ALTHEA DESTROYED Althea (Alydar), the champion juvenile filly of 1983, was humanely destroyed Saturday after a freak accident in her paddock at King Ranch in Lexington. A GISW of \$1,275,255, she raced under the partnership of Alexander-Groves-Akroyd; Akroyd sold his interest in the mare four years ago. Althea's produce includes Japan's 1994 champion two-year-old filly Yamanin Paradise (Danzig), as well as stakes winners Destiny Dance (*Nijinsky II) and Aurora (Danzig). She has a 1994 filly by Storm Cat.

SAM HOUSTON FILES FOR BANKRUPTCY Despite filing for bankruptcy Monday, officials at Sam Houston Race Park have vowed that the Texas track will continue to operate uninterrupted. Bondholders have agreed to a \$10.8 million plan which will restructure the track's finances; included in the deal is a provision which will forgive the \$4.4 million debt payment, which was defaulted on in January. The operation has been running for just under a year; the first live racing card was held last April 29.

GROUNDBREAKING AT NEW WASHINGTON

TRACK A festive crowd of some 500 people gathered at the future site of Emerald Downs for a groundbreaking ceremony Monday. The new track will herald the return of live Thoroughbred racing to Western Washington, which had been home to Longacres Park for 59 years before that track closed in 1992. Northwest Racing Associates, led by president and key investor Ron Crockett, was granted a permit by the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers to fill wetlands on the 165-acre site April 7; an April, 1996 opening is tentatively scheduled. Northwest Racing has waited two-and-a-half years, spent some \$6 million and endured countless hearings and appeals to turn dirt on the site in Auburn, Washington, 18 miles south of Seattle. The threat of a lawsuit against the Corps for granting the wetlands permit exists. Tom Hazelrigg, an investor leading the push for a track in far-away Lacey, has claimed he would sue the Corps to stop the movement in Auburn; a lawsuit has yet to be filed. The Auburn facility will feature a one-mile oval and a six-level grandstand with seating for about 7,500 fans. News cont. p2

The upset victory of Wild Syn (Wild Again) in the Blue Grass Saturday has not deterred any of the beaten contenders from a rematch in the Derby. Suave Prospect (Fortunate Prospect), Tejano Run (Tejano) and Thunder Gulch (Gulch), second, third and fourth, respectively, have all been named as definite for a run at the roses. Said trainer D. Wayne Lukas of Thunder Gulch's loss, "Keeneland is a track that will always send you home scratching your head. Unbridled, Sea. Hero, Swale--they all lost there before the Derby. Maybe you don't want to win (the Blue Grass)." As for the longshot winner, assistant trainer Kenny Martin said Monday, "He came out of the race fine. He was a little tired, but that's to be expected. We'll give him three days off and go from there."

But those that finished behind Talkin Man (With Approval) in the Wood Memorial have seen enough. Trainer Tony Reinstedler, who sent out Knockadoon (Dixieland Band) to finish second in the Wood, said yesterday, "I was real happy with his race, and he came out fine, but I don't know if running in the Derby is the right thing to do. We'll watch what happens in the next two weeks." Mark Hennig, who saddled Key Guy (Key to the Mint) to finish sixth in the race, is definitely not headed to the Kentucky Derby. "I don't think he handled the track (in the Wood) very well, but it didn't really matter," he said Monday. "Talkin Man was awfully impressive."

THIS WEEK ON THE TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL Saturday, Oaklawn ARKANSAS DERBY-GII, \$500,000, 9f

Mystery Storm (Storm Bird) will try to become the fourth three-year-old to sweep Oaklawn's Southwest S., Rebel S. and Arkansas Derby, The last to do it was Demons Begone in 1987, who went in to the Derby as the favorite but bled and did not finish the race. Said Mystery Storm's trainer Larry Robideaux Jr. Monday, "I wouldn't trade positions with anybody. He has done everything we've asked of him this meeting, both in training and racing." Also expected for the race are the first two from the Remington Park Derby, Dazzling Falls (Taylor's Falls) and Our Gatsby (Strike Gold), On Target (Forty Niner), Composer (Easy Goer), Rebel runner-up Rich Man's Gold (Forty Niner), Celestial Star (Risen Star) and Beavers Nose (Demons Begone).

TRIPLE THREAT NOTES

Treasurer (GB) (Darshaan {GB}), who had been expected in from Dubai, will miss the Derby. "We put our heads together and decided it was all too much," said trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "We decided to take a less ambitious route." The colt will ship to New York in May and point for the grassy Saranac May 13.

Team Lukas pair of Timber Country (Woodman) and Serena's Song (Rahy) worked at Churchill yesterday. Last year's top two-year-old colt went five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 over a track labeled sloppy. "He looked super; he really laid it on through the stretch," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. Stablemate Serena's Song went the same distance in the exact same time. "She just skipped over the mud," said Lukas. "It looked like she was running over the top of it."

In Character (GB) (Never So Bold) will arrive at Churchill April 23 to get ready for the Derby; he will try to bounce back from a lackluster performance in the Santa Anita Derby.

SMART ALEC OUT OF GUINEAS Smart Alec (Diesis {GB}), impressive winner of both his two-yearold starts and once considered a strong candidate for 2000 Guineas glory, is now almost certain to miss the Newmarket classic. The Luca Cumani-trained colt was being prepared for a return to the races in Thursday's GIII Craven S., but his name did not appear in the fiveday entries for the race. Said Cumani, "We feel he needs more time...that makes it very unlikely that he'll run in the Guineas."
