#### REMINGTON CLOSES AFTER

OKLAHOMA TRAGEDY Remington Park was closed Wednesday after a bombing explosion killed as many as 80 people in the Albert Murrah Federal Building in downtown Oklahoma City. Remington diverted all of its emergency medical personnel to the downtown area to assist in the rescue effort. All food prepared for the race-day crowd was sent downtown to feed victims, as well as medical and lawenforcement personnel. Track management expressed its concern for those impacted by the tragedy, and said that members of the 'Remington Park family' were included in those affected by the blast. The Oklahoma City oval has also canceled today's racing card, and is tentatively scheduled to resume racing Friday.

#### SIMULCASTING BILL IN FLORIDA

LEGISLATURE A bill to bring full-card simulcasting to Florida is now making the rounds in both the Florida House and Senate. The current version of the simulcasting bill would allow an operating Thoroughbred track to conduct a minimum of eight races a day and take as many signals as the track wants to bring in. "We should be able to bring fans in who want to watch races from other places," said Calder lobbyist Wilber Brewton. Calder should be the main beneficiary of the bill should it pass. "We plan to take some races from Belmont and Saratoga," said Mike Cronin, Calder's marketing director, "in addition to looking at some of the other racetracks running during our racing hours."

# TURFWAY WAGERING SURGES 55% Benefitting from record purses, full-card simulcasting and the track's new Race Book area, Turfway Park's total wagering increased by 55 percent from last year during its recently completed Winter/Spring meet. Turfway's total handle was a record \$188.2 million during the 58-day meeting, which ran from Jan. 1 through April 6. In 1994, betting during the corresponding 59-day meet totaled \$121.4 million and did not include any wagering from full-card simulcasting, which was authorized by the Kentucky Legislature last year and began in July 1994. The Race Book at Turfway remains open six days a week.

Wednesday Workouts, Churchill Downs:

Californians Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms), Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}) and Lake George (Vice Regent), second, third and fifth in the GI Santa Anita Derby, all had their first workouts since the April 8 race yesterday over a fast Churchill Downs strip.

Clockers caught Burt Bacharach's Afternoon Deelites in :50 2/5 for a half-mile. "He's a dream horse, and I'm just glad to be here," said trainer Dick Mandella. "He's a natural, racing just comes easy to him. Going fast just comes easy to him."

Lake George breezed five furlongs in 1:03, galloping out six panels in 1:16 3/5. "We went nice and easy," said exercise rider Craig Barnfather. "We were just trying to find out how he would take to the track. The time was a bit slow but he's used to a faster track, like the one out at Santa Anita."

Jockey Aaron Gryder came in from Keeneland to work Jumron, who was timed in :50 for a half-mile before galloping out in 1:03 3/5. Trainer Gary Lewis was pleased with the work. "It was a gallop, really, it was easy as can be," said Lewis. "He adjusts very well to any kind of surface. He's a strong individual and he'll love the long stretch here." Jumron was originally purchased in England for 15,000 guineas by trainer A.B. Aziz Al-Saud, a Portland, Oregon-based trainer who often heads to the sales in England. Jumron caught the eye of current owner Charlie Dunn after winning his first start at Portland Meadows by 15 lengths; Dunn purchased the colt from Aziz Al-Saud for a reported \$150,000 after his fourth start last Oct.

#### Sunday, Keeneland:

LEXINGTON S.-GII, \$150,000a, 3yo, 1 1/16m
A field of at least four or five is shaping up, including Royal Mitch (Homebuilder), Star Standard (Risen Star), Bick (Manila), Hidden Source (Mr. Prospector) and possibly Guadalcanal (Copelan). Royal Mitch, winner of the Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream March 11, drilled five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 at Keeneland Monday. "He's sharper now and he's better now than he's ever been," said trainer Dennis Ebert. "If he gets beat Sunday, I'll be a very disappointed person." According to Ebert, Royal Mitch will earn a ticket to the Kentucky Derby "if he runs a big race" in the Lexington.

#### Saturday, Oaklawn:

ARKANSAS DERBY-GII, \$500,000, 3yo, 1 1/8m Flitch (Demons Begone) was vanned to Oaklawn Park Monday following a six-furlong workout in 1:14 2/5 at Keeneland. The GSP colt, fourth in the GIII Flamingo S. at Hialeah in his last start April 1, will be ridden by Shane Sellers in the Arkansas Derby and will race with blinkers for the first time. "Shane worked him twice with blinkers, and he said they made a big difference," said trainer Bill Badgett. "Shane said he's more focused on what he's doing." David Beard's Mystery Storm (Storm Bird), winner of five of eight career starts including all four outings as a three-year-old, breezed five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 over a "good" Oaklawn track Tuesday, galloping out six furlongs in 1:13 4/5.

#### **Triple Threats Notes:**

GIII Louisiana Derby winner **Petionville** (Seeking the Gold) is scheduled to work "an easy half" at Hollywood Park today, after which he will be pointed to either the Illinois Derby or the Preakness, trainer Randy Bradshaw said Wed. "If he had run well and we finished one-two-three in the Santa Anita Derby, we probably would have gone to Kentucky," Bradshaw said. "But I'm not going to beat my horse up just to go there." The \$500,000 Illinois Derby will be run at 1 1/8-miles at Sportsman's Park May 13, while the \$500,000-added Preakness S., at 1 3/16-miles, will be decided at Pimlico May 20.

When Juddmonte Farms' **Eltish** (Cox's Ridge) ships to the U.S. for his Derby bid, he will remain with trainer Henry Cecil, and will not be under the care of Bobby Frankel, as previously reported.

Trainer Bill Shoemaker said Fine n' Majestic (Majestic Light), winner of the GIII California Derby over the Golden Gate turf last Saturday, is being considered for the Kentucky Derby.

#### MILL RIDGE FARM AND PIN OAK STUD ACQUIRE BREEDING INTERESTS IN VALIANT

NATURE Mill Ridge Farm's Alice Chandler and Pin Oak Stud's Josephine Abercrombie yesterday announced a stallion agreement in which Verne H. Winchill's Valiant Nature (His Majesty) will stand at Mill Ridge Farm upon retirement from racing. Winner of the Grade I Hollywood Futurity at two, Valiant Nature is currently recuperating at Mill Ridge Farm from surgery performed for a condular fracture. The four-year-old colt, who in only eight career starts has also placed in four graded stakes including the GII Blue Grass and GII San Felipe, has earnings to date of \$466,500.

FLORIDA DERBY DAY SET FOR '96 The Florida Derby will be run on the closing day of the 1996 Gulfstream meeting, the track announced yesterday. The March 16, 1996 date "appears to be ideal," said Gulfstream President Doug Donn. "It is a week later in the Gulfstream season and will permit the trainers extra time to prepare their horses. Our 1996 racing dates (Jan. 3-March 16) enable us to close on a Saturday, making the later running of the Florida Derby possible." The purse for the nine-furlong, Grade I race will again be \$500,000.

AUTOTOTE STOCK DROPS Autotote stock was one of the largest percentage decliners on the Nasdag exchange yesterday, dipping 20 percent after the company said it expected its second-quarter loss to be roughly the same as the \$5.9 million loss sustained in the first quarter. In the year's first quarter, the company reported a loss of \$0.21 per share on 28.8 million shares, compared to a loss of \$103,000 on 28 million shares in the year-earlier period. Autotote reported that an increase in expenditures is significantly related to the ongoing investments and expenses made by the company to further secure its core business and to support acquisitions made in 1994. The company said that a task force of senior executives would be charged with devising and implementing a cost-reduction program. Also, based on meetings with the company's bank group, Autotote expects its banks to issue a waiver by the end of April with regard to compliance by the company with the covenants in its credit agreement relative to its first-quarter performance. A similar waiver was granted by the bank group following the close of the company's most recent fiscal year Oct. 31, 1994.
