FIVE-DAY WEEK AT BELMONT New York racing will continue with a five-day racing week when the action shifts to Belmont Park May 3 for the springsummer meeting. The NYRA Board of Trustees approved the altered racing schedule at its regular monthly meeting yesterday. "We felt it was in the best interests of racing in New York to continue to race five days per week at the Belmont spring meet." said Ken Noe Jr., NYRA president and general manager. "We feel that by racing five days per week, we will be able to provide a better product for our fans and simulcast customers across the country. There are special situations in which six days per week are necessary, like Saratoga. In general, however, there is just too much racing." As at Aqueduct, Mondays and Tuesdays will continue to be the dark days except for Memorial Day, the Fourth of July holiday weekend and closing day, July 17. During the week of the July 4 holiday, Wednesday and Thursday will be dark. Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, 10 live races will be carded. "By adding basically two races weekends, we can help minimize the lost opportunities for horsemen and at the same time generate a little extra revenue for both NYRA and the State of New York," Noe explained.

PRO-CASINO VOTE AT FORT ERIE The Ontario Jockey Club said yesterday that the future of Fort Erie Racetrack is more secure following a unanimous endorsement by the Fort Erie Town Council of the proposal to locate a provincially-run casino in Fort Erie. The vote is a major step forward in the process to qualify the town for consideration as a site for a casino, clearing the way for further discussions to establish Ontario's government-run casino in the community of 25,000 people adjacent to Buffalo, New York.

OAKLAWN PARK H.-Gl. \$750,000, 4vo/up, 1 1/8m With trainer Bill Mott looking on, Cigar (Palace Music) worked a half-mile in :48 2/5 over a "good" Oaklawn track yesterday. Cigar has won all five of his starts since Mott took him off the turf last October. The five-year-old's string of victories includes three Grade I scores in the NYRA Mile, Donn H. and, most recently, the March 5 Gulfstream Park H. Also breezing a halfmile vesterday was GII Razorback H. winner Silver Goblin (Silver Ghost), who covered the distance in :51 2/5. The gray Oklahoma-bred will be going for his ninth straight victory Saturday. Concern (Broad Brush), three-length winner of the GIII New Orleans H. in his '95 debut March 12, went five furlongs in 1:03 2/5 at Oaklawn Wed., galloping out six panels in 1:16. "He goes out there and does just what you ask," said trainer Richard Small. Best Pal (*Habitony) simply galloped at Oaklawn yesterday. "He had a good work at Santa Anita last Friday, seven-eighths in 1:23 3/5," said John Turner, assistant to trainer Dick Mandella. Gary Stevens will retain the mount on Santa Anita H. winner Urgent Request (Rainbow Quest) for the Oaklawn H. before returning to Hong Kong Sunday.

Saturday, Aqueduct:

WOOD MEMORIAL-GII, \$500,000, 3vo, 1 1/8m Kresa (Blushing John) breezed under jockey Joe Bravo yesterday, going three furlongs in :39 3/5 over a sloppy Keeneland racetrack. "He did it nice and easy and relaxed," said Bravo. Trainer Nick Zito said he is hoping for a "major improvement" Saturday when Kresa will be equipped with blinkers for the first time. "I'm hoping he'll move way, way up," said Zito. "If he's first or second--maybe even third--in the Wood I'll run him in the Derby." Kresa, seventh in the Florida Derby in his last start March 11, is scheduled to arrive at Belmont by van today. GIII Nashua S. winner Devious Course (Crafty Prospector) will miss the Wood due to an eye injury suffered in his stall late Tuesday, trainer H. James Bond said. Although jockey Shane Sellers will ride probable favorite Talkin Man (With Approval) in the Wood, trainer Roger Attfield has a commitment from Mike Smith to ride the colt in the Kentucky Derby. Also expected to start Saturday are Candy Cone (Chas Conerly), Is Sveikatas (L'Enjoleur), Knockadoon (Dixieland Band) and Moonlight Dancer (Carr de Naskra).

Saturday, Golden Gate Fields:

CALIFORNIA DERBY-GIII, \$200,000, 3yo, 1 1/16mT The California Derby, which will have its first running on the turf Saturday, may be run in divisions. "If we get 19 entrants, we'll split it and have two \$150,000 divisions," said Racing Secretary Daniel Eidson. If the race is not split, 12 horses, the maximum allowed for a turf event at Golden Gate, will contest the race. Earnings will determine who gets in the field. Considered definite for the event: Alletasso (Tasso), Awesome Thought (Flying Paster), Bee El Tee (Known Fact), Captain Video (Stalwart), Fine N' Majestic (Majestic Light), Funny Tale (*Habitony), Hidden Source (Mr. Prospector), Mahryebo (Batonnier), Mr Purple (Deputy Minister), No Fantasy (Cutlass Reality), Raji (Rajab) and Slewker (Slewdledo). Listed as possible for the race: Acquitted (Defense Verdict), Freon (It's Freezing), High Walker (Skywalker), Knightofthebride (Slew the Bride), Tank Ya Folks (Tank's Prospect) and Trophy Time (Flying Paster).

ARKANSAS DERBY FIELD TAKES SHAPE

Mystery Storm (Storm Bird), undefeated in four starts at the current Oaklawn meeting, is scheduled to head a field of 10 to 11 three-year-olds for the April 22 \$500,000 Arkansas Derby. The colt worked five furlongs Tuesday over a very sloppy Oaklawn track in 1:00 2/5. "I couldn't remember having worked him over a track this wet before," said trainer Larry Robideaux, Jr. "He handled it real well. With the rain coming down, I knew the going wouldn't get any better, so we went ahead with the work." Mystery Storm is attempting to become the first horse to sweep Oaklawn's series of races for three-year-olds-the Southwest, Rebel and Arkansas Derby--since Demon's Begone in 1987. Tampa Bay Derby runnerup Composer (Easy Goer) drilled seven furlongs in 1:25 3/5 over Oaklawn's "good" surface Wednesday, galloping out a mile in 1:38 4/5. Dazzling Falls (Taylor's Falls), who captured last Saturday's Remington Park Derby by 3 1/2-lengths, was confirmed as a starter in the Arkansas Derby yesterday. Other expected to run are: Beavers Nose (Demons Begone), On Target (Forty Niner), Rich Man's Gold (Forty Niner) and Celestial Star (Risen Star). Possible starters include: Our Gatsby (Strike Gold), Flitch (Demons Begone), Bet Your Bucks (Buckaroo) and Evanston (Slew o' Gold).

Triple Threats Notes:

Trainer Gary Lewis said Goncalino Almeida, the regular rider of Santa Anita Derby third-place finisher Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}), will retain the mount in the Kentucky Derby. Jockey Gary Stevens confirmed yesterday that he will make the trip from Hong Kong once again to ride Larry the Legend (Local Talent) the first Saturday in May. The word from trainer Mike Orman's barn is that Lake George (Vice Regent), fifth in the Santa Anita Derby, will leave California for Kentucky Saturday and will train at Churchill Downs, but is not definite to run in the Kentucky Derby.

FLORIDA ADVANCES BREEDERS' CUP BILL After a similar law was repealed in 1992, the Florida Senate Regulated Industries Committee passed a Breeders' Cup bill out with a vote of 6-1. Also attached to the bill is an amendment calling for the regulation of racing dates for the three South Florida tracks. The committee is chaired by State Senator Roberto Casas (R-Hialeah). Removed from the books when the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering attempted to rewrite a number of regulations controlling racing in Florida, the Breeders' Cup law will have to be put back on the books before the Breeders' Cup can return to South Florida. The dates bill that was attached calls for a return to a system of alternating winter dates, with Gulfstream and Hialeah exchanging the prime dates each year. Also included in the bill is a proposal to increase the takeout between one and three percent. While both Gulfstream President Doug Donn and Calder President Ken Dunn said they felt the bill in its current form wouldn't reach the floor of the Senate or the House for a vote, Hialeah Vice President John Van Lindt remained optimistic that the bill would do just that after passing the Senate Wavs and Means Committee.

KEENELAND'S FIRST RETAMA SALE TOPS **\$2.2 MILLION** Sales totalled \$2,238,000 at Retama Park's inaugural horses-in-training sale Tuesday. The sales topper, Yvons Victress, a threeyear-old stakes-winning filly by Manzotti--Yvonnes Victory (Stalwart), was purchased for \$96,000 by Texan Cliford Grum. The filly was one of six threeyear-olds in training from the dispersal of the estate of the late Harold Goodman, a prominent Texas owner and breeder. Other top buyers included Turfway Park owner Jerry Carroll, an investor in Retama Park, and Retama investor and country music singer George Straight, who purchased a twovear-old Western Trick colt for \$36,000. Straight and Carroll also formed a partnership in a Beau's Eagle two-year-old filly originally purchased by Carroll for \$45,000 on which Straight was the underbidder. "What the heck," said Strait. "All I want is to win the Kentucky Derby. Isn't that what everyone wants?" The sale was the first conducted by Keeneland to take place outside of Kentucky in 25 years.

PROGNOSIS GOOD FOR STRAWBERRY ROAD

Strawberry Road (AUST) (Whiskey Road), a 16-year-old stallion who stands at Brookside Farms in Versailles, Kentucky, is recovering at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital from surgery performed last Monday. Strawberry Road's troubles started when he covered a mare with a bacterial infection, then became infected himself. He was treated routinely with antibiotics, but his condition worsened when he suffered severe

reactions to the medication, requiring surgery. "He's not out of the woods yet," said Brookside's Farm Manager Ted Carr yesterday. "You rarely have a stallion react to antibiotics like this. He nearly died. But his prognosis now is better." Carr estimated that if all goes well, the stallion could be fully recovered and ready to breed in about a month. Strawberry Road, the 1983 Horse of the Year in Australia, has sired such graded stakes winners as Fraise, Fowda and Dinard.

DEFRERE BREEZES FOR BAHAMAS Defrere

(Deputy Minister) breezed four furlongs in :48 at Palm Beach Downs vesterday morning in what trainer Revnaldo Nobles termed a "super" work in preparation for Sunday's \$50,000, 7-furlong Bahamas S. at Hialeah. The three-year-old colt, who won his debut March 11 at Gulfstream, will be making his second lifetime start in Sunday's stakes. "He did it very easily and galloped out five furlongs in 1:00," said Nobles. "He's ready to go. With a horse like this, it's tough to gauge how fast he is really going on the track because he takes such big strides. When we work him, we don't put him with company. We try to relax him and let him be himself." The fullbrother to champion two-year-old Dehere will get a freshener after Sunday's race, but Nobles is already looking forward to stretching the colt out. "He can definitely go two turns," said Nobles. "His mother went long, his father went long and he galloped a mile here in 1:40 the other day."

AUSTRALIAN JOCKEYS BANNED Two of Australia's top jockeys have been banned after a racefixing scandal. Jim Cassidy was suspended for three years and Kevin Moses for 12 months for what the Australian Jockey Club described as dishonest and corrupt practices. The Australian stewards launched an investigation after a Sydney newspaper reported that police have over 4,000 hours of taped telephone conversations which reveal wholesale racefixing by the head of a drug syndicate. Bets of \$10,000 were involved, with jockeys taking 10 percent of winnings. Six or seven more riders are expected to be interviewed by the AJC in the next few days.

FAIRY PATH TO MISS GUINEAS Fairy Path (Irish River {FR}), who had been considered by bookmakers to be France's best hope of winning next month's British 1000 Guineas, will miss the race, according to her trainer David Smaga. Smaga said he believes the filly, quoted among the favorites for the Newmarket classic after winning the G3 Prix Calvados at Deauville in her only juvenile outing, is too inexperienced to travel at this stage of her career. "Fairy Path will go to the Prix de la Grotte (next Sunday at Longchamp), followed by the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches," said Smaga. "If she's good enough, she might then go to Royal Ascot in June."

Jockey Jerry Bailey was injured yesterday at Keeneland when his mount, the two-year-old first-time starter **Gregory Hines** (Citidancer), wheeled in front of the grandstand and dumped Bailey onto the muddy track surface during the post parade of the third race. As Bailey was landing, he tried to hold on to the Team Valor colt and was kicked sharply, suffering abrasions across his chest and upper abdomen. Bailey, who complained of some chest pain and shortness of breath, was brought to St. Joseph Hospital in Lexington where X-rays of his chest and ribs and a CAT scan of his abdomen were normal. He was released from the hospital and is still expected to ride Cigar in Saturday's GI Oaklawn Park H. Gregory Hines was fine.

Keeneland's ninth and final race Wednesday was declared a no-contest after the riders were ordered to pull up on the backside to avoid a fallen rival.

Golden Hedges (Seeking the Gold), a four-year-old filly, fell a sixteenth pole from the start of the 1 1/2-mile turf allowance. As the field turned into the backside for the second time, outriders flagged the jockeys up. All wagers were refunded. Dr. George Mundy, Kentucky Racing Commission veterinarian, said it appeared that Golden Hedges had an acute circulatory collapse and died quickly. Her rider Eddie Martin Jr. was not injured.

Local News, Turfway Park:

Gary Wilfert, Turfway's director of racing/racing secretary, announced yesterday that he has resigned that position to accept a role on the management team at Dueling Grounds in Franklin, Ky.
