DIFFIDENT TO GUINEAS Diffident (Nureyev), impressive winner of last week's European Free H. at Newmarket, will take his chance against Celtic Swing (GB) (Damister) in the 2000 Guineas May 6. The Sheikh Mohammed-owned colt, a stablemate of second-favourite Pennekamp (Bering {GB}), had been considered more likely to try the French equivalent or be campaigned at sprint distances. But, following an assessment of recent Classic trials, the Sheikh has decided on a two-pronged challenge against Saturday's Greenham S. hero. "Today, the Sheikh has confirmed that, barring unforeseen circumstances, both Diffident and Pennekamp will run in the English 2000 Guineas," the Sheikh's racing manager, Anthony Stroud, said vesterday. Latest betting on the Newmarket Classic is: 8-11 Celtic Swing, 9-2 Pennekamp, 5-1 Diffident, 7-1 Sri Pekan (Red Ransom), 10-1 Bahri (Riverman), 16-1 Painter's Row (Ire) (Royal Academy), 20-1 others.

DOUBTS OVER DISTANT VIEW Distant View (Mr. Prospector), officially rated Europe's top three-year-old miler last season, has suffered an injury which threatens to end his career. The Henry Cecil-trained winner of the '94 GI Sussex S. was found to be lame after a routine workout on Newmarket's gallops. His connections are still evaluating the extent of the injury, but it has already meant withdrawal from his intended 1995 debut in this Friday's GII Sandown Mile and may hasten his retirement to stud. "We are not sure how serious it is yet, but he has some swelling in a tendon," said Cecil. "It may just be bruising. We will have to see what the vets' test show us."

GENUINE RISK IN FOAL TO CHIEF HONCHO Genuine Risk (Exclusive Native), the second filly ever to win the Kentucky Derby who again made headlines

two years ago when she delivered her first live foal at the age of 16, has been pronounced in foal to **Chief Honcho** (Chief's Crown). Barren for '94 and '95, the now-18-year-old mare was bred to the GISW just once, February 19. Her two-year-old, named **Genuine Reward** (Rahy), is currently in training with Bill Mott's Saratoga division, and will be pointed for a career debut at that track this summer or at Belmont Park in the fall.

TRIPLE THREAT NOTES

Eltish (Cox's Ridge) is scheduled to board a plane for Louisville this weekend to keep his date in the May 6 Kentucky Derby, according to Grant Pritchard-Gordon, racing manager for Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms. Despite his third-place finish in Thursday's Feilden S. at Newmarket, "we're making every plan as if we're coming, but it is still subject to final confirmation from the owner," said Pritchard-Gordon. "If everything goes according to plan, he'll ship out this weekend." Pritchard-Gordon also indicated that Eddie Delahoussaye would ride the colt in the Derby. While Corey Nakatani had been mentioned as a possible Derby jockey, Serena's Song's (Rahy) uncertain status had led them to line up another rider.

The Team Lukas filly was out on the sloppy Churchill strip early yesterday morning, breezing six furlongs in 1:15 1/5 with jockey Donna Barton in the saddle. Whether she runs in the Oaks or the Derby, Lukas said, "She's giving every indication she'll be plenty tight." Stable-mate **Timber Country** (Woodman) worked seven furlongs Monday in 1:25 3/5, galloping out the mile in 1:39 4/5. "I was very pleased with the way he got over the track," said his rider, Pat Day. "He looks like a million dollars. He's training well and he's ready to run a big race. He should have a lot to say in the outcome." Lukas charge **Thunder Gulch** (Gulch) was also on Monday's Churchill work tab, going three-quarters in 1:14.

Santa Anita Derby runner-up **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms) went six furlongs 1:14 as well; trainer Richard Mandella was pleased with the move. "The other day we never let him pick it up, but today we let him pick it up at the eighth pole to the wire," he said. "He looked very good--but he always looks good to me. It's a tough field (for the Derby), but I think I'm tough."

Trainer Gary Lewis has received some criticism for sticking with jockey G.F. Almeida for his Derby runner, **Jumron (GB)** (Sharpo {GB}), but he said, "My rider has a lot of talent. I've never had a rider who could tell you more about a horse. The way I see it, I've never been to Louisville, the horse has never been to Louisville, and the rider and the owner have never been here either, so as a team we'll all stick together and have some fun."

LAST WEEK ON THE TRIPLE CROWN TRAIL

Two more Derby contenders emerged from the last major weekend of Derby preps. Dazzling Falls (Taylor's Falls), winner of the Remington Park Derby with blinkers on, made it two in a row with a comfortable victory in the GII Arkansas Derby and will van to Churchill today. As for the rest of the field, runner-up Flitch (Demons Begone) is likely to look for a softer spot. "He is just starting to come together mentally--! think he will be a much better horse later on. I am suggesting to the owners that Flitch pass the Kentucky Derby," said his trainer, Bill Badgett, Jr., who mentioned the Ohio Derby as an alternative. On Target (Forty Niner), third, will head back to California and take a break before getting ready for the Affirmed H. at Hollywood July 2. Mystery Storm (Storm Bird), who suffered his first loss of the year finishing fifth in the race, will skip the Derby but could rejoin the chase later on the trail. "We tried to dance too many dances here," said his trainer, Larry Robideaux Jr., from Oaklawn after the race. "We will van to Louisville--if he bounces back as well as he usually does, we might think about the Preakness." Celestial Star (Risen Star), seventh at Oaklawn, may wish he'd tried a little harder. Said his trainer, Scott Newcomb, "My colt has a lot of ability, but he doesn't have his mind on racing. I am asking Dr. J (owner K.K. Jayaraman) for permission to geld him."

The other Derby candidate from this weekend's racing will be **Mecke** (Maudlin), who will try to become the first Derby winner to use Hialeah's grassy Citation S. as his final prep.

At Keeneland, Star Standard (Risen Star) picked up his first stakes win in the GII Lexington, but trainer Nick Zito has already said the colt will miss the Derby and possibly point for the Preakness instead; that is also the probable plan of trainer Bill Boniface, who saddled Oliver's Twist (Horatius) to victory in the GIII Federico Tesio S. Saturday at Pimlico, although Boniface has not completely ruled out a run for the roses. Western Echo (Eastern Echo), runner-up by a neck in the Tesio, will be going to Sportsman's Park for the May 13 Illinois Derby.

HORSEMEN'S BLOODSTOCK SALE WRAP-UP Horsemen's Bloodstock concluded its inaugural Two-Year-olds in Training Sale at the Classic Mile in Ocala Sunday night, posting an increase in average and a decline in horses not sold over the opening session. Local News: Illinois

Illinois breeders are sharply divided over changes in the state-bred program proposed by Governor Jim Edgar's Task Force on Illinois Racing. The Task Force has recommended the introduction of owners' awards for Illinois-breds finishing on the board in open company allowance races and claiming races with purses of \$10,000 and up; they have also suggested the creation of a stallion stakes program. While advocates argue that these changes would enhance the quality of Illinois racing, the funding of these programs would mean less money for Illinois-bred restricted races and possibly their eventual elimination. Argued Noel Hickey, the leading breeder in Illinois in '92 and '93 and Arlington International Racecourse's top owner in '90-'93, "This will benefit special interest groups and lower the quality of Illinois racing. The Illinois-bred program has long been considered among the nation's best incentive plans for encouraging a healthy perpetuation of our state-breds while luring breeders who might otherwise have chosen other geographic regions."
