OAKLAWN WRAP-UP A crowd of 57,354, highest of the season, was on hand to watch Kentucky Derby hopeful Dazzling Falls take last Saturday's Arkansas Derby on closing day of the 1995 Oaklawn meet. Total handle for the day was a record \$8,400,146, breaking the old mark of \$8,058,243 set on the '94 Arkansas Derby card; total handle for the meet was \$211,354,644, an increase of 9.4 percent over 1994. But while overall handle was up, on-track attendance dropped to its lowest figure in 20 years. Total attendance for the meet was 897,045, an average of 14,239 daily. Citing competition from other gambling venues in the region, Oaklawn General Manager Eric Jackson said, "We anticipated a drop of 10 percent or more this year, so we are not disappointed with the numbers." In the biggest upset of the meeting, jockey Calvin Borel unseated Pat Day as leading rider, booting home 87 winners to Day's 79. It was the first time since 1983 that Day did not take the riding title. Trainer Bobby Barnett, last year's top conditioner, successfully defended his title with 31 winners. Next vear's Oaklawn meet will open January 12, the earliest opening day in the track's history; the '96 Arkansas Derby will be run closing day, April 13, three weeks prior to the Kentucky Derby.

TEN LIKELY TO TACKLE SWING IN

GUINEAS Celtic Swing (Damister), whose reappearance in last Saturday's Greenham S. at Newbury so impressed bookmakers that he is quoted at only 5-1 to complete the English Triple Crown of 2000 Guineas, Epsom Derby and St. Leger, looks set to face 10 rivals in next Saturday's first leg of the trio. Seventeen colts were left in the one-mile Classic at the final forfeit stage, but connections of several have already decided not to take on last year's juvenile champion. The likely contenders are: Bahri (Riverman), Celtic Swing, Chilly Billy (GB) (Master Willie {GB}), Diffident (Nureyev), Nwaamis (Daviur), Painter's Row (Ire) (Royal Academy), Pennekamp (Bering {GB}), Pipe Major (Ire) (Tirol {Ire}), Silca Blanka (Ire) (Law Society) and Sri Pekan (Red Ransom). Twenty-seven fillies were left in the 1000 Guineas, including second-favorite Moonshell (Sadler's Wells), who is one of 23 Godolphin horses expected to fly into Britain from Dubai next Monday.

The five-year-old, who has won his last six outings, was four-for-four in '94, all four victories coming against graded stakes company. "He's doing great," Schosberg said. "He worked about three days ago and went three quarters in 1:12 2/5. As you know, he hasn't been out in a year and he wasn't out that long for emotional reasons. So I'm just happy he's staying sound. We just want to get him back to the races and we do need a stepping stone to the Met Mile."

CALUMET YEARLINGS UP FOR AUCTION

Henryk de Kwiatkowski's Calumet Farm will be selling 36 of its 48 yearlings at public auction this year, according to farm Vice President and Financial Officer Themis Themistocleous. The 36 will be divided among the Keeneland July, Saratoga, and Keeneland September sales. The decision to sell is part of a long-term business plan that will allow Calumet to participate in the commercial breeding market; plans call for Calumet to sell approximately two-thirds of its yearling crop every year, with the remaining third retained for racing and breeding. "Calumet was the leading buyer at the Keeneland November sales in 1992 and 1993, and in 1994 we were the second-leading buyer," said Themistocleous. "Now, with quality and production up, we are ready to take the next step, which is to sell a major portion of each yearling crop commercially."

OBS THIRD SESSION RESULTS Two lots sold for \$75,000 each to top Wednesday's third session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Annual Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. The first, a bay gelding by Synastry--Capable Beauty (Northern Prospect), had been previously sold at the '93 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale as a weanling for \$2,200. Consigned by Ricky Leppala, agent for Elliott Farms, the gelding was purchased by Michael Mollica, agent for Robert and Beverly Lewis. Also bringing \$75,000 was a gray or roan colt by Relaunch--End of Night (*Grey Dawn II). Consigned by Westwind Farm, agent, the colt, who was purchased for \$11,500 earlier this year at the Keeneland January Sale, was bought Wednesday by Exalton Broussard. Overall, 140 two-year-olds were sold for a gross of \$1,977,900 and an average of \$14,128, up 23.7 percent from last year's third session average of \$11,423.

TRA RESTRUCTURES EXECUTIVE

COMMITTEE No major announcement was made following the Thoroughbred Racing Associations board meeting at Keeneland Race Course yesterday, where TRA members once again endorsed commissioner Brian McGrath and the concept of a national office. The TRA members did agree to restructure their executive committee, cutting it from 17 members to five. In an attempt to further progress and a national consensus, one committee member would represent each region of the country. After arriving at a consensus within their respective regions, the five representatives would attempt to formulate a national plan.

STRONG FIRST QUARTER FOR SANTA ANITA

COMPANIES Citing increased revenue from wagering commissions and reduced operating costs, The Santa Anita Companies vesterday announced an 11 percent increase in combined income for the first quarter of 1995 and record wagering levels for the recently completed Winter meet. The total combined income for the first guarter, which ended March 31, was \$6,780,000 or \$.61 a share, as compared to \$6,107,000 or \$.55 a share for the prior year quarter. "The impact of full-card Califonia and out-ofstate simulcasts has been extremely positive," said Stephen F. Keller, chairman of the board, who added, "We are moving forward aggressively with our strategic plan to develop a major entertainment and retail center adjacent to the racetrack on our Arcadia property." Pending approval of the City Council of Arcadia, The Santa Anita Companies plans to begin construction of the project in 1996.
