NYRA SIMULCAST TO MONMOUTH AND

MEADOWLANDS Monmouth Park and the Meadow-lands will begin full-card simulcasting of the races from Belmont Park this Wednesday under an agreement reached between the New Jersey Sports Authority and the New York Racing Association. "This is an important step in the growth of a positive relationship between New York and New Jersey racing," said Hal Handel, Vice President of Racing for the Sport Authority. "Our players have long been followers of the New York product and it should serve as a strong part of our simulcast mix." Sports Authority officials are hopeful that the next step will be to allow the New Jersey simulcast signal, both Thoroughbred and harness, into New York on a regular basis.

REMINGTON WRAP-UP Remington Park closed out its 1995 Spring Meet with a tremendous gain in simulcasting handle but declines in both on-track attendance and on-track handle. A total of 380,668 patrons passed through the turnstiles during the 61-day meeting which ended Sunday, wagering \$54,589,210 ontrack. But an aggressive full-card simulcasting network brought in an additional \$10,366,942, an increase of 119 percent over last year's simulcast handle of \$4,101,922. A bill passed in the Oklahoma senate in April will now allow off-track wagering in 12 Oklahoma counties. Said the track's Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer David Vance, "The passage of Bill 450 will allow us to grow our product. We are all very encouraged about the possibilities that this bill provides us." Remington's all-time leading trainer Donnie Von Hemel took his eighth title at the meet, saddling 34 winners, 13 more than runner-up Joe Lucas. Jockey Tim Doocy picked up his second consecutive riding title and his third in four seasons with 72 wins. R. E. Caston and John Franks tied for meetleading owner with 10 victories apiece.

ON TO THE PREAKNESS

Nine of the 19 Kentucky Derby starters are listed as either possible or probable for the second leg of the Triple Crown. D. Wayne Lukas will ship winner Thunder Gulch (Gulch) and Timber Country (Woodman), 3rd, to Pimlico Wednesday, May 17. Lukas has saddled the winners of the last three Triple Crown events, beginning with Tabasco Cat's Preakness and Belmont wins last year. He would join Lucien Lauren, conditioner of Classic winners Riva Ridge and Secretariat, as only the second trainer to send out the winners of four straight Triple Crown races with a win in the Preakness.

Originally expected to bypass the Preakness, **Jumron** (GB) (Sharpo {GB}), fourth in the Derby, is now listed as possible and could also ship to Maryland May 17. Both of the English runner are likely to take a crack at the Black Eyed Susans. **Citadeed** (Shadeed), 9th, will van to Pimlico tomorrow; **Eltish** (Cox's Ridge), 6th, is also expected to run.

Mecke (Maudlin), 5th, returned to Florida Sunday night. He came out of the race in good shape and will make his next start in either the Preakness or the grassy Jersey Derby. The connections of both Talkin Man (With Approval) and In Character (GB) (Never So Bold {GB}) have expressed interest in the trip to Maryland. Ken McPeek, trainer of runner-up Tejano Run (Tejano) will wait before making a final decision.

Colts joining the Triple Crown trail at Pimlico will be Oliver's Twist (Horatius), winner of the GIII Federico Tesio S.; GSW Mystery Storm (Storm Bird); Derby Trial victor Peaks And Valleys (Mt. Livermore); Star Standard (Risen Star); Western Echo (Eastern Echo); and Louisiana Derby winner Petionville (Seeking the Gold).

Two colts who had been listed as possible will now skip the Preakness: **Ski Captain** (Storm Bird) will head to New York or possibly back to Japan; **Afternoon Deelites** (Private Terms) returns to California.
