



PAUL DE MOUSSAC DIES Paul de Moussac, one of Europe's leading owner-breeders, died late Saturday evening in Paris after a long illness. He was 71. Moussac, whose major business was in shipping, based his racing operation at Haras du Mezeray in Normandy. Among his best horses were Luth Enchantee (Fr.) (Be My Guest), Europe's champion miler of 1983, and Trempolino (Sharpen Up {GB}), hero of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in 1987. "He was a father to everyone," said Antoine Bozo, Moussac's racing manager over the past two decades. "His death is a great loss." The family's bloodstock interests--24 horses with Andre Fabre, a handful with other trainers as well as mares in England and Kentucky--will pass into the hands of Charles-Henri de Moussac, who shares his father's passion for the sport.

NJ LAYS OFF RACING COMMISSION All 130 staff members of the New Jersey State Racing Commission, including Executive Director Frank Zanzuccki, have been notified that they will be laid off by July 7, according to a report in yesterday's *Newark Star-Ledger*. The commission staff is paid through the budget of the Office of the Attorney General, which has been eliminated in Governor Christine Whitman's 1996 budget proposal. The Whitman administration hopes to shift the burden of financing the commission to the tracks and horsemen, and has introduced a bill in the state legislature which would assess one percent of handle (3/4 from the track's share and ¼ from the horsemen) to fund the office, according to the Star-Ledger.

SURCHARGE TO AID ARLINGTON? A one-percent surcharge on both live and simulcast wagers at Arlington, starting this year and running through 1997, is expected to be added to the extensive legislative referendum package recommended by Illinois Governor Jim Edgar's Task Force on Racing. Arlington owner Dick Duchossois claimed that original recommendations did not go far enough, and that even if they were enacted, his track would still be in a perilous financial position as it competes for gambling dollars with riverboat casinos. It is estimated the surcharge would bring Arlington \$2.5 million annually; it remains to be seen if this amount is sufficient to induce Duchossois to support the Task Force recommendations.

MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND AT HOLLYWOOD: Monday

Hollywood Turf H-GI, \$500,000, 3/up, 1 1/4mT A field of nine is expected, headed by Best Pal (Habitony {Fr}), who looks for his first turf victory after two seconds in his only grass outings--one of them in the '93 Hollywood Turf H. The 7-year-old gelding returns to California after a 4th in the Oaklawn H. at the hands of Cigar. He meets Celtic Arms (Comrade in Arms {GB}), a GISW in France; Cocooning (Saros {GB}); Saltgrass (Woodman); '95 San Luis Rey winner Sandpit (Baynoun {Ire}); French import Talloires (Trempolino); Vaudeville (Theatrical {Ire})) and the fouryear-old filly Wandesta (Nashwan), already a 2xGISW against her sex this year. Other possibles include Blaze O'Brien (Interco), and Earl of Barking (Ire.) (Common Grounds {GB}).

Sunday:

Hawthorne H-GII, \$200,000a, f/m, 3yo/up, 1 1/16m Weights are due out today with the connections of five starters confirming they will go to the post. Two-time champion older mare Paseana (Ahmad {Arg}), 3xSP in '95 is still looking for her first win of the year and comes off a 3rd in the Apple Blossom. Standing in her way are: Angi Go (Idaho's Majesty), coming off her first graded win in the GII A Gleam H. at Hollywood May 7; Borodislew (Seattle Slew), a GSW in France who has managed only allowance wins in the U.S. and was last seen when 4th in the Apple Blossom; Pirate's Revenge (Pirate's Bounty), a 9-length winner of the April 29 Miss Hollywood Park who takes on tougher competition here; and Top Rung (Seattle Slew), winner of the Santa Lucia in March at Santa Anita, but 4th last out to Angi Go in the A Gleam. Dick Mandella said that Fit To Lead (Fit To Fight), who won the May 5 Louisville Budweiser Breeders' Cup, was still in Kentucky and would not make the race.

Weekend Preview (cont). Saturday, Hollywood:

\$100,000a Railbird S.-GII, f, 3, 7f

Six starters have been confirmed for Saturday's Railbird, headed by Embroidered (Shanekite) and Made to Perfection (Bolger), who have traded stakes wins in their last two meetings. After being defeated by Embroidered in the March 19 Boo La Boo S., Made To Perfection came back with a win over over that rival in the April 8 Santa Paula S. before an 8th-place finish in Hollywood's Senorita on the grass last out. Others include Comstock Queen (Silver Hawk), Predicted Glory (On To Glory), Sleep Easy (Seattle Slew) and Texinadress (Copelan). Brian Mayberry said both Denim Yenem (Ogygian), 3-for-6, including two stakes wins, the last a 6-length triumph in the Crimson Saint last out, and Valid Symmetry (Valid Appeal) are also possibles.

HIALEAH CONCLUDES WITH DROPS IN AT-TENDANCE; HANDLE Average daily on-track attendance fell 10% and daily average on-track handle was down 11% at the Hialeah meeting which concluded yesterday. An average of 5,298 fans attended the races each day and wagered an average of \$657,358. Total average handle was up 15%, buoyed by a \$20 million (87% increase) in handle at NYRA/OTB due to Hialeah full-card simulcasts to Aqueduct Racetrack.
