MISTER BAILEYS GOES TO INSURANCE

UNDERWRITERS Mister Baileys (Robellino), whose stallion career at Britain's National Stud in Newmarket has so far been thwarted by ill-health, is now the property of insurance underwriters. Last year's 2000 Guineas winner, unable to cover mares this spring after being stricken by a life-threatening bout of grass sickness, continues to make progress. But Paul Venner, who campaigned the colt, and the Stud, which purchased a share in him when he retired from racing, have taken a payment of infertility insurance, thus giving ownership to Italian underwriters Assicuazion Generali.

TOMMY TROTTER HEADED FOR CHICAGO Hawthorne Race Course President Tom Carey has hired Tommy Trotter to serve as his assistant at the track's 1995 fall/winter meet, September 7 through December 31. Trotter, who in the past has been director of racing and racing secretary at many of the nation's leading tracks from coast to coast, will be in charge of horsemen's relations as well as recruiting stables. In addition, he will continue to serve as a steward at Keeneland and Gulfstream Park.

MOONAX BACK FOR `TEAM DUBAI' Last year's longshot Doncaster St. Leger winner, Moonax (Caerleon), successful in the Classic at 40-1, will make his four-year-old debut in Thursday's G2 Yorkshire Cup at a mile and six furlongs. Trained in 1994 by Barry Hills, the colt is now being handled by Saeed bin Suroor, head of Sheikh Mohammed's Dubai-based Godolphin team. This past Sunday, the former Dubai policeman sent out the winners of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains in France (Vettori), G1 Yasuda Kinen in Japan (Heart Lake {GB}) and G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica in Italy (Flagbird).

Derby winner Thunder Gulch (Gulch) worked five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 under jockey Donna Barton at Churchill yesterday, while stablemate Timber Country (Woodman) went the same distance in :59 4/5 under regular rider Pat Day. Said Day of the Eclipse Award winner's breeze, "He seemed a little more enthusiastic, more responsive. He came back on his toes. This is the best he's been this spring. He's a big, old laid-back colt--he's just starting to wake up and get competitive."

PANA BRASS, STAR STANDARD TO PREAKNESS

Pana Brass (Dixieland Band), recently imported from Panama by owner Robert Perez, joins the field. A late nominee to the Triple Crown, the Kentucky-bred was three-for-five in Panama. Trained by Alfredo Callejas, he will ship from New York Wednesday. Trainer Nick Zito has also confirmed GII Lexington S. winner Star Standard (Risen Star) for the race. The colt, who will be ridden by Chris McCarron, earned his Preakness ticket with a bullet five furlongs in :59 1/5 at Belmont Saturday; he arrives in Maryland today.

CHURCHILL CONTINGENT DUE WEDNESDAY

Five Preakness contenders will fly from Churchill to Pimlico Wednesday: Thunder Gulch, Timber Country, Talkin Man (With Approval), Our Gatsby (Strike Gold) and Mecke (Maudlin).

PREAKNESS WORK SCHEDULE

Mecke will work at Churchill Tuesday before flying out the following day. Fellow shipper Talkin Man is set for an easy breeze at Pimlico Thursday. "I certainly hope that he got something out of his race in the Derby that will advance him," said his trainer, Roger Attfield, adding, "I think he'll like 'Maryland, My Maryland' better than 'My Old Kentucky Home'." Mystery Storm (Storm Bird) will work five furlongs this morning. Citadeed (Shadeed) is also scheduled for a Tuesday workout.

CHURCHILL REPORTS FIRST-OUARTER

FIGURES Churchill Downs Incorporated yesterday announced results for the first quarter, which ended March 31. While the company historically incurs a net loss during the first quarter of the fiscal year due to the seasonal nature of the business, the figures for this year were stronger than last; Churchill reported a consolidated net loss of \$1,772,277, or \$.47 a share in '95 as compared to a loss of \$2,204,791, or \$.58 a share in '94. First quarter revenues, bolstered by the simulcast handle from Churchill's new subsidiary, Hoosier Park, L.P., were \$8,612,607 versus \$2,426,032 in '94; the increase was offset by expenses primarily due to the operations of Hoosier Park and its off-site wagering facility.

Shemaran (Kahyasi), who was to have represented the Aga Khan in next month's Epsom Derby, will miss the Classic. His trainer was clearly shocked at the colt's neck defeat by Humbel (Theatrical {Ire}) in the G3 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial, saying, "I can't believe he didn't stay--maybe he blew up. But it was a setback and the Derby is now out. I will leave him in the Irish 2000 Guineas, but he is more likely to wait for a 10-furlong listed race at The Curragh." Humbel is, however, Derby-bound; he will be the first runner in the race for owner Michael Smurfit. Bookmakers offer 20-1 on his chances.
