"We're disappointed to miss the Kentucky Derby, but we're appreciative we have such a nice colt and we look forward to his return with great anticipation." Lewis said the surgical procedure lasted approximately 90 minutes and the colt was back in his stall before 10 a.m. PDT and would probably remain there for at least two weeks while recuperating. Lewis indicated that if the colt's recovery went well, his next major race would be either the Molson Export Million at Woodbine Sept. 17 or the Sept. 30 Super Derby.

KEENELAND 2YO SALE SET RECORD Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum's Shadwell Farm paid a top price of \$700,000 for a colt by Dayjur during Keeneland's April Two-Year-Olds-in-Training Sale Tuesday. Shadwell's bid established a sale record, topping the \$400,000 Richard W. Mulhall, as agent, paid for Supremo last year. Kirkwood Stables, as agent, sold the Daviur colt out of stakes winner Aishah, by Alydar. He worked an eighth of a mile twice prior to the sale in :10 1/5, equalling the fastest time at that distance. Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum raced Dayjur, England's Horse of the Year and runnerup in the 1990 Breeders' Cup Sprint to Safely Kept (Horatius). His first foals are 3-year-olds of 1995. Second high price of the day was \$380,000 paid by John Oxley of Tulsa, Oklahoma for a colt by Gone West out of Tabolian, by Gregorian. Denali Stud, as agent, sold the colt. The one-day sale grossed \$11,865,000 for 115 horses. The average was \$103,174. Last year, Keeneland sold 158 horses over two days for \$11,571,500, an average of \$73,237.
