The gelding hasn't raced since suffering a condylar fracture of the left front ankle when third to Lure and Paradise Creek in the GII Bernard Baruch H. last August 12. "They put two screws in the ankle," said his trainer, Leo O'Brien, who was injured himself last Sunday when a horse he was saddling at Belmont knocked him to the ground, breaking his right shoulder. "Once they do that, he's supposed to be as good as ever. We gave him a nice, long vacation in Florida and he went back into training two months ago. He's been very enthusiastic about his training. He gives you everything he's got in the mornings just like he does in the afternoons, and those kind of horses are rare." As for his own mishap, O'Brien said, "It's okay--I'm a lefty." Fourstardave will be making his 94th career start in the Kingston; the chestnut has won 21 races, including 13 stakes, and earned \$1,626,641.

OJC ANNOUNCES PURSE HIKE Pat Keenan, President and CEO of The Ontario Jockey Club, yesterday announced a five percent increase in purses for both harness and Thoroughbred races. The raise will become effective Wednesday, May 17 for Thoroughbred racing and Friday, May 19 for harness racing. Said Keenan, "This increase...is a direct result of the growth of our Champions off-track wagering network and the aggressive marketing of our simulcast product in Canada and the United States. When we started Champions we had one outlet. Now we have 24 in the greater Metro Toronto area and they are contributing greatly to revenues."

HICKEY SUSPENSION UPHELD Citing the "wide discretionary powers" of the Illinois Racing Board, Cook County Circuit Court Judge Thomas Durkin yesterday upheld owner/trainer Noel Hickey's one-year suspension, imposed last year after six of his horses tested positive for Albuterol. Arlington International Racecourse stewards originally suspended Hickey for six months, but increased the penalty to a year after he lodged an appeal. Hickey, who has won three trainer titles and four owner titles since Arlington reopened in 1989, said he will appeal Judge Durkin's decision in the First District Appellate Court of Illinois.

ST. LOUIS RIVERBOAT FOR DUCHOSSOIS It

remains to be seen if the Illinois legislature will give Arlington International Racecourse owner Dick Duchossois the "racing industry" riverboat casino that he covets for his track. However, it appears that he is going to get a riverboat casino on the Missouri side of the Mississippi River, off St. Louis. The St. Louis City Commission has chosen the \$80 million complex proposed by Duchossois and his son, Craig, and two other Chicago-based investors, the Hyatt Corporation and Levy Restaurants. The next steps in the process are winning the approval of the St. Louis Board of Aldermen and the Missouri Gaming Commission. Although the St. Louis riverboat will be located 350 miles southwest of Arlington International, it is expected to have a negative impact on Illinois racing. Duchossois' boat will be competing for gambling dollars with Fairmount Park, just across the Mississippi River in Collinsville, Illinois.
