The track cancelled racing the past two days out of respect for the victims who were injured or killed, and the rescue crews, law enforcement personnel and multitude of volunteers who worked so valiantly following the tragic explosion at the Federal Building in downtown Oklahoma City Wednesday. "We obviously sympathize with all the families who have been so tragically impacted by this awful event," said Remington Park Executive VP David Vance Thursday. "We realize we're in the entertainment business, and over the last few days nobody has felt like being entertained, but at some point we have to try to return to a normal routine. We'll start tomorrow, but realize it will be a long time before this community is back to normal." Remington Park has scheduled a blood drive for today and racing fans are encouraged to join with track employees in donating blood.

NYS RACING AND WAGERING BOARD CHANGES EQUINE DRUG POSITIVE POLICY

Chairman Joseph P. Neglia of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board announced following Wednesday's board meeting that in order to protect the reputation and privacy rights of trainers, the Board will no longer make any public announcements of equine drug positives until trainers are given responsible opportunities to have independent tests of the split samples. If a trainer has a sample retested, no announcement of the equine drug positive will be made until such time as there is a confirmation of the initial drug positive. The Board also approved a contract between the Las Vegas Dissemination Company and the New York Racing Association under which the bets at Nevada race books would now be commingled with on-track pools. By encouraging wagering on New York races, the agreement helps New York tracks compete with other tracks for the burgeoning interstate market.

Chapple-Hyam has been in contact with Horse America, an equine transporter based in New York, according to Mike Hargrave, stall superintendent at Churchill. Hargrave said the plans are in the developing stages. Citadeed, a Kentucky-bred colt who has raced only in England and France, finished third in the \$43,746 European Free H. at Newmarket Wednesday in his first start since November.

Petionville (Seeking the Gold) worked a half-mile over Hollywood's fast main track yesterday in :47 3/5.

In Japan, **Ski Captain** (Storm Bird) worked a half-mile on his uphill training track in :54 4/5 Wed. at the Ritto Training Center. His next work is scheduled for Sunday, April 23. Wed., April 26, the colt will move to Japan Racing Association's Miho Training Center, where plans call for him to work Monday, May 1.

"She's doing pretty good," said Jerkens. "Her last work was about five-eighths and she went in a minute." Sky Beauty also made her '94 debut in the seven-furlong Vagrancy, winning by three lengths in 1:21 3/5.

AUSTRALIAN EASTER YEARLING SALES

RESULTS This year's Australian Easter yearling sales in Sydney, which ended Thursday, were the second best Easter sales on record. The 432 lots sold returned over \$31.2 million for an overall average of \$72,250. The only better sale was in 1989 when trainer Bart Cummings paid AUS\$ 1.5 million for a Biscay colt and the average was over AUS\$ 106,000. Top buyer was trainer Gai Waterhouse, who purchased 34 yearlings for a total outlay of AUS\$ 3.1 million, while the Domeland Pty Ltd Syndicate (made up mainly of people from Hong Kong and Macau) bought 19 vearlings for more than AUS\$ 2.45 million. Waterhouse purchased the sales topper when paying AUS\$ 575,000 for a Danehill colt out of Quarantieme (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}) for Chinese clients. Danehill, now owned outright by Ireland's Coolmore Stud and sire of the recent AUS\$ 2 million Golden Slipper winner Flying Spur, was the top stallion. His 21 lots averaged better than AUS\$ 140,000. There was plenty of international interest in the sale and South African agent Robin Bruss, a frequent buyer at the Sydney sales, paid AUS\$ 754,500 for 12 yearlings, which will go to race in South Africa.

AUTOTOTE TO OPEN SPORTS COMPLEX IN CONNECTICUT Autotote Corporation announced yesterday that it will open a sports and entertainment complex in New Haven, Connecticut April 27 that will offer on-site pari-mutuel betting on virtually every horse racing event in North America. The four-story complex, called Sports Haven, will feature live and continuous coverage of Thoroughbred, harness and greyhound racing from over 40 tracks in the U.S. and Canada. He was, after all, beaten first time out last season." Cecil added that a decision on the Kentucky Derby has not yet been reached. "We are going to put our feet up by the fire and mull the matter over, as there is no point rushing these things," he said. Added Grant Pritchard-Gordon, racing manager for the colt's owner, Prince Khalid Abdullah, "Time may show we were giving weight to two good horses, so Eltish may still go to Churchill Downs. Pat (Eddery) said we shouldn't be too discouraged by this defeat. But obviously, the final decision rests with Prince Khalid." The winner, Munwar, will be pointed for the Lingfield Derby Trial May 13.
