

BLACKOUT AT BELMONT Wagering at Belmont Park was temporarily interrupted yesterday when an off-site Long Island Lighting Company transformer burned up. The track's primary backup system in the mutuel department kicked on when the outage originally occurred, enabling the New York Racing Association to accept wagers on the day's fourth race: however, that system, which is battery-powered, ran down after a half-hour and the secondary system failed to take over, resulting in a total loss of power in the tote area. The fourth race was run without a public address system, operating tote board or closed-circuit t.v.; the fifth race was run for purse-money only due to the power outage. Rain checks for admission and programs were distributed as a thank you to the fans who stayed at the track until power was restored and wagering resumed for the sixth race.

PAT DAY WINS VENEZIA AWARD Hall of Fame jockey Pat Day has been honored by racing fans, turf writers and his peers with the 1995 Mike Venezia Memorial Award. The award, given each year since 1989 to the jockey who best exemplifies the qualities of sportsmanship and citizenship, is named in tribute to Mike Venezia, the popular New York rider who was killed in a spill at Belmont Park in 1988. Day joins past winners Bill Shoemaker, Chris McCarron, Angel Cordero Jr., Jerry Bailey and Mike Smith; Venezia was honored posthumously in 1989.

LAUREL ANNOUNCES STAKES SCHEDULE The

sixth running of the GII Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash, set for July 15, headlines the \$1,180,000 summer stakes schedule at Laurel Park. The track will also offer the GIII Baltimore Budweiser Breeders' Cup S., July 1, on the 13-race agenda; in addition, there will be three overnight stakes worth \$30,000 apiece. The 30day Laurel Summer Meet runs June 13 through July 23.

METROPOLITAN H.-GI, \$500,000, 3yo/up, 1m Silver Goblin (Silver Ghost), 120, prepping for his first start since finishing second to Cigar in the GI Oaklawn H., breezed an easy half in :49,46 at Belmont Thursday. "I thought it was a tremendous work for him," said trainer Ken Smith. "I think he's going to run a good race. He's had three good breezes over the track, but you don't know for sure if he'll handle it until he runs on it." Trainer Allen Jerkens looks for his six-year-old Devil His Due (Devil's Bag), 120, to improve off his second-place finish to the division leader Cigar, who went wire-to-wire in the GI Pimlico Special. "No one else had any speed in that race, but I think this should be an altogether different race," said Jerkens. "He'll get the speed up front--you won't see a quarter in :48. It'll be more like :45--maybe that will make the difference." Switching from turf to dirt, California invader Romarin (Brz) (Itajara) shipped into Belmont late Thursday; he took the Early Times Turf Classic last out.
