that his nominee Ave's Flag (Personal Flag), will likely have to miss the race. "When he galloped on Saturday, he was changing leads a lot," O'Brien said. "I suspect he has bruised feet, but I did have him x-rayed just in case." The Irish horseman said the New York Stallion S. April 23 is probably next for his colt.

Saturday, Keeneland BLUE GRASS S.-GII, \$500,000, 9f

Trainer Thomas Arnemann has added the name of his three-year-old Wild Syn (Wild Again) to the list of Blue Grass probables. The lightly raced colt, third in the Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream after finishing off the board in the Hutcheson S., worked five furlongs in 1:02 1/5 at Churchill Saturday; he shipped to Keeneland to gallop over the strip yesterday, but will return to his home base before vanning over for the race Friday. Trainer John Ward reports that Flamingo winner Pyramid Peak (Mt. Livermore) is "50-50" to run in the Blue Grass: if he doesn't, his next start will be the Kentucky Derby. Ward will have at least one colt, Jambalaya Jazz (Dixieland Band), for the race. Suave Prospect (Fortunate Prospect) worked five furlongs at Keeneland yesterday, while rival Thunder Gulch (Gulch) went the same distance at Santa Anita in :59. Jim Beam runner-up Tejano Run (Tejano) is scheduled to breeze today, and Tampa Bay Derby winner Gadzook (Meadowlake) will work Wednesday.
