GO FOR GIN INJURED, RETIRED According to a story in Thursday's Daily Racing Form, 1994 Kentucky Derby winner Go For Gin (Cormorant) has been retired due to a strained tendon injury. The injury was discovered after the four-year-old colt breezed five furlongs in 1:02 at Belmont Park Monday. "It's really a shame," trainer Nick Zito told the Form, "because he was just getting good and his best races were ahead of him. We've been sprinting him this year with the Met Mile in mind, and he last race set him up perfect for the race." In Go For Gin's final career start May 6, he finished third in the GIII Churchill Downs H. at seven furlongs. In addition to the Kentucky Derby, Go For Gin won the GII Remsen S. and Chief's Crown S. at Aqueduct and the Preview S. at Gulfstream. He retires with a record of 19-5-7-2 and earnings of \$1,380,866. Owned by William Condren and Joseph Cornacchia, the Kentucky-bred colt will begin his career at stud in 1996 at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky.

AVERAGE JUMPS 29% AT BARRETTS Barretts' Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training in Pomona, California concluded Wednesday with 205 two-yearolds selling for a gross of \$3,945,500 and an average of \$19,246, up 28.7 percent from the 1994 average of \$14,951. The median price for the twoday sale was \$13,000, which represented a 53 percent increase over last year's median of \$8,500. There were 59 two-year-olds reported as not sold. The highest price of Wednesday's second and final session was brought by Devil's Troikas, a dark bay or brown colt by Devil's Bag--Three Secrets (Secretariat). Consigned by Clear View Bloodstock, agent, the colt, who had previously sold for \$25,000 as a Keeneland September yearling, went for \$120,000 to Mr. Sid Craig.

The horses were then vanned to Pimlico Race Course, where they arrived shortly before noon. The plane's takeoff was delayed for about an hour due to storms in the Louisville area.

ZITO EXPECTS STAR STANDARD TO SET PREAKNESS PACE Trainer Nick Zito expects to see Star Standard (Risen Star), winner of the GII Lexington S. at Keeneland April 23, on the lead again in the Preakness. "He's gonna be wingin'. I don't care how much speed there is, he's going. I don't care if he goes in :21, he'll be going," Zito said. "I think we've got quality speed, class speed. He showed that this winter, and he gets better and better. He's an improving horse." Zito added that Chris McCarron will ride Star Standard Saturday. "He's the ultimate professional," the trainer said of McCarron. "He'll do a good job for us."

PANA BRASS VANNED TO PIMLICO Robert Perez's Pana Brass (Dixieland Brass) jogged at Belmont Park Wednesday morning. The colt was then scheduled to get on a van about noon and arrive in Baltimore about 5 p.m.

CITADEED'S CONDITION IMPROVES Trainer Rick Violette walked injured Citadeed (Shadeed) around the shedrow of Pimlico's stakes barn for about an hour yesterday morning. Violette reported that an ankle infection, which had caused Citadeed to be withdrawn from the Preakness field Tuesday, was "90 percent" better. "It's remarkable how much the inflammation is down," he said. "If this had happened earlier in the week, we probably could have run him here. But he missed an important breeze (Tuesday), so we have to go to plan B." Plan B may entail the colt shipping to Belmont today to point to either the Peter Pan S. or the Belmont S.
