SALE A two-year-old daughter of Star de Naskra--Fifi La Boom Boom (Majestic Light), consigned by Kirkwood Stables as agent, brought a bid of \$43,000 from David R. Jacobs to top Fasig-Tipton's Two-Year-Olds in Training and Horses of Racing Age Sale in Lexington. A total of 64 two-year-olds were sold for \$857,600, down slightly from last year's sale when 57 juveniles grossed \$876,700. The '95 average of \$13,400 was down 12.8 percent from 1994's figure of \$15,381. There were also 17 horses of racing age sold Sunday evening; the '95 gross of \$157,600 showed a dip of 22.2 percent over last year. The average, \$9,271, was down 35.9 percent over 1994.

ILLINOIS RACING BOARD ADDRESSES DERBY

ISSUE The Illinois Racing Board will hold an emergency meeting this afternoon to vote on a request submitted by the National Jockey Club which would allow all licensed betting facilities in Illinois other than Balmoral Park and Maywood Park to accept wagers on interstate simulcasts from Churchill Downs. Churchill, currently involved in a dispute with Balmoral and Maywood, has blocked its signal, including that of this Saturday's Kentucky Derby, to Illinois as long as those two tracks are receiving the simulcast.

Lake George (Vice Regent) worked six furlongs in 1:15 Monday with jockey Shane Sellers up. "He was nice and settled the first part and finished well," said his trainer, Mike Orman. "The farther he goes, the better he likes it. He's trained great here and I think he'll be competitive."

Mecke (Maudlin) arrived from Florida Sunday night; new jockey Robbie Davis will have the mount for the Derby.

Japanese runner **Ski Captain** (Storm Bird) is scheduled to fly in to Chicago today.
