SILVER GOBLIN'S CAREER IN DOUBT Silver Goblin (Silver Ghost)'s racing future is in doubt following an injury he suffered when finishing last as the 4-5 favorite in Monday's Metropolitan H. at Belmont. An X-ray revealed the 4-year-old gelding suffered a hairline fracture to a bone is his lower right front leg. The injury is not life-threatening. "Mv thinking is that Silver Goblin's racing days are over," said owner Al Horton, who thought the injury occurred out of the gate. "Dale (Cordova) felt something wasn't right," said Horton. "However, the horse got right back to running. Then on the turn he didn't respond like normal. After that Dale never asked him for more effort." Horton said the X-rays had been forwarded to Dr. Larry Bramlage. "He's supposed to get back to us later (Wednesday) or early (Thursday) as to whether we could put a screw in there to stabilize the bone," said Horton. Silver Goblin has won 14 of 20 starts, finishing worse than 3rd only once in his career. He has earned \$1,025,395.

BELMONT FIELD TAKES SHAPE Seven starters appear likely for the June 10 Belmont S., which may sport an international flair again this year: Those considered probable are: Thunder Gulch (Gulch), Timber Country (Woodman), Star Standard (Risen Star), Citadeed (Shadeed), Knockadoon (Dixieland Band), Is Sveikatas (L'Enjoleur) and Wild Syn (Wild Again). Trainer Dermot Weld, who won the 1990 Belmont S. with Irish invader Go and Go (Be My Guest), will decide Friday whether or not to attempt a repeat, and has two possible starters. "There's Definite Article (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), but he may go in the French Derby," said Weld. "Then there's Off 'N'Away (Ire) (Be My Guest), a full brother to Go and Go. One problem is that the Belmont will be the same day as the Epsom Derby. I won't be able to make the trip over and I'll have to find a new rider." Definite Article won the 10f listed Silver S. at the Curragh last Saturday and the GI National S. last year. Off'N'Away most recently won a 10f allowance race at Navan May 1 under 133 pounds after finishing third in the 10-furlong Kentucky Derby Trial over the all-weather course at Lingfield. Other possibles include Ave's Flag (Personal Flag) and Composer (Easy Goer). In Character (GB) (Never So Bold {Ire}), Peaks and Valleys (Mt. Livermore) and Treasurer (GB) (Darshaan) (GB) are all doubtful.

Coming off a sharp second-place finish to probable Gamely favorite Possibly Perfect (Northern Baby) in the Wilshire H., she could be a victim of a paceless race again Sunday. "In the (Wilshire), we had to go out with Possibly Perfect," said trainer Gary Jones. "There was absolutely no other speed in the race. It looks to me like Sunday's race might be a replay. I was hoping (Lady Affirmed {Affirmed}) had some speed, but it looks like she's a closer too. Someone needs to soften up Possibly Perfect, or otherwise we're all running for second money." Possibly Perfect has not lost a race in 17 months, winning her last four. Don't Read My Lips (Turkoman) worked a half-mile for the Gamely vesterday in :51 2/5, while Aube Indienne (Fr) (Bluebird) is scheduled to turn in her last prep today on the turf.

FULL CARDS DEBUT IN ILLINOIS TODAY

Full-card simulcasts from out-of state tracks will make their Illinois debut today when Sportsman's Park presents programs from Churchill Downs and Louisiana Downs in addition to its own 9-race card. The out-ofstate races also will be shown by all of the off-track and intertrack outlets on Sportsman's state-wide simulcast network. For the duration of the meeting that runs through June 22 the Churchill and Louisiana Downs races will be shown from Wednesday through Sunday. Philadelphia Park races will be shown Monday and Tuesday. Maywood Park harness track also will begin presenting out-of-state simulcasts Thursday night. under the new racing law signed Tuesday by Governor Jim Edgar. The new law also provides for 14 more OTB parlors owned and operated by the tracks, a new formula for OTB and intertrack purse distribution, and changes in the state's breeding incentive programs.
