"GAL" CAUSES RUCKUS IN OAKS Gal In A Ruckus (Bold Ruckus), a rank outsider in yesterday's Kentucky Oaks field at odds of 34-1, shocked the crowd at Churchill with a frontrunning score over the overwhelming 1-5 favorite Urbane (Citidancer). The winner vied for the lead early with 26-1 Forested (Country Pine); Urbane's chances were compromised when she tried to split the pacesetters on the far turn and had to be steadied in tight quarters. "(Jerry) Bailey's horse (Forested) came out and hit me," said Urbane's rider, Eddie Delahoussaye. "He caught her back legs and made me drop back. It was bad racing luck, that's all. I was surprised she regained herself-that kick stopped her pretty good. But I still don't know if I'd have beaten that other filly." Urbane did make a move at the leader once clear, but could not threaten and had to settle for second. Said winning trainer John Ward, "I'm elated--I'm not shocked. She's been really good here all week. I tried to walk her this morning and after one turn I had to put her up. She was really ready." Ward and winning owner John Oxley will try to pull another upset today in the Derby with their entry of Pyramid Peak (Mt. Livermore) and Jambalaya Jazz (Dixieland Band). "This is my biggest win as of today," said Oxley. "We hope we can top it (Saturday)." The Kentucky Oaks chart is on page 3.

SKI CAPTAIN DISPUTE POSTPONED U.S. District Judge Henry Wilhoit delayed ruling in the ownership dispute of Derby hopeful Ski Captain (Storm Bird) between the Yoshida family and Brownell Combs, former president of Spendthrift Farm, in Lexington Federal Court Friday. Combs had asked to take possession of the colt, scheduled to become Japan's first Kentucky Derby starter, as part of a potential legal judgement he seeks against the family. Wilhoit said he wasn't sure whether Ski Captain was worth enough to satisfy the \$3 million Combs claims he is owed.

TDN ANALYSIS
By Bill Finley

Ninety-five percent of all Kentucky Derby winners have had three things going for them: an ability to handle the distance; proven form as a two-year-old; a sharp race just prior to the Derby. Of the horses that qualify this year, Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}) is the most exciting. Though racing in relatively minor stakes at two, his form was creditable. There may be concern about his breeding since he is by an English sprinter, but he has the necessary dosage index and appears to be a horse who can handle any distance. The best thing about him is his last race, an exceptional performance in the Santa Anita Derby. Over a surface that was strongly speed-biased, Jumron closed from nearly eight lengths behind to just miss winning it all. He may have been the best horse that day; we're picking him to be the best horse in the Kentucky Derby.

The only knock against **Talkin Man** (With Approval) is the competition he faced in the Gotham and Wood Memorial. But it would have been impossible for him to do any more than he did; only Secretariat wins by 31 lengths. Talkin Man can stalk Serena's Song, is likely to get an outstanding trip and clearly has the ability to win it all.

Our third choice, **Serena's Song** (Rahy), answered all the questions about beating the boys in the Jim Beam. In a race with relatively little early speed, she is capable of a wire-to-wire victory. The connections of Talkin Man, Wild Syn and Afternoon Deelites have all said they're taking their horses back, so expect Serena's Song to get a comfortable trip on the lead.

The bet: Key Jumron first and second in exactas with Talkin Man, Serena's Song/Timber Country entry, Eltish (Cox's Ridge) and Tejano Run (Tejano).

The Derby telecast begins with the Kentucky Derby Special from 12 noon to 2:00 p.m. on ESPN, and continues on ESPN2 from 2:00-4:30 p.m. The Derby will be televised live on ABC-TV from 4:30 to 6:00 p.m.; post time is set for 5:31 p.m. (All times are EDT).

"It seemed he enjoyed the track," said Delahoussaye. "He's got a good turn of foot. Henry Cecil is a great trainer and I'm sure he brought him here fit. He felt very strong. He switched leads great. He rides like an American horse. Glides over the ground." Cecil added, "He's a stronger, better horse than when we came to the Breeders' Cup. A little luck is all we need."

Blue Grass winner **Wild Syn** (Wild Again) galloped 1 1/2-miles Friday. The colt was asked to pick up the pace down the stretch and trainer Tom Arnemann caught the quarter mile in :26. "He's lazy without another horse," Arnemann said. "The time was not important."
