#### LARRY THE LEGEND HURT, TO MISS KENTUCKY DERBY Larry the Legend (Local

Talent), the Cinderella horse who became a racing icon after winning the GII San Rafael and the GI Santa Anita Derby, has been injured and will miss the May 6 Kentucky Derby, owner/trainer Craig Lewis said Sunday morning. Lewis, 47, said the colt has a bone chip in his left front knee, but called the injury "minor" and added it was not career-threatening. "It's very disappointing, but Larry will not run in the Kentucky Derby," Lewis said. "We could probably do some things and go on and run him, but it wouldn't be fair to the horse and it wouldn't be fair to his many loyal supporters. The horse has been so good to us and I'd rather just pass than not have him 100 percent. Obviously, it's very tough to have to pass up a race of that magnitude. But in this game you have to learn to take the bitter with the sweet and our main concern is the welfare of the horse. We're going to give him a little bit of time off and he'll return and there'll be a lot of big races for him down the road." Lewis said he did not know exactly how much time Larry the Legend will miss. Larry the Legend, purchased by Lewis for \$2,500 at a bankruptcy sale of former client Photini Jaffe, won the Santa Anita Derby by a head under jockey Gary Stevens April 8, defeating favorite and previously unbeaten Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms). The Illinois-bred colt's earnings now total \$548,425, more than 219 times his purchase price. Lewis said Larry the Legend will not be turned out, will stay at the track and added that the injury was discovered after the colt's Santa Anita Derby victory. "He gave everything a horse could give and when that happens, sometimes it takes a little while for them to recover," Lewis said. "He's a gallant warrior and I'm just not going to do anything that would be detrimental to his well-being."

Champion Sprinter Cherokee Run (Runaway Groom) picks up three pounds from his '95 debut, in which he carried 122 to a 2 1/2-length score in the seven-furlong, \$100,000 Gulfstream Park Sprint H. March 10. "I was concerned because he was coming off a four-month layoff and it was a question of how fit he was," said trainer Frank Alexander. "That race had a good field, a real good field, and we didn't train him very hard. So I was concerned and nervous, and relieved afterwards." With Alexander's attention now turned to today's Bold Ruler, he admitted, "The 125 pounds is a concern. If he should win under that, where would he go from there? He is coming into this race very good though." Boom Towner (Obligato), second in last year's Bold Ruler, comes into the race off a fourth-place effort in the GIII Westchester H. April 1. Canadian-bred Rizzi (Afleet), winner of the '94 Best Turn S. (GIII), flew six furlongs in 1:09 1/5 while taking an Aqueduct allowance in his last.

#### DESORMEAUX IS YOUNGEST RIDER TO

REACH 3,000 Kent Desormeaux, at age 25, became the youngest jockey in history to reach 3,000 career wins when he rode Maisonsaire to a 1 3/4-length victory in the second race at Santa Anita Easter Sunday. Three riders, Bill Shoemaker, Sandy Hawley and Chris McCarron, had reached the 3,000-victory plateau when 27 years of age. Desormeaux, who was born in Maurice, Louisiana, won his first race at Evangeline Downs July 13, 1986. He scored his 2,999th career victory Thursday at Santa Anita before leaving town to ride Friday at Keeneland and Saturday at Golden Gate. He was winless in 10 mounts while out of town. "A couple of days ago, I was kind of numb to what this all would mean," Desormeaux said following his 3,000th. "It really feels good now that it's hit me. With the two days of waiting, I guess I had a little time to reflect on the meaning." He added, "It was nice to get it at home. These are the fans that cheer you and boo you. These are the ones you want to shine in front of. It was certainly fitting to get number 3,000 here at home."


#### TALKIN MAN: PLENTY TO SAY IN DERBY

Talkin Man (With Approval), the runaway winner of Saturday's Wood Memorial, left New York for Keeneland yesterday morning to join the rest of trainer Roger Attfield's string. He will van from Lexington to Louisville about 10 days prior to the Derby. Though no other serious Derby contenders have emerged from the Gotham or Wood field, Attfield remains impressed with his colt's spring performances. "I'm not worried about the competition he's been facing because he's been winning so easily and running faster numbers," said Attfield Sunday morning. "The other (Derby contenders) have been running as fast as they possibly can. That puts me in a good situation. His best race is still ahead of him. He's a fresh horse who hasn't been used up." The only other possible Wood starter heading to Churchill Downs is runnerup Knockadoon (Dixieland Band), who also came out of the race in good order. Third-place finisher Is Sveikatas (L'Enjoleur) will skip the Derby and point for a possible appearance in the June 10 Belmont S.

BLUE GRASS WRAP-UP The top four finishers in Saturday's GII Blue Grass S. at Keeneland, Wild Syn (Wild Again), Suave Prospect (Fortunate Prospect), Tejano Run (Tejano) and Thunder Gulch (Gulch), came out of the race in good order and are expected to meet again in the May 6 Kentucky Derby. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, whose Thunder Gulch was beaten 4 3/4-lengths as the 6-5 favorite, said of the colt, "He's excellent. He didn't do enough to get tired." When asked if he plans to run a three-horse entry in the Derby, including last year's Champion Two-Year-Old Timber Country (Woodman) and the Jim Beam-winning filly Serena's Song (Rahy), Lukas responded, "Our goal is to win the Kentucky Derby. If it takes all three to go over there and get the job done, that's what I'll do." Nick Zito, trainer of Blue Grass runner-up Suave Prospect, is also set for the first Triple Crown event. "I'm happy we have a consistent horse," Zito said. "He's run in four major preps and has run well every time. We're just going to have to get lucky on that special day." Ken McPeek, conditioner of Tejano Run, hopes his multiple graded stakes-winning colt gets a better trip in the Derby than he did Saturday. "My horse only got to run an eighth of a mile, he just got to gallop the rest of the time," McPeek said. "We still feel we have an excellent chance in the next one." Jambalaya Jazz (Dixieland Band), fifth in the sixhorse Blue Grass field, may also try his hand at Churchill. "We'll look at the race (Blue Grass) again and see how much the other horses beat him," said trainer John Ward. "With a mile and a quarter and some more pace, he could be tough."

#### EIGHT POSSIBLE OPPONENTS FOR ELTISH

Eltish (Cox's Ridge), runner-up in last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile, will face a maximum of eight opponents on his reappearance in Newmarket's nine-furlong listed Feilden S. this Thursday. The five-day entries for the event are: Denebola Way (Wadood), champion two-year-old in Greece last season, Eltish, Flemensfirth (Alleged), Heathyards Rock (Rock City), Indian Light (Be My Chief), Munwayr (Kalaglow), Percy Braithwaite (Kahyasi), Seckar Vale (Elmaamul) and Wijara (Waajib). If all goes well Thursday, Eltish will be headed to the May 6 Kentucky Derby. "The horse is in good order and we are hopeful for Thursday," said trainer Henry Cecil. "All being well, the plan then will be to go to Churchill Downs."

### PENNEKAMP AND MACOUMBA TO GUINEAS

Pennekamp (Bering {GB}) and Macoumba (Mr. Prospector), winners of their respective French Trials Saturday, will both challenge for British Classic glory next month. Pennekamp was eased to 5-1 second favorite behind longtime 6-4 market leader Celtic Swing (GB) (Damister) by some bookmakers. Owner Sheikh Mohammed's racing manager Anthony Stroud confirmed the Bering colt on target for the 2,000 Guineas, saying, "I was very pleased with Pennekamp's performance, especially as the distance (61/2 furlongs) was too short for him. He definitely goes to Newmarket." Criquette Head revealed that Macoumba, narrow winner of the slowly-run Prix Imprudence, would also be crossing the English Channel next out. She was promoted to 8-1 third choice for the 10000 Guineas following her head victory. Dubai-based Moonshell (IRE) (Sadler's Wells), easy winner of a Doncaster maiden when trained by Henry Cecil last year, heads the Classic fillies' betting at 5-12.

Honky Tonk Tune, last year's Champion 2yo Filly in Canada, was undefeated in five starts as a juvenile, including four Canadian graded stakes victories, before finishing 11th in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Nov. 5. Making her three-year-old debut and second career start against the boys, the bay filly dueled for the lead three wide down the backstretch and around the turn, took a short lead in the final furlong and was all out to hold off the late-closing Sweet Parker as the odds-on favorite. "She ran her race," said jockey Robert Landry. "Her style is speed, and that's what we decided to do, is let her go. Everything worked out." When asked what's next for Honky Tonk Tune, trainer Danny Vella figured the races on the Canadian Oaks (June 18) trail, rather than the Queens Plate (July 9) journey, would serve her best. "We have not talked about the Plate at all," Vella said. "Our main objective would be the Oaks, but right now she'll have some time on the farm, and then we'll decide what to do."

Koennecker, winner of the 6 1/2-furlong Don Leon Breeders' Cup at Hawthorne last October, finished 10th in the two-turn Tampa Bay Derby last out. Shortening up in distance once again, the Maryland-bred colt vied for the early lead with MIRAMONTE (Notebook), took command after 1/2-mile and then, under left-handed urging, held the late-closing Hail Orphan safe. Hot 1-5 chalk Defrere, making his stakes debut under Jerry Bailey, was unhurried early, made a run leaving the backstretch to reach contention, was eased back on the rail leaving the turn, angled to the outside in upper stretch, then rallied in the lane to just miss the place. "It was a great race for him," said Defrere's trainer Reynaldo Nobles. "He is better than this. He'll win by 10 lengths when we race him at Belmont next. We'll go to New Jersey and give him a little rest first. Bailey agreed, adding, "For any other horse who won first time out and then ran third in stakes company in his second race, it would have been a great effort. He has so much to live up to."

ALL FIRMED UP (c, 3, Affirmed--Sharpening Up {SW, \$98,383}, by Sharpen Up {GB}}, four-times stakesplaced at Woodbine last year, marked his 3yo debut with a 2nd-place allowance finish at the Toronto oval April 2.
