FRANKEL, BAILEY LEAD 'HALL'

INDUCTEES Trainer Bobby Frankel and jockey Jerry Bailey will be inducted into Racing's Hall of Fame in Saratoga Springs, New York August 7, it was announced yesterday. Frankel, who has won over 1,500 races and earned over \$64 million in purses, and Bailey, who has won over 3,400 races and over \$100 million in purses, will share the spotlight with this year's equine inductees, who include: **Foolish Pleasure** (What a Pleasure), the undefeated two-year-old champion of 1974 who went on to win 16 of 26 starts and \$1,216,705, including the Kentucky Derby; **La Prevoyante** (Buckpasser), Horse of the Year in her native Canada as a 2-year-old as well as the juvenile filly Eclipse winner in North America in 1972; and **Crusader** (Man o' War) as the horse of yesteryear, who was named Horse of the Year in 1926 after winning nine stakes including the Belmont S., Jockey Club Gold Cup and Suburban H.

OJC APPROVES AGREEMENT TO SELL

GREENWOOD An agreement to sell Greenwood Racetrack in Toronto was approved yesterday by the Board of Trustees of The Ontario Jockey Club. The property is being sold to EMM Financial Corp., which is controlled by developers Marco Muzzo and Fred DeGasperis. The transaction was arranged by DS Marcil Inc. acting as financial advisor to the OJC. "The sale of Greenwood is in the best interests of the horse racing industry in Ontario," said Mr. Pat Keenan, president and CEO of the OJC. "This transaction will allow The Ontario Jockey Club to reduce its unacceptably high debt levels and to concentrate its effort to develop, at its racetracks, a world class horseracing entertainment product." Mr. Keenan pointed out that the agreement provides for the continued operation of the existing Champions Off-Track wagering facility at Greenwood. The continued operation of this off-track wagering facility, which employs 250 people and accounts for 15 percent of all wagering in Ontario, is critical to the ongoing financial viability of the Ontario horse racing industry and its 28,000 jobs. The agreement also specifies that the site will not be developed with single user buildings commonly referred to as "big box" retail operations.

Blue Tusmani, the Highweight Colt at 2 in Italy, won 2 stakes and was graded stakes placed in Italy last year. Making his first start outside that country and off the turf and coming off a 7-month hiatus, the chestnut colt was pinched back at the start, raced far back for a half-mile, rapidly gained while circling five-wide into the lane, drew on even terms with the leaders in midstretch then prevailed in a hard drive for his first graded stakes victory. "I know that this horse has potential but I never knew he would run such a big race today; he really surprised me," said winning jockey Jose Santos. "I think the best thing that could have happened to him was getting shut out of the gate; I just wanted him to get comfortable. When I made my move at the half-mile I knew I was in good shape. He really finished strong. He is a good horse." Trainer Christophe Clement added, "We will wait to see how he comes out of this and most likely go in the Peter Pan." Also likely for the Peter Pan is runner-up Pat N Jac.

Last year's Champion Older Mare Sky Beauty, who took the '94 Vagrancy H. in 1:21 3/5, has improved with age. Returning from a 6-month layoff, she broke slowly under regular rider Mike Smith, raced up close along the rail, was eased back to be 4th and last on the far turn, angled four wide while rallying into the stretch then drew away in hand. "I'm pleased, how could I not be especially when everyone's been winning on the rail today and she comes on the outside, around everyone pretty easily," said winning trainer H. Allen Jerkens. "She's a nice filly and I'm glad to have her back. I was a little worried that we were giving away weight and this being her first race back, but she's a good filly." When asked what's next for Sky Beauty, Jerkens replied, "The Shuvee Handicap (Saturday, May 20) will be next. I know Heavenly Prize will be running in there and it will be a tough race."

KENTUCKY DERBY NOTES:

Japan's first Derby horse, **Ski Captain** (Storm Bird), along with trainer Hideyuki Mori, arrived at Louisville's Standiford Field airport at 12:45 Wednesday morning and was bedded down in the Churchill quarantine barn by 1:45 a.m. The required bloodwork was done when Ski Captain cleared customs in Chicago. The colt's connections were optimistic he would clear quarantine by Thursday morning.

Eltish (Cox's Ridge) cleared quarantine Tuesday afternoon and celebrated with a jog around Churchill's main track Wed. morning. "There was one turn where he shied away a little bit, but it was his first time," said Paul Morgan, who was aboard. Grant Pritchard-Gordon, racing manager for Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms, said the Prince has been looking for a Derby horse for a long time. "It's the goal of every horseman to win the Kentucky Derby," he said. "We've just been waiting for the right horse."

Europe's other Derby hopeful, **Citadeed** (Shadeed), who has never been on the dirt and never been beyond seven furlongs, will likely be ridden by jockey Eddie Maple, according to the colt's connections.

Knockadoon (Dixieland Band) worked a half-mile in :48 1/5 yesterday at Churchill Downs, galloping out 5/8ths in 1:02 1/5, pleasing trainer Tony Reinstedler. "A lot of people don't realize that he doesn't have a jock on his back. We're talking about a 150-pound exercise boy," said Reinstedler.

Mecke (Maudlin) worked 1/2-mile in :47 2/5 for trainer Manny Tortora. "He worked really good, well within himself," said Tortora. "He looks like a million and really seems to have done well since he arrived here."

FLORIDA BREEDERS' CUP BILL ON THE MOVE

A full vote by the Florida State Senate passed a bill to bring the Breeders' Cup back to the state 36-1 Tuesday. Attached to the Breeders' Cup bill is an amendment proposed by Hialeah to alternate the prime winter dates between Gulfstream Park and Hialeah. The same version of the Breeders' Cup bill on the House side doesn't have a dates amendment. Passed out of the Appropriations Committee May 2, it is waiting to go the House floor for a vote. Said Representative Steve Geller (D-Hallandale), "A Breeders' Cup bill with (Hialeah) racing dates will not become law in the state of Florida. If the (House) Breeders' Cup bill is amended to include racing dates, I will ask the bill not be heard." If the Breeders' Cup bill passes a vote of the House, it will go to a committee of House and Senate members who will either add the dates amendment to the House bill or remove it from the Senate bill. The revised bill would then be sent back for a full vote.

DERBY SIGNAL TO ILLINOIS A Kentucky Derby simulcast blackout in Illinois was averted after the Chicago-area harness tracks--Balmoral Park and Maywood Park--agreed to hold what Illinois Racing Board Chairman Gary Starkman referred to as "good-faith" negotiations next week. At issue is full-card simulcasting at a Merrillville, Indiana off-track betting parlor partially owned by Churchill Downs and located 20 miles from Balmoral, which has a limited year-round harness racing schedule. Balmoral contends that the Merrillville facility is in violation of the Federal Interstate Horse Racing Act that mandates off-track betting sites to obtain the consent of all operating tracks within 60 miles. Balmoral last month halted Sportsman's Park simulcasts to the Indiana facility and Churchill retaliated by withholding last Saturday's Derby Trial and threatening to do the same with the Kentucky Derby because it had no contract with Balmoral and Maywood. Although Sportsman's has a simulcast agreement with Churchill, racing rules in Illinois would have required it to offer its entire program to every inter-track and OTB location in the state, including the two harness tracks. Sportsman's asked for the emergency meeting of the racing board and the board's inner session led to the scheduled reopening of negotiations between Balmoral/Maywood and Churchill and the lifting of the Derby blackout.
