CORDERO WANTS ONE MORE RIDE According to today's New York Daily News, Angel Cordero Jr, who has not ridden since Jan. 12, 1992 when he suffered near-fatal injuries in a spill at Aqueduct, intends to ride in at least one more race--preferably Breeders' Cup day. Cordero told the Daily News that he missed riding in 'big days' and intends to ride in the Breeders' Cup, with a possible Super Saturday or Breeders' Cup Preview Day (at Belmont Park) warm-up. Cordero has undertaken an exercise program and has dieted down to 115 pounds. The accident required the removal of his spleen and prompted a May 7, '92 announcement of his retirement, but left Cordero unsettled with his forced exit. "That's not the way you should go out," he told the Daily News. "I want to retire after the wire--not before the wire. It would be like Michael Jordan retiring after missing the last shot in a big game." Cordero, now a trainer, could either ride his own horse or surrender his trainer's license just long enough to ride to ride a horse trained by someone else. He stressed he has no intention of coming back full-time.

HIALEAH DENIES UNDERPAYMENT John Brunetti, chairman of the Board of Hialeah, sent a letter to the Florida HBPA yesterday in which he 'categorically' denied any misconduct or breach of contract in the March 16, 1995 agreement between Hialeah and the horsemen. Brunetti charged that the horsemen had failed to fill Hialeah's daily racing programs and warned of legal action should the horsemen make good on their threats to halt simulcasting at the South Florida track. The Florida HBPA had threatened to stop incoming and outgoing simulcast wagering if purse levels were not raised to the contractually agreed upon \$103,000 per day, claiming that Hialeah had underpaid purses for the first five weeks of the meet. Hialeah has since instituted two purse raises, but the horsemen remain unsatisfied, claiming that additional revenues from a simulcast clause in the contract should mean a daily purse structure of \$123,000. "Hialeah can no longer be held hostage to such a conspiracy and must seek its remedies, wherever they may be found," said Brunetti.

REFERENDUM GOES TO ARLINGTON The inquiry into Arlington International Racecourse's photofinish victory in the Arlington Heights non-binding referendum--asking if there should be a casino at the racetrack--has ended. The anti-casino group, Concerned Citizens for Self-Determination, has been financially unable to meet the filing deadline for a complete recount of the ballots. The result stands with Arlington the victor by 38 votes. Members of the anti-casino group suggested that marked documents and ballots in two other precincts, if challenged in court, would swing the margin into a 114-vote defeat for Arlington. "We are pleased that we proved our point that the results of the election do not indicate a mandate for a casino at Arlington Racetrack," said Mark Gruhlke, a member of the group. The Illinois legislature hasn't given any indication that it is preparing to increase the number of riverboat casino licenses in the state beyond the present statutory limit of 10.

NEW THOROUGHBRED TRACK OPENS IN **DOMINICAN REPUBLIC** Equus Gaming Company L.P. of Maryland announced that its affiliate, Galapagos S.A., commemorated the grand opening of Quinto Centenario, a new government-owned Thoroughbred race track in the Dominican Republic, Saturday, April 29. Dominican Republic President Dr. Joaquin Balaguer greeted a crowd estimated at 15,300 with the grandstand and third-floor jockey club filled to capacity. The six-race card produced a record one-day handle for racing in the Dominican Republic. Galapagos has the exclusive franchise to operate Quinto Centenario, which is located near the Dominican capital of Santo Domingo. The franchise also provides Galapagos with the exclusive right to develop off-track betting agencies for Quinto Centenario and rights to all simulcasting of horse racing within the nation of 7.5 million people. Built at an estimated cost of \$40 million, the new track replaces an aging facility.
