NEW YORK RACING BOARD AP- PROVES LASIX

New York State Racing and Wagering Board Chairman Jerry Bilinski yesterday announced unanimous Board approval to publish a draft rule that will pave the way for race-day use of the diuretic furosemide, commonly known as Lasix. The proposed rule is expected to be implemented Sept. 1, 1995, opening day of the Belmont fall meet. A 30-day grace period will begin in August to allow horses to qualify for the Lasix list by Sept. 1. The rule was approved following discussions with a broad cross-section of the racing industry, including an informal session held by the Board May 18 in New York City. "There have been a number of clinical trials that show about 85 percent or more of horses that race bleed, therefore, I fully expect that a large number of horses currently racing in New York will be put on Lasix once it is allowed," said Bilinski. "This shouldn't be a surprise if it happens. Furthermore, we hope that the rule change instituting the controlled administration of furosemide will provide a more level playing field and help attract quality horses that otherwise might not race here." Kenny Noe Jr., President of the New York Racing Association, responded, "My reaction is positive in the respect that I feel we are in a different era in Thoroughbred racing and have to be realistic. I think this could lead to a national rule, which I have always supported. I used to be a 'hay, oats and water' man, but I realize that's the old-fashioned way. If we still ran seven or eight races a day, and didn't race year-round, maybe things would be different." Questions regarding the specifics of the New York Lasix program remain unanswered. "I don't want to make those things public until we fine-tune this," said Bilinski, who hinted the addition of Bute to the drug roster in New York may be next. "We will be looking into that and we have started already. I don't have a particular stand on Bute. My main focus is to keep New York in the forefront as one of the major racing states in the country."

\$150,000a Jersey Derby-GII, 3yo, 8.5fT
Da Hoss (Gone West), 2nd in the Illinois Derby last out, was a last-minute entrant in the Jersey Derby. "He came out of that last race in good shape," said trainer Michael Dickinson. "We were undecided about the Derby, but Mr. Jack Preston (one of the owners) was very much in favor of running. We made up our minds to enter in the race and if the other owners agree, we will definitely start." Da Hoss won his lone grass start, a one-mile allowance at Garden State April 29. Da Hoss, who will be ridden by Julie Krone, went 3-for-3 as a two-year-old, including a win at 6f at Turf Paradise in 1:07 1/5, believed to be a record for a two-year-old. He will be meeting grass specialist **Ops Smile** (Caveat), who has won two straight stakes on the turf--the Transylvania and Woodlawn--in his last two starts.

 The connections of Inglewood H. winner **Blaze O'Brien** (Interco) have decided to pass Monday's race in favor of the June 10 Shoemaker at 1 mile on the turf. "The distance is just a little too far for him," said trainer Hector Palma. "And he'd be facing some very tough horses. The horse is eight years old and we've got to make the most out of the bullets he has left." A win in the Shoemaker would place his earnings at around the \$1 million mark. TEXAS SENATE APPROVES OFF-TRACK BETTING An amendment that would allow tracks in Texas to establish five off-track betting parlors each received tentative approval from the Texas Senate, according to an article in yesterday's *Fort Worth Star-Telegram*. Each parlor would be within 75 miles of one of the tracks. The proposal still must clear several hurdles before becoming law, including final Senate approval, agreement from the House and the governor's assent. The plan, however, could kill the stalled \$100 million Lone Star Jockey Club in Grand Prairie, Mayor Charles England told the *Star-Telegram*, which quotes him as "shocked and surprised" that the amendment would allow betting parlors in the same market from which the track would draw patrons to their live racing. "The very thing we're trying to do with the track is attract people to spend money in our city," England told the paper. "I'm not going to enter into any master agreement to develop the track if that bill becomes law."

WHARF RETIRES TO VINERY Vinery and John R. Gaines Thoroughbreds announced the purchase of **Wharf** (Storm Bird) from owner/breeder Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms for an undisclosed price. The five-year-old arrived at Vinery May 23. Wharf made his final start April 2 when second in the GII San Bernardino H. Unbeaten in two starts at 2 in England, including a win in Newmarket's GIII July S., Wharf is out of the SW Riverman mare Dockage and his second dam is a ¾-sister to the European Horse of the Year and six-time stakes producer Dahlia. Plans call for Wharf to be syndicated and to stand for a fee of \$5,000 guaranteed Live Foal payable Nov. 1.
