EUROPE'S CLASSIC FILLIES MAKE PLANS

Plans for Sunday's 1,000 Guineas winner Harayir (Gulch) appear to be revolving around the mile events rather than a crack at the Epsom Oaks. "The final decision rests with Sheikh Hamdan," said Angus Gold, racing manager to owner Hamdan Al Maktoum, "but I think it is unlikely Harayir will run in the Oaks. My feeling is that she'll stick to a mile for now, with the Irish 1,000 Guineas an obvious target." Meanwhile, Hoh Magic (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), fourth in the English 1,000, will point for Sunday's Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp on just one week's rest. Trainer Michael Bell said he has no doubts the filly has recovered quickly enough to take in another G1 contest, "Hoh Magic came out of the race 100 percent," said Bell. "We are keen to have a crack at the French Guineas. It gives us a six-week gap before the Coronation S. at Royal Ascot." Her scheduled opposition at Longchamp: Matiara (Bering {GB}), Shaanxi (Zilzal) and Carling (Fr) (Garde Royale {Ire}), the first three home in last months G3 Prix de la Grotte over the same course and distance, as well as Smolensk (Danzig) and Take Liberties (GB) (Warning {GB}). Fairy Path (Irish River {Fr}), badly hampered when sixth of nine in the Grotte, is also possible for the race.

TRIPLEPRINT DERBY TRIAL FIELD TAKES

SHAPE Munwar (GB) (Kalaglow {Ire}), who defeated Kentucky Derby sixth Eltish when winning last month's Feilden S. at Newmarket, will head the field in this Saturday's G3 Tripleprint Derby Trial at Lingfield in England. Munwar, now quoted the 7-1 second choice behind Pennekamp for the Epsom Derby, is likely to find his strongest challenge from Balliol Boy (GB) (Nashwan), a promising third in the G3 Thresher Classic Trial at Sandown in his 1995 debut last month. The Henry Cecil camp feels Balliol Boy has trained well since his last race. But Munwar's trainer Peter Walwyn said, "I think they'll be more worried about us than we are about them. I'm very happy with my horse and Lingfield is the right choice for him. He won't mind the ground--he is the best mover you'll ever see--and when I walked the course last week it looked good." Also entered were Commoner (Far North), Henry Koehler (GB) (Hadeer {GB}), In Camera (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Lancer (Diesis {GB}), Posidonas (GB) (Slip Anchor {GB}) and Riyadian (GB) (Polish Precedent).

Saturday, Pimlico Race Course:

PIMLICO SPECIAL-GI, \$600,000, 4yo/up, 1 3/16m Cigar (Palace Music), Concern (Broad Brush) and Devil His Due (Devil's Bag), who have combined to win 10 Grade I events, top a field of six pre-entered for the 30th running of the Pimlico Special, Allen Paulson's Cigar, whose six-race winning streak includes GI victories in the NYRA Mile, Donn H., Gulfstream Park H. and Oaklawn H., will carry high weight of 122 pounds. Concern, who finished third to Cigar in the Oaklawn H. last out, has been assigned 121 pounds. Devil His Due (Devil's Bag), the second-leading active money winner with \$3,800,405 in earnings, comes into the race off a fourth-place finish in the GII Excelsior H. at Aqueduct April 22. The six-year-old, who will also tote 121 pounds, won the Pimlico Special in 1993 and was second to As Indicated in last year's renewal. Kissin Kris (Kris S.), fourth in the Feb. 11 Donn H. in his most recent effort, receives a substantial break in the weights and will carry only 111 pounds. The fiveyear-old has not visited the winners' circle since taking the '93 GI Haskell Invitational H. A pair of local campaigners round out the field. Dixie Hero (Dixieland Band), winner of the Native Dancer H. at Laurel in January, has been assigned 113 pounds. Eight-year-old gelding Frugal Doc (Baederwood), who took a pair of \$50,000 claiming events at Pimlico and Laurel in his last two starts, will be making his 92nd career outing in the Pimlico Special; the twotime stakes winner will carry low weight of 107.

PREAKNESS NOTES:

Two colts have joined the list of probable starters for the May 20 Preakness S. **Our Gatsby** (Strike Gold), second to Peaks And Valleys in the GIII Derby Trial, will arrive at Pimlico this weekend, according to trainer Donnie Von Hemel. The colt is 4-for-8, including a win in the Great West S. at Remington Park. **Itron** (Quick Style), a Texas-bred who has won nine of 15 starts, will also point to the Preakness. "The owner has always dreamed of running in a classic," said trainer Roy Frazier. "We couldn't get him ready for the Derby, but we plan on coming for the Preakness." Itron, a four-time stakes-winner, was most recently seventh in the April 22 Cascaron S. at Retama Park.

Eltish (Cox's Ridge), originally expected to ship to Pimlico, will instead leave Churchill Downs Tuesday to return to England. Fellow British import Citadeed (Shadeed) will head to Baltimore Tuesday, while Ski Captain (Storm Bird) will ship to New York with plans to skip the Preakness to prepare for the June 10 Belmont S.

Remaining at Churchill until Wed., May 17, when they are booked on a Baltimore-bound flight, are Derby winner Thunder Gulch (Gulch), Timber Country (Woodman), Jumron (GB) (Sharpo {GB}) and Talkin Man (With Approval). The latter two are still considered only possible starters. Jumron, who sustained a gash just above the heel on his left foreleg along with other superficial cuts, was treated with antibiotics and is recovering.

Trainer Dick Mandella said Afternoon Deelites (Private Terms) showed a flareup of pharyngitis following the race; he leaves for California today.
