FLORIDA HORSEMEN'S GROUPS JOIN

RANKS Three groups representing Florida horsemen have agreed to join ranks and work towards common goals. The Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association and the National Association of Thoroughbred Owners will work together in their dealings with the three South Florida tracks. Members from all three groups will hold board positions on the FHBPA, the organization of record designated to deal with the tracks regarding contracts and backside programs. "We didn't want to give the tracks any more opportunities to drive a wedge between our groups like they have in the past," said Scott Savin, Vice President of the FHBPA. "Irving Cowan (from NATO) and Stanley Ersoff (from FTBOA) have been very helpful in aiding efforts to restructure our organization so it will equally represent the owners, breeders and trainers." The restructuring of the FHBPA board could begin as early as May.

RETAMA PARK POSTS GOOD NUMBERS ON FIRST DAY OF SIMULCASTING Wednesday.

April 12, the first day of simulcasting at Retama Park, 774 people attended the races and wagered \$104,598 on seven different tracks throughout the day. Patrons wagered \$24,492 on the Oaklawn signal and \$20,805 on Santa Anita. Other simulcast signals imported include Garden State Park, \$15,001; Aqueduct, \$13,828; Penn National, \$12,417; Keeneland, \$11,607 and Trinity Meadows, \$6,448. "It's going to take some time to get people to understand what simulcasting is and how much fun it can be," said Retama Park's Simulcast Director Steve Ross. "Our numbers are pretty good for the experienced players that showed up. This should increase as we continue to get the word out and when big races take place on the weekends." Wagering per capita for opening day of simulcasting totaled \$135 per person. Simulcast wagering will continue at Retama Park seven days a week.

RIVER DOWNS OPENS TODAY River Downs near Cincinnati, Ohio will open its gates for its 70th anniversary season of racing today. The one-mile oval originally opened as Coney Island Racetrack in 1925. River Downs will host 130 racing dates in 1995 from Friday, April 14 through Monday, Sept. 4 and Saturday, Oct. 14 through Sunday, Nov. 5. Post time is 1 p.m. Beginning June 16, for the first time in its history, River Downs will present twilight racing. There will be seven live races and two simulcasts presented each Friday evening through July 28. "I'm hoping this opportunity will have a positive effect on our attendance," said the track's General Manager Jack Hanessian. River Downs will continue to present the "Twin Seven SuperCard," alternating seven live races with seven races simulcast from Thistledown daily. EOUIX RELEASES FINDINGS OF JAW WIDTH

STUDY EQUIX Biomechanics Inc. announced yesterday the results of a study which run counter to popularized theories concerning how a horse's jaw size and the rate of airflow supposedly implied by that size affects performance. The study of 768 colts and 786 fillies has led to several general conclusions, noted Dr. Paul S. Mostert, president and founder of EQUIX Biomechanics. "For years, we've been told that horses with 'plenty of air' between their jaws are likely to be the best runners," said Dr. Mostert. "Well, hard data indicates otherwise. In fact, when it comes to performance, particularly Graded performance, jaw width doesn't mean a whole lot." The study found that there's an overall higher probability that a colt with well below average jaw width will become a Graded stakes winner than one with above average jaw width. Also discovered was that horses who perform better at distances greater than nine furlongs tend to have narrower laws than do those whose effective distance range is restricted to below seven furlongs. "No matter how you analyze the data, it is clear that good horses come with a variety of jaw sizes and the statement 'the wider the jaws, the better the performance' is patently false," Dr. Mostert concluded.
